










- Programs and initiatives for youth and future generations; and
- Culture and heritage, including the preservation of Indigenous culture.

Ideally, grant projects should commence by December 2021

Grant applications of up to \$100,000 will be considered. Smaller projects are also encouraged to apply (e.g. less than \$10,000).


