Great Beyond Visitor Centre Progress

The works on the Great Beyond Visitor Centre is now in earnest and progressing well. Unfortunately due to a few issues with rock, the originally planned completion date of 31 May 2021 has been extended to end of July 2021.



Town Oval & Dog Park Fencing

The materials for the fencing of the Community Oval and development of a new Dog Park adjacent to the Caravan Park have arrived in Laverton and works will soon commence on these two projects.

Great Central Road Project Update

Works are progressing well with 10km of sealing works finalised between the 52km and 42km in late February 2021, with an additional 10km being ready to seal in May.

With the completion of these works the work area has been extended west towards Laverton by another 10km which will be an ongoing scenario as works progress.

Community Resource Centre/Old Coach House Building

The Community Resource Centre has now relocated to the Old Coach House building and resumed in normal operations. Works are progressing on toilets, kitchen and fencing.

Airport Terminal

Architectural Plans for the development of a new terminal at the airport were completed some time ago and Council has submitted a grant application under the Building Better Regions Funding to seek financial assistance for the project.

Old State Battery

Following quite a period of consultation representatives from the Perth Mint visited Laverton on Thursday 25 March to inspect the Old State Battery site.

As most would be aware the site has not been used for a considerable period of time and is in a sad state of disrepair.

The conversation with the Perth Mint representatives centred around cleaning the site and renewing the perimeter fencing, investigating the possibility of condensing the contaminated site area, restoring part of the old battery and securing the immediate area for heritage and tourism purposes, and possible development of new industrial area on the western side bordering on Alderstone Street.

Council understands that a considerable amount of work will be required to achieve this but hopefully will eventuate.



Cashless Debit Card

Current arrangements have been extended to June 2021 and further extensions will be advised if funding is available through Commonwealth Government.

Swimming Pool

The Swimming Pool will close for the season on 11 April 2021 and reopen October 2021.

Youth Centre

The Youth Centre has been closed since December 2020. Council has advertised and is seeking the appointment of a Youth Development Officer, and is also working with state government agencies to try and improve how the service is provided.

An update will be given once recruitment has been completed.

Shire President and Chief Executive Officer visit to Canberra

The Shire President, Cr Patrick Hill, and CEO, Peter Naylor visited Canberra for 3 days and attended some 34 meetings / appointments with Ministers, Senators and / or their senior advisors.

The meetings were in regards to ongoing funding for the Great Central Road project, delivery of the new Laverton Hospital, provision of various health (and support) services, drought funding, and law & order issues.

The politicians were very receptive to the various matters raised and hopefully will result in beneficial outcome for the community.

Next Ordinary Meeting of Council

The next Ordinary Meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 22 April 2021 at 5:00pm in the Council Chambers of the Shire Administration Building. These meetings are open to all members of the public who wish to attend. Residents are reminded that they can view the forthcoming Agenda and past Minutes of meetings on the Shire website.

PENNE ALLA VODKA

Ingredients

- 3 tbsp. butter
- · 1 shallot, minced
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 c. tomato paste
- 1/2 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes
- · 2 tbsp. vodka
- Kosher salt
- 500g. tubed pasta, such as penne or rigatoni
- 1/2 c. heavy cream
- 1/2 c. freshly grated Parmesan, plus more for serving
- · Basil, for serving

Method

- 1. In a large skillet over medium heat, melt butter. Add shallot and garlic and cook, stirring frequently, until softened, 4 to 5 minutes.
- 2. Add tomato paste and red pepper flakes and cook, stirring frequently, until paste has coated shallots and garlic and is beginning to darken, 5 minutes.
- 3. Add vodka to pot and stir to incorporate, scraping up any browned bits from the bottom of the pot. Turn off heat.
- 4. Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil and cook pasta until al dente.
 Reserve 2 cups of pasta water before draining.
- 5. Return sauce to medium heat and add 1/4 cup of pasta water and heavy cream, stirring to combine. Add half the Parmesan and stir until melted. Turn off heat and stir in cooked pasta. Fold in remaining Parmesan, adding more pasta water (about a tablespoon at a time) if the sauce is looking dry. Season with salt if needed. Serve topped with more Parmesan and torn basil leaves.

