Shire News

Appointment of Acting Chief Executive Officer

Mr Pascoe Durtanovich has commenced temporary employment with the Shire of Laverton and will fill the role of Acting Chief Executive Officer as from 12 August 2017 until a permanent Chief Executive Officer is appointed.

Main Street Project Update

The Main Street Project has reached a stage where (following a meeting between Project Manager and Councillors last week) a number of decisions were made to facilitate the construction works moving forward. Further to the latest public notice issued by Quadrio Earthmoving last week, decisions have been made regarding below ground services which now enables works to proceed at the Wedgewood Close intersection, the raised garden bed walls at the Post Office and the main pedestrian crossing at Laver Place. The primary cause of delays to date has not been the fault of the contractor - Quadrio Earthmoving have, in fact, been very cooperative and flexible in assisting to resolve these issues which have arisen from shortcomings by others. We also recognise that members of the public have been very patient and that is greatly appreciated.

The Contractor's revised construction program will now see civil works (including bitumen sealing/asphalting/kerbing) completed by 28 August and final landscaping by 27 September, noting that there is a lead time for delivery of street furniture and plants. Following last week's issue resolution, Quadrio have mobilised additional equipment as well as irrigation and paver/bricklayer subcontractors and works are proceeding in a number of areas including footings and walls at the Post Office raised garden beds, the Wedgewood Close intersection pavement reconstruction, preparation for pavers which are starting to be delivered to site, the completion of main irrigation line connection to the School Oval tank and the setting out of levels in the area between the Desert Inn Hotel and the Police Station.

Solar PV Installation

At the June Ordinary Meeting of Council, Tender 06/17 was awarded to Save Energy Pty Ltd for the installation of roof-mounted Solar Photo-Voltaic Systems on the Shire Administration building and/or Hall building and the Great Beyond Information Centre. This is one of the renewable energy projects for the Goldfields-Esperance region initiated by the Goldfields Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils who were successful in securing funding for this through the Country Local Government Fund.

Plant Replacement Program

As agreed by Council at the May Ordinary Meeting of Council, several items of plant were offered for sale by tender as a part of the Shire's Plant Replacement Program and new replacements sought. These processes have now been concluded and we have taken delivery of two new Graders, with a new Multi-Wheel Roller due to be delivered at the beginning of August, and a new Rubbish Truck has been ordered and we are hoping to take delivery of this within the next two or three months.

Town and Road Crew Works

Our Construction Crew continues to assist with the forming and constructing of the 50 kilometres to be sealed on the Great Central Road. All earthworks, drainage, shaping and base course is completed (except final trim & water binding for sealing) from SLK 0 to SLK 7.5 and the road section SLK 7.5 to SLK 11.3 is currently being constructed and is due to be completed by August 2017.

Council's two Maintenance Crew graders have completed the following sections of road since the publication of the last Sturt Pea and are currently on Bandya Road and the Old Laverton Road:

- 1) Lakes Wells Road - Great Central Rd to the Lakes Well Station
- 2) Great Central Road - Yamarna Rd to the Tjukayirla Roadhouse
- Great Central Road Tjukavirla Roadhouse northeast for 170 kms 3)
- 4) Great Central Road - Yamarna Rd to Laverton
- White Cliffs Road Great Central Rd, East 120 kms 5)

The Town Maintenance Crew have assisted with the removal of pavers for the Main Street Project and also continued with their daily activities which include rubbish collection, covering waste at the refuse site, street sweeping, Parks and Gardens maintenance and mowing.

Local Government Week/Banners In The Terrace

The annual Local Government Convention and Trade Exhibition will be held in the first week of August this year and in conjunction with this, the WA Local Government Association holds their Banners in the Terrace Competition which highlights the variety of landscapes, lifestyles and communities that exist across the State. Laverton has an entry in the 2017 Competition, so if you are in Perth between Sunday 23 July and Saturday 5 August see if you can spot the Laverton Banner somewhere along St George's and Adelaide Terraces.

Staff – Youth Officer Positions

Currently the Shire is seeking staff to deliver youth activities in Laverton. The first position available is a full time position of Youth Officer and applications for the position of Youth Officer close 4pm Tuesday 4th July. We are also looking for casual Youth Support Officers who will assist the Youth Officer to create and support youth programs and activities. As this position is a casual one we will consider appointing more than one applicant. No deadline has been set for applications, so if you are interested after reading this article, please contact Jo Morgan on 0407 062 542 to discuss the position.



