Shire News

Christmas / New Year

Firstly on behalf of Council and staff we would like to wish everyone within the Shire of Laverton a happy and prosperous New Year and hope everyone had a most enjoyable Xmas and New Year period.

Thank You

On behalf of Heather and myself we would like to thank the community and express our appreciation for the very warm welcome we have received since we arrived in town in early December.

Both from a Council, staff and community perspective it has been very inviting and we are looking forward to our time in Laverton, not only from a work but also a social environment.

Staff Updates

As most of you will be aware Graham Stanley, former Executive Manager Corporate & Community Services (EMCCS), completed his tenure with the Shire over the Christmas/New Year period and has moved onto a similar position with the Shire of Boddington. Graham was a very loyal, committed and well respected member of the Laverton Shire team and will be difficult to replace. We do however wish Graham well in his new environment.

On this note Robyn Smith, Finance & Administration Manager, will be the Acting EMCCS in the short term until a replacement person is in place. To assist Robyn we will be engaging appropriate relief and/or consulting staff to carry out specialised duties and projects.

Cherie Delmage has been employed on a contract basis to oversee the implementation of new IT Vision Synergysoft software system, and to assist with other compliance matters.

Elizabeth Jones has returned to Laverton and is helping us out with relief cover for staff on leave and various projects. We also welcome the following new staff to the Shire:

- Tracy Wasson – casual cleaner
- Jeff Bennett – operator – road crew
- Nina Spratt – casual youth support

Main Street Project

This project is approaching completion with some minor works still to be completed. These works include the installation of hand-railing on the access ramp and stairs near the community resource centre, additional bollards at the main street crossing and paving works in front of the shire office. A walkthrough will then be performed with the contractor to identify any outstanding issues.

Great Central Road Project

The Shire of Laverton is pleased to inform its residents that the first 16kms on the Great Central Road from SLK 385 to 401 has now been sealed and is completed.

A further 10 kilometres is currently being constructed by Council's contractor and is approximately 75 percent complete. It's forecast that a total of 40km will be sealed by the end of April 2018.

Laverton Hospital Upgrade

Council (and community) previously received advice in May 2015 from the then Minister for Regional Development, Terry Redman, that funding of \$19.5M was allocated from the Royalties for Regions (R4R) program for a new hospital in Laverton, which also included four (4) Independent Living Units for aged persons.

Unfortunately the now State Labor Government has changed the way in which the R4R funding is allocated and the \$19.5M is no longer available for the hospital project.

Council and myself, along with health, medical and hospital staff, met with the Deputy Premier Hon Roger Cook MLA, Minister for Regional Development Hon Alannah MacTiernan MLC, and, Member for Mining and Pastoral Region Hon Kyle McGinn MLC, in Laverton on Wednesday 13th December 2017. The meetings took place at the Laverton Hospital and at the Shire Council Chambers.

These meetings were very amicable and quite positive with the members of parliament agreeing quite comprehensively that the hospital is in an urgent need of replacement and they would attempt to ensure that the project could proceed. However this may have to be with a revised budget allocation, and also with the proposed four Independent Aged Living Units forming a Phase 2 for the project. We are still awaiting further announcement but will inform the community as soon as additional information is available.

Community Hub Project

Planning for this project has been completed and Council is waiting on further funding advice from the State Government prior to proceeding to tender.

Great Beyond Visitor Centre

Design and cost benefit analyses have been formalised for the project and a grant application has been submitted to the Australian Government Building Better Regions fund.

With the future upgrade of the Great Central Road, the proposed expansion of the Visitor Centre is seen as essential to the future of Laverton in attracting visitors to the region and hopefully retaining their presence in town for a longer than normal period to gain a greater economic benefit.

Laverton Swimming Pool

There have been several recent instances of people breaking into the Swimming Pool at night and causing malicious damage and graffiti with toilets, showers and drains being blocked with toilet paper and taps turned on, and Shire equipment being thrown into the pool. I am sure everyone can understand the need to not waste water senselessly like this especially at this time of year. It would be a pity if this unsociable behaviour was to continue and the Shire had to close the Pool to everybody.

On a brighter note, our Pool Manager, Janine Rowe, will be running a Bronze Medallion course in February. The Bronze Medallion is recognised as the minimum standard for a qualified lifesaver and it will also enhance your personal survival skills while providing you with the knowledge and skills to develop the level of judgement, technique and physical ability required to safely carry out water rescues. See the information page elsewhere in this edition.