Laverton Ambulance to close

After decades committed community service the Laverton St John Ambulance is set to finalise operations at months end. The closure, while a huge blow to the community to the community, unavoidable due to the continued low numbers of available volunteers. The ongoing operation of the SC and delivery of patient care is not possible without community by way support volunteer membership.

Along with Country Health Services and RFDS the provision of St John Ambulance capacity is considered essential to the continued welfare of our communities, Laverton and the wider district rely heavily on this emergency service. Laverton ST John Chair, Grace Anatomy, said "the closure was a very sad outcome for the town and remaining SC members. We simply cant continue - two or three of us providing a 24/7 community service. We are worn out.

Although this is a mock-up newspaper article, the message within the article is worryingly true. The Laverton SC is dangerously close to shutting its doors. Did you know that 145 of Western Australia's 160 regional and remote ambulance Sub Centres are entirely run by Volunteers?

The Laverton ambulance last year attended approximately 260 callouts. This community need was for any urgent or non-urgent call for assistance, day or night. Almost half of the 300 cases were RFDS transfers to the airport, this is a vital role played by your local ambo's.

At present the Laverton St John SC has 5 members, of which three are clinical volunteers (turn out in the ambulance as crew) who have the training and skill set to attend patients in our community.

THIS ESSENTIAL COMMUNITY EMERGENCY SERVICE CANNOT CONTINUE TO OPERATE WITHOUT AN INCREASE IN VOLUNTEER MEMBERS.

Peter has worked hard from a young age and reflects on memories as far back as when he was 13, when it took two weeks to guide 600 sheep from Bandya Station to Laverton. The sheep were sold to Kalgoorlie Butchers Horan & Co for 20 & 9 pence per head and were sent by train from Laverton to Kalgoorlie.

At 14 years old, Peter was uncommonly issued with his driver's licence by Sgt Bert Anderson, and would drive his Chev truck into town from Bandya to collect stores, petrol and kerosine etc for the refrigerator. By 15 years old, Peters was earning 25 shillings and keep, working as a station hand for his father.

Meeting his wife Maureen in 1954 is Peter's favourite memory. They married just one year later in 1955 and raised their family for 42 years on Bandya Station, before spending another 20 years on Lake Wells Station, moving into town after selling the property during 2004. His family is what keeps his feet firmly on Laverton soil.

Television and a Bitumen road from Malcom to Laverton, are both things that Peter never thought he would see in Laverton but is happy he has had the opportunity to. In the future, Peter would like to see a revamp of walking paths around town, the repair of potholes on local roads and most importantly... a big downpour before Christmas to replenish water sources for the local flora and fauna.

Maureen is married to Peter and has been living in the Laverton area for 65 years. They have lived at Bandya and Lake Wells Stations, until retiring and moving into town 16 years ago.

Born in Kalgoorlie in 1933, Maureen grew up at Ora Banda, in a happy home with her parents and 7 siblings. She attended Ora Banda State Primary School before going to St Anthony's Convent in Coolgardie as a boarder for her last schooling years.

Laverton carries many beautiful memories for Maureen, including the warm welcome she received when she first moved here. She reminisces of enjoying dances at the town hall with the young locals, where the one and only school teacher played the piano as their source of music.

Over the later years the Annual Race Meetings and other social events were enjoyable, bringing people and friends together. E-cigarettes – as deadly as cigarettes

If you have thought about trying to quit smoking, you are not alone. At least seven out of 10 smokers say they want to stop. Quitting smoking is one of the best things you can do for your health. But do not get tempted to turn to electronic cigarettes (also called e-cigarettes or vaping) as a way to ease the transition. E-cigarettes are always mistaken as approved therapy or marketed by manufacturers as a quitting aid. Most smokers who use e-cigarettes to give up smoking continue to use both traditional cigarettes and e-cigarettes, and consequently, do not significantly reduce their risk of major diseases caused by smoking.

