Enrolling to vote

A local government extraordinary election is to be held in the Shire of Laverton on Wednesday 22 March 2017. You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote at the election if you reside in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Laverton.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral roll as at 5.00pm Tuesday 31 January 2017. If you are not already on the State Electoral roll and meet the eligibility criteria or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Enrolment Forms –

Residents

Electoral Enrolment forms are available from the Shire of Laverton, all post offices or the Western Australian Electoral Commission. They must be completed and returned to any Divisional Returning Officer of that Australian Electoral Commission in Western Australia by 5.00pm Tuesday 31 January 2017.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you enrolled after August 2011 you do not need to re-enrol. If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Laverton and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote but must submit an Enrolment Eligibility Claim form to the local government, as enrolment is not automatic.

A non-resident owner who was on the last Shire of Laverton local government roll continues to retain that status as long as the rateable property to which the enrolment relates is owned. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Laverton to confirm their enrolment status.

Owners and Occupiers

If you are not on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Laverton, you may still be eligible to enrol to vote. Please contact the Shire of Laverton for details.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral roll in respect of a residence outside the electorate.



From the Officer-in-Charge

What a start to the year! Hello to everyone. Hopefully you had a great Christmas and New Year and this finds you all well and enjoying life in Laverton.

The last two months have been rather hectic here in the community with our usual visitors from the 'Lands' over the Christmas period descending on this town, Leonora and Kalgoorlie to cause issues.

I can assure you I have already started planning for next year to ensure we are not faced with the same issues again. There are some plans in the pipeline with other agencies to try and make it that little bit more difficult for people to come to Laverton and essentially do as they please.

The number of unsupervised children has been of great concern, with many of the children very young and under the age of criminal responsibility. They commit offences and there is nothing we can do except to take them back to their parents or carers with a stern talking to. We are hopeful a new Child Protection Officer starts here very soon and we will ensure they have plenty to do.

You would have noticed some new restrictions that were trialled last week. The results were remarkable and this town felt completely different for the week of restrictions. For the period 9-15 January (before restrictions) we had a total of 69 jobs, 4 overnight custodies, 17 offences and 60 hours overtime. For the period 16-22 January (restrictions of no ID, no take away) we had a total of 28 jobs, no overnight custodies, 0 offences and 0 overtime. This place was completely different and the facts speak for themselves, the trial was a success.

Thanks to the publican and staff at the Desert Inn Hotel for coming up with the idea and helping with it being enforced. The idea was all about the responsible service of alcohol and ensuring patrons were limited to one item per day, which could be a block or bottle of spirits but not both. The hospital saw a major reduction in admissions during that week and also the volunteer ambulance officers had their workload dramatically decreased.

What was also important was that it allowed all of our community members still being able to attend the hotel to buy take away if needed. If we put a total ban on take-aways, like we have done in the past, the whole community is affected. This is unfair as the behaviour of a minority of people affect the majority of the community. I would hope we have the communities support with this issue as your safety and security is of paramount importance to us and I believe the trail was a huge success.





So far this year we are 35.2% above where we were last year in total offences, that is 169 compared to 125. Domestic assault is up 90.3%, 59 offences this year as compared to 31. Non-domestic assault is up 172.2% with 32 offences compared to 11, many of these are assaults against Police, which is of great concern. I would like to think that these figures will even out somewhat before the end of the financial year.

Some good news in regards to our crime statistics are that burglary is down 31.8% with 15 offences this year compared to 22 at the same time last year. Theft is also down 57.9% with 8 offences compared to 19.

The team here continues to churn out some remarkable statistics in relation to people charged. In 2014, 212 people were charged with offences, in 2015 we had 342 people charged with offences, and in 2016 we had a staggering total of 510 people charged with offences in this town. The population here is about 350 and about half of the people charged come from the 'Lands' area.

Spare a thought for the team at Laverton Police Station, the medical team at Laverton District Hospital and our volunteer ambulance officers that are available 24/7 to help keep this community safe and secure.

We had a great day at the station yesterday with the unveiling of the Aboriginal Flag. A huge thanks to our sponsors of Anglo Ashanti Gold, Lynas Corporation, Minara Resources and the Laverton Leonora Cross Cultural Association. Without their input, the day would not have happened. It



was great to see the community attend in great numbers and enjoy the speeches and whole event. A very hearty feed was also supplied and thanks to all that helped on the day to make it such a great success. A very proud moment for the police station.