As previously mentioned I have thoroughly enjoyed my early period in Laverton and have been fortunate to meet many of you, however if our paths haven't crossed to date I am sure they will in the not too distant future and I look forward to this occasion.

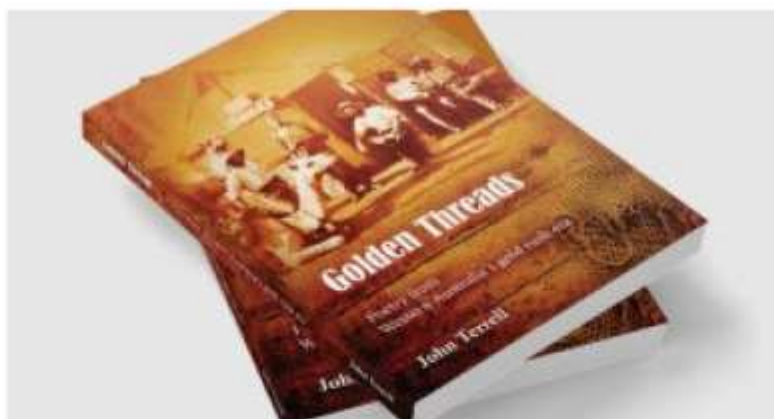

VISITOR STATISTICS

Each year, the Great Beyond collect statistics from our visitors, we thought we would share a few with our readers:

2017 saw 5621 Visitors to the Great Beyond. Of this 270 people completed our survey. The majority of visitors were from WA (40%), followed by 16% from NSW, 15% from VIC & 8% from QLD. The visitors from NT, SA & Tasmania only made up 19% of visitors, while the last 2% were international visitors.

For 72% of people, this was their first time to Laverton.

51% of our Visitors were travelling as a couple, while the next popular travel arrangement was in a group of four or more (22%).

82% of people travel in a four wheel drive while only 20% were brave enough to travel the Outback on a motorbike.

It seems the two most popular roads in the area are the Laverton Leonora Road and the Great Central Road (Outback Way).

64% of people travelled to Laverton via the Laverton-Leonora Road followed by 15% via the Great Central Road.

48% of visitors left Laverton via the Laverton Leonora Road and 34% via the Great Central Road.

Places to see Around Laverton White Cliffs Road Part 1

White Cliffs Road is travelled by most tourists with the intention of tackling the Anne Beadell Highway (Completed by Len Beadell in 1962). This road can be quite sandy and rough in sections and it is highly recommended to travel on this road in a 4x4 vehicle. The turn off for White Cliffs Road is about 1km outside the Laverton town centre (about 500m before the turnoff to the airport). The following article will show the sights that can be found along the first 45km of the road.

One of the first sights along the road you will come across is the closed Barnicoat Mine (last operated in 2010). You are not allowed to enter this sight. On the left hand side of Barnicoat Mine is the turn off which will take you to Hanns Camp. As you drive past this mine, you will start to see some rocky hills on either side of you, and as you continue along the road you will notice the bush on either side become dense and thick with mulga and other desert trees. Sections of the road will start to become a lot looser in areas.

About 25km into the drive, the road will quickly change from a gravel surface to red desert sand, with spinifex and eucalyptus trees on either side of you. The red dirt will continue for a few kilometres before changing back to a gravel surface road, and the environment changes to a rocky desert with pockets of quartz filled crops.



Small hills and breakaways appear on and off as you continue along the road. Keep an eye out for some tracks along the road so you can get a better look at some of these breakaways and hills. Whilst I was exploring this road recently the first little breakaway I explored (pictured below right) was filled with a little cave and amazing rock formations (definitely worth a look).

From here on the environment continually changes, and there are many spectacular views to be seen. Look out for two rocky breakaways which when climbed to the top provide an amazing view of the vast area surrounding you.

Make sure you check the Shire Website or visit The Great Beyond Visitor Centre for current road conditions before heading out along this road. Road conditions can also be found on <http://www.laverton.wa.gov.au/services/roads/road-condition-reports.aspx>. Remember to always let someone know where you are going before leaving, as there is no phone coverage once you are 30km out. Also if you travel any more than 70km along this road a permit is required.