E-cigarettes are battery-operated devices that allow the user to inhale nicotine or other chemicals in a vapour form. The liquids used in e-cigarettes can contain nicotine, but also flavourings and harmful substances such as heavy metals, volatile organic compounds, and cancer-causing chemicals. Currently, it is illegal in Australia to sell nicotine for use in e-cigarettes because nicotine is classified as a Schedule 7 poison. In WA, it is illegal to sell e-cigarette or any device that resembles a tobacco product.

E-cigarettes are relatively new products and the long-term safety and health effects associated with their use and exposure to second-hand vapour are very limited. It is important to remember that it took many decades to research for the true health effects of traditional cigarettes to be determined. The Big Tobacco companies are marketing these products as significantly less harmful than traditional cigarettes.

There is strong and accumulating evidence that using e-cigarettes can have serious immediate health effects. Individuals who use e-cigarettes are presenting with unexplained lung symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, chest pain, popcorn lungs), gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting, diarrhea), heart diseases, fatigue, fever, headache, and weight loss. The latest research shows that e-cigarettes also damage brain stem cells and contributes to premature skin ageing. Anyone using e-cigarette products or exposed to e-cigarette emissions is potentially at higher risk. This includes but is not limited to young people, pregnant women, and their unborn children.

If you are regular cigarette smoker, it is never too late to quit. The risk of getting serious diseases will be significantly reduced. Talk to your health professional for medications. On Country With Two Way Science

Yuwa

This term at Laverton school our students from Rooms 2-3 had the privilege to go out on country to Mt Margaret healing pool.

Room 3 students learnt about light and shadow to help them tell direction on where they are when they are out on country. They mapped out the area so that next time they can see how the area and landforms change every season. Room 3 students also learnt the four-point directions in Wongatha language.

Room 2 students had to investigate the effect of salt on plant growth and viability. Before the excursion Room 2 students discussed Aboriginal seasons and the natural features of the landscape and made predictions about what they might find.



At the pool our students explored around the area and discussed /made notes about:

- the colours of shrubs
- height / variety of bushes
- small insects living in the undergrowth
- moisture content of the soil
- location of the salt / was it near the shrubs?
- surrounding landscape / were there many trees?/animals tracks to show them drinking the water
- creatures living in the water.

Driveway Safety

Tragically one child, often a toddler, is run over in the driveway every week in Australia¹. The vehicle is often being driven by a parent, relative or friend².

The vehicle is usually only moving slowly, however, a slow moving vehicle reversing down a driveway can trap a child, causing fatal crush injuries. Children who survive are often left with severe long-term injuries.

Why the risk?

Young children are naturally inquisitive and want to see what is going on. They move surprisingly fast and can run into the street without warning. In the time it takes for the driver to say goodbye and start the car, a child can move from a 'safe' position, onto the driveway and into the path of the vehicle.

Small children, particularly toddlers, can be impossible to see from inside a car, especially if they are directly behind it. Most drivers are aware of their car's 'blind spots' however sometimes it is difficult to know how large these 'blind spots' really are. Even if your car has parking sensors or a video camera fitted, you may not notice a small child until it is too late to stop.

Safety Steps: Don't go if you don't know!

Supervise

- Always supervise your children when near cars and driveways.
- Hold your child's hand when near cars and driveways.
- If you are the only adult at home and need to move a vehicle, even only a small distance, place your child securely in the vehicle with you while you move it.

Separate

- Create safe play areas for your children away from traffic
- Where possible, avoid using the driveway as a play area for children.
- Make access to the driveway from the house difficult for young children, by using security doors, fencing or gates.

See

- Drivers should walk around their vehicle before moving it, even if your car has parking sensors or a reversing camera fitted.
- Wave goodbye from a safe place. Where possible, avoid using the driveway to wave goodbye.

To the residents of Regional West Australia