The day also saw us recognise the wonderful efforts of Alison Stevens and the Laverton Crisis Centre. Alison is leaving us after 2 years to return home to Queensland and what she has achieved in setting up the centre and establishing a foot print in this community has been remarkable. The centre is seen as a safe haven for woman and children in this town and we have been so lucky to have it here. I can't imagine this place without the centre and the great team that is working there. We wish her all the best. Take care everyone please.







CAULIFLOWER CHEESE TART

Ingredients:

- 11/2 cups (225g) plain flour
- 140g cold unsalted butter, chopped
- 3 eggs
- 1 egg yolk, extra
- 1 small cauliflower, cut into small florets
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 100g Backfatters German bacon, chopped
- 300ml thickened cream
- Pinch of freshly grated nutmeg
- 175g tasty cheddar, grated

Method:

1. Place flour in a food processor with a pinch of salt. Add the butter and process until mixture resembles fine crumbs. Add extra egg yolk and 1/4 cup (60ml) cold water, and process until smooth. Shape into a disc and enclose in plastic wrap. Chill for 30 minutes.

2. Preheat oven to 180C. Grease a 23cm loose-bottom tart pan. Roll out pastry on a lightly floured surface until 3mm thick, then use to line pan, trimming excess. Chill for 30 minutes. Line with baking paper and fill with baking weights. Bake for 8 minutes, then remove weights and paper. Bake for a further 2 minutes or until dry and golden.

3. Meanwhile, place cauliflower in a pan of cold salted water. Bring to the boil over high heat. Reduce heat to medium-low and cook for 5 minutes or until just tender. Drain and set aside to cool slightly.

4. Heat oil in a frypan over low heat. Cook the onion and bacon for 2-3 minutes until onion is softened and bacon starts to crisp. Set aside.

5. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs, cream and nutmeg. Season. Scatter onion mixture over tart, then scatter over cauliflower and half the cheese. Pour over egg mixture, then scatter over remaining cheese. Bake for 30 minutes or until golden. Cool for 30 minutes and serve.

4-INGREDIENT CHEWY CARAMEL PEANUT SLICE

Ingredients:

- 200g packet jersey caramels
- 11/4 cups crunchy peanut butter
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
 - 1 1/2 cups caster sugar

- 1. Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan-forced. Grease an 18cm x 28cm slice pan. Line base and all sides with 2 layers of baking paper, extending paper 2cm above edges.
- 2. Cut caramels into quarters. Combine peanut butter, egg and sugar in a bowl. Stir in caramels. Spoon mixture into prepared pan. Level top with a spatula.
- 3. Bake for 40 minutes or until golden and top is just firm to touch. Cool completely in pan. Lift slice from pan. Serve cut into bars.

STRAWBERRY CHEESECAKE BITES

Crust (makes 24 mini cheesecakes): 1 cup pecans 6 medjool dates 1/4 cup shredded coconut 1/4 teaspoon sea salt

Directions:

Remove the pits from the medjool dates and soak them in warm water for 10 mins. Drain the water from the dates and place in a food processor along with the remaining ingredients. Process until the nuts are crumbled **and the crust is sticking together on it's own.**

Press about 1 1/2 teaspoons of the mixture into the bottom of each mini muffin cup.

Tip: to remove the cheesecakes easily from the tray, cut 4 inch strips of parchment paper and place those in the bottom of each cup. Press the crust mixture on top of these. Then when the cheesecakes are done setting in the freezer you can pull on the parchment tabs to lift the cheesecakes out.

Filling:

1 cup raw cashews (soaked for 3 hours)
1/2 cup frozen strawberry slices
1/4 cup agave nectar
1/4 cup coconut oil (melted)
2 Tablespoons lemon juice

Directions:

Drain cashews from the soaking water and rinse under fresh water. Then add them to a high speed blender or vitamix along with frozen strawberries, agave nectar, melted coconut oil, and lemon juice. Blend until smooth. Pour this mixture into a bowl and set aside. Clean out the blender to make the strawberry puree for the swirl. Swirl/Topping: 1/2 cup frozen strawberries, melted Directions:

Allow these strawberries to melt at room temperature or heat over low heat in sauce pan for a few minutes until soft. Then blend this in a blender into a smooth puree.

Take a scant tablespoon of the cashew filling and pour on top of the pressed crust. Then take 1/2 tsp of strawberry puree and dollop on top of the cashew filling. Take the end of a toothpick and swirl the two mixtures around to make a fun artsy pattern!

Freeze the cheesecakes for 1-2 hours until solid. Remove them from the mini muffin trays and allow to thaw for 10-15 mins. before biting into them.