A vocado and prawn salad with green goddess dressing

INGREDIENTS:

- 500g peeled green prawns (tails intact)
- 1 long fresh red chilli, finely chopped
- 2cm piece fresh ginger, peeled, grated
- 1 garlic clove, crushed
- 2 limes, rind finely grated, juiced
- 60ml (1/4 cup) extra virgin olive oil
- 3 avocados
- 1/3 cup fresh coriander leaves, chopped
- 1/3 cup fresh mint leaves, chopped
- 1 1/2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh chives
- 60ml (1/4 cup) TCC Coconut Milk
- 2 tablespoons water
- 450g papaya, deseeded, cut into wedges
- 1 iceberg lettuce, cut into wedges
- 2 teaspoons honey
- Toasted macadamias, chopped, to serve

METHOD:

- 1) Combine the prawns, chilli, ginger, garlic, rind from 1 lime and 1 tbsp. of the oil in a bowl. Season. Set aside to develop the flavours.
- 2) Meanwhile, coarsely chop 1 avocado. Process with the coriander, mint, chives and 2 1/2 tbsp. lime juice in a food processor until almost smooth. Add the coconut milk, water and 1 1/2 tbsp. of the remaining oil. Season and process until mixture is smooth and well combined.
- 3) Cut remaining avocados into wedges. Drizzle with a little of the remaining lime juice to prevent discolouration. Arrange with papaya and lettuce on a serving plate.
- 4) Combine honey and 1 tbsp. of the remaining lime juice in a bowl. Heat the remaining oil in a large non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat. Cook prawns, turning, for 4 minutes or until prawns change colour and are cooked through. Transfer to a plate. Drizzle with the lime mixture.
- 5) Top the salad with prawns. Spoon over green goddess dressing. Sprinkle with the macadamia and season.





Healthy Homemade Fruit Ice Blocks

INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 a medium watermelon
- Frozen raspberries or blueberries (or both!)
- 3 kiwi fruits
- Frozen mango pieces
- 1 punnet strawberries
- 2 passionfruit



METHOD:

- 1) Blend up the watermelon in a blender or food processor. It should be liquefied and will be quite watery.
- 2) Slice up strawberries and kiwi fruit (peel kiwi fruit first).
- 3) Start by placing a mix of fruit (frozen and fresh) into the bottom of each mould. I like to place the kiwi pieces along the sides as this gives a very attractive look to the ice blocks when they are finished.

Feeding your Cat / Dog

Hey guys!

For the February edition Sturt Pea Magazine I am going to be writing about the feeding requirements for your dog and cat.

If anyone has any ideas of what my next Pet Corner should be about, please let me know! I am always open to ideas and would love to know what you want to read about– crcassist@laverton.wa.gov.au.

Feeding Cats: Cats can eat either wet food or dry food or a mixture of both, it is recommended that Kittens (4-5 weeks old) should start off on wet food, this enables them to adjust to solids while their teeth are still developing. Serve size is 1 to 2 tablespoons at a time, mixed with Kitten formula milk, the milk helps the Kitten to familiarise themselves with the change in diet. Kittens should be fed 3 times a day. Dry Biscuits should be available for free feeding throughout the day for adult Cats and the diet can be varied by adding 1-2 scheduled feedings of wet food.

Feeding dogs: Puppies (4-5weeks) should start off on wet food mixed with puppy formula milk and should be fed small serves 3-4 times a day. Most people are recommended to feed their adult Dogs 1-2 times a day however the serving size varies depending on the size and breed of your Dog. Below is a serving size suggestion table which provides an indication on how much food your Dog should be fed based on the weight. Keep in mind this is just a guide and it is recommended you speak with your local vet to establish the right food, diet and serving size for your individual pet.

Serving Suggestions Table for Dogs based on Weight

Weight of Dog	Amount per Day
5 lb (2.3 kg)	1/2 cup (50 g) - 5/8 cup (65 g)
10 lb (4.5 kg)	3/4 cup (75 g) - 1 cup (100 g)
20 lb (9.1 kg)	1 1/4 cups (130 g) - 1 3/4 cups (180 g)
40 lb (18 kg)	2 1/4 cups (230 g) - 3 cups (305 g)
60 lb (27 kg)	3 cups (305 g) - 4 cups (410 g)
80 lb (36 kg)	3 2/3 cups (375 g) - 5 cups (510 g)
100 lb (45 kg)	4 1/4 cups (435 g) - 6 cups (610 g)
