Rex Weldon Elected Unopposed to Vacant Position

At the close of Nominations on 13 February 2017, only one nomination had been received from Mr Rex Weldon. Rex was therefore declared elected unopposed.

Congratulations to Rex on becoming a Councillor for the Shire of Laverton. His local knowledge, longstanding leadership in the community and respect from all parts of the community will be great assets to the Shire. Rex was 'sworn in' and attended his first Council Meeting on Thursday 23 February 2017



Update - Main Street Project

The revised plans, following the Community Consultation undertaken at the end of October 2016, are now available for inspection at the Shire Office. Electronic versions of the plan are also available by contacting the CEO during office hours.

Council's preferred contractor is now working with the Council's Project Manager to finalise quantities, scope of works and pricing. Once accepted by Council, works will commence shortly after and will take 12-16 weeks to complete.

Update – Laverton Community Hub Project

At the Special Meeting of Council on 9 February 2017, Council received and approved the final "Preliminary Design Report" for the Laverton Community Hub. This Preliminary Design Report is available at the Shire Office for inspection, and will provide a very clear indication of what this exciting project will look like.

Also at the Special Meeting, Council resolved to call Tenders for Architectural Services to appoint an architectural firm to take the Preliminary Design to final construction plans.

Please don't hesitate to call into the Shire Office to view the Preliminary Design Report. Any feedback to the CEO on the Report would be most welcome.

New Roof for Centrelink!

Following the recent rains in January and February, it became evident that the old roof on the Centrelink building was no longer able to cope with several water leaks into the office space used by Centrelink. Not wanting our Centrelink staff to be inconvenienced, the Shire, as owner of the building, acted swiftly. While cheaper patching repairs were considered, Council decided that the best long term option was to completely replace the roof sheeting and at the same time install insulation, which the building never had before.

This work has now been completed and Centrelink staff can feel happier with their heritage red roof and more comfortable thanks to the insulation.

Farewell to Wendy Duncan

On Friday 24 February 2017, Council had the pleasure of hosting a small function at the Laverton Sports Club in honour of our retiring Member for Kalgoorlie, Wendy Duncan.



Wendy has been a fantastic champion for Laverton over the years and played a significant part in Royalties for Regions funding coming to Laverton to help progress a new Hospital, the Community Hub and the Main Street Project.

The Shire President, Pat Hill, on presenting Wendy with an engraved Shire Shield, thanked Wendy for her support and advocacy for the Laverton community.

How to weave a star



Cut 4 pieces of ribbon, approximately 50cm each



Fold all 4 ribbons in half together and crease tightly. Place 2 pieces of ribbon on the table and one in each of your hands



Place the ribbon in your right hand and loop it over the ribbon in your left hand to create an 'L' shape



Pick up a 3rd ribbon and loop it up over your 2nd ribbon to create a 'U' shape



Using your 4th ribbon, loop over your 3rd ribbon and pass both ends through the centre of your first ribbon. Flip your star over and place on table.



Working anti-clockwise, start by folding down one of each of the ribbons, creasing each time. With the last ribbon, fold it over and through to secure



This is the body of your star



Starting at the top right, fold your ribbon under and to the right



Fold to crease into a point



Using the same ribbon, fold down, leaving a small gap, to create a triangle



Fold the right side of the triangle over the left side and tuck the end of the ribbon into the pocket of the pink ribbon



Trim the cut end of your tucked-in ribbon



Working on every second ribbon, repeat this process: Under and to the right, crease, fold down to make a triangle, crease, fold from right to left, crease and tuck



When you have folded all the top right ribbons down, flip over your star and repeat the process on the other side



You have now completed your star!

My husband Senior Constable Keith Armstrong and I moved to Laverton in January 2016. Prior to Laverton we spent almost 4 years policing in Halls Creek in the Kimberley after leaving Perth.

Halls Creek was a fantastic experience for us both, we met some amazing people both in the community and those that we worked with. It was a hard place to work but we had some awesome opportunities including one that saw me spending 3 weeks relieving at the Dampier Peninsula Multi-Function Police Facility. Labour Day

Labour Day is an Australian public holiday originally called Eight Hours Day. It celebrates the achievements of organised labour on behalf of the worker to bring about the 8-hour day in the late 1850s.

Previously workers were required to work long hours each week, 10 to 12 hours a day six days a week. While a change was made to the hours worked each day, the five day work week we enjoy today took almost a century longer to be adopted finally in 1948.

If look closely you may spot the numbers 888 on many union buildings across Australia. The numbers are in support of British socialist Robert Owen who believed that people should have 8 hours to work, 8 hours for recreation and 8 hours to sleep. This philosophy helped foster The Eight Hours Movement.

The first Labour Day parade was held in Melbourne on April 21st, 1856. Today parades across Australia remind us of the accomplishments made by the unions on behalf of the workers. Australians now enjoy better working conditions than any time in our history.

Labour Day is celebrated at different times across Australia because each state achieved the 8-hour day on different dates.

Steak with speedy 'roast' potato salad

Ingredients:

- 260g jar chargrilled capsicum in oil
- 1kg large potatoes, boiled, roughly chopped
- 1 red onion, cut into wedges
- 225g jar antipasto, drained
- 2 tablespoons drained capers
- 4 (150g each) beef rump steaks
- 1/3 cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh dill sprigs
- Salad leaves and lemon wedges, to serve



Method:

1. Drain capsicum, reserving 1/4 cup marinating oil. Roughly chop capsicum.
2. Heat reserved oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add potato, capsicum and onion. Cook, turning, for 5 to 6 minutes or until browned all over. Add antipasto and capers. Cook, tossing, for 2 minutes or until heated through.
3. Meanwhile, season steaks with salt and pepper. Heat a chargrill pan or barbecue grill on high heat. Cook for 3 minutes each side for medium, or until cooked to your liking. Transfer to a plate. Cover loosely with foil. Set aside for 5 minutes to rest.
4. Add parsley and dill to potato mixture. Toss to combine. Serve steak with potato salad, salad leaves and lemon wedges.

Burnt butterscotch rice pudding

Ingredients:

- 75g butter
- 175g short-grain pudding rice
- 140g light muscovado sugar
- 500ml double cream
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 600ml full-fat milk



Method:

1. Heat the butter in a wide, shallow saucepan until starting to sizzle, then add the rice. Toast the rice gently for about 4 mins in the butter until just starting to turn light brown, then scatter over 100g of the sugar and cook for a few mins more until the sugar is starting to dissolve.
2. Pour in the cream, stir and boil until all the sugar has dissolved into a thick butterscotch sauce, then gradually stir in 500ml of the milk and the vanilla extract. Simmer everything gently for about 45 mins, stirring often. If towards the end of the cooking **time the liquid is too thick and the rice isn't cooked yet, add another 100ml milk and** carry on cooking. The finished consistency should be like a really creamy risotto.
3. When the pudding is cooked, tip it into a shallow, heatproof serving dish. Scatter the rest of the sugar over the top, and grill or blowtorch until sizzling and just starting to burn. Leave the sugar to form a crisp layer and serve hot or cold straight from the dish.