School Holiday Youth Program

A big fortnight of activities has been planned for the July School Holidays. In the first week, Curtin Volunteers will be in Laverton assisting with activities from Monday 3 July to Friday 7 July. A number of NAIDOC Week activities will form part of the holiday program, including creating a NAIDOC banner, an official Opening Ceremony, dot painting, Emu puppet making and a Cultural Day out bush. Also forming part of the first week activities will be a number of bbq's, sports activities (including Auskick and junior & senior netball games), a cook-up, arts & crafts and a Superhero Parade.

In the second week from Monday 10 July to Friday 14 July, there will be a wide range of activities including a Domino Toppling Championship, veggie seed planting, arts & craft activities, cooking, sports activities, a fun gym & inflatables session with YMCA, movies, a sausage sizzle, a pool competition, making a graffiti banner and an afternoon tea party. Letter to the public

Re: Laverton Main Street Upgrade

During this swing of works 29/5/17 through to the 18/6/17 Quadrio Earthmoving expected works to be completed have been delayed by unexpected issues relating to the discovery of buried electrical, telephone and water services the locations of which are impacting on the designed mainstreet works. A lot of effort has been going in by the contractor and project supervisors behind the scenes to make arrangements for relocation of several services (particularly in the vicinity of the post office and intersection of Wedgewood place) however we are having to deal with fairly lengthy response and action times from service authorities and their sub-contractors due to other commitments. Unfortunately, due to these services and the required approval process QEM cannot confirm an exact date of approval or completion of the works.

We are pleased to say that the main water line relocation in front of the post office has been relocated and arrangements have been made for Telstra contractors to be on site at start of next cycle (26 June) to deal with the Telstra line. That will then enable work to undertaken for construction of footings and retaining walls for the replacement raised garden bed.

- During the upcoming swing 26/6/17 through to the 16/7/17 QEM will begin installation of footpath paving at LV parking area and the area in front of hotel.
- Pavement backfill at Wedgewood place intersection to be completed (as soon as clearance is obtained from Horizon Power in relation to power conduits previously installed by others under this intersection)
- Construction of the raised garden walls at post office.
- QEM will also be completing various road widenings along Augusta street along with the realignment of McPherson street

We will endeavor to keep any disruption to an absolute minimum and would like to thank you for your understanding.

Roman Rudnyts CONCERT PIANI

Roman Rudnytsky is an American concert pianist of Ukrainian background whose performances take him all over the world. A graduate of the famous Juilliard School in New York, he has as of 2017 played in about 100 countries.

Born in New York into a family of professional musicians, Roman Rudnytsky started the study of piano at age four and gave his first recital at age seven. He is prizewinner of ten national and international piano competitions, including 2nd Prize in the International Leventritt Competition in New York - at that time, the most prestigious international competition for piano and violin in the USA. He has been soloist with many orchestras around the world, playing with them over 45 different works for piano and orchestra. He has also played many concerts in over 35 countries since 1984 through the auspices of US Embassies and has also played recitals on 65 cruises of P&O and Cunard ships to and from the UK. His most recent performances (early 2017) were in the UK, the island of Saipan, Alaska, and elsewhere in the USA.

Roman Rudnytsky has come to Australia for concert tours every two years since 1979 and has played about 600 concerts there in that time - more than in any other country he has traveled to. These have ranged from the Sydney Opera House to many small country and Outback towns in every State and in the NT - for many local arts councils, at many regional performing arts centers, at universities, and as soloist with several orchestras.

Mr. Rudnytsky gave the Australian premiere performance in 1993 of the then-recentlydiscovered Liszt Concerto No.3 in E Flat for piano and orchestra as soloist with the SBS Youth Orchestra in the Sydney Town Hall. The SBS broadcast this concert through its TV network as part of its documentary on this concerto, called "Discovering Liszt". He also served twice as Artist-in-Residence at the Univ. of Melbourne Faculty of Music and once at the Univ. of Wollongong School of Creative Arts.

Roman Rudnytsky is also currently "Professor Emeritus" of the Dana School of Music of Youngstown (Ohio) State University, where he served on the piano and music faculty for 39 years.

Following this year's Australian tour, Mr. Rudnytsky will be playing recitals between early October and early December on five cruises of Cunard ships (all three of them: the Queen Mary 2, Queen Elizabeth, and Queen Victoria) and, in late December, will be performing on the island of Guam.



Sterilisation in Cats and Dogs:

Imagine a world without homeless dogs and cats? - Imagine a world where no animal is left outside in the cold on rainy days with no shelter, food or warmth. Approximately 10,000 humans are born everyday in the U.S, compared to this around 70,000 puppies and kittens are born everyday also. If this is just in the U.S alone, imagine world wide? Over population of animals is getting worse and worse. As long as this birth comparison exists, there will never be enough homes for the number of these animals. Not only does De/Sexing your pet (Cat or Dog) prevent unwanted litters, (over population) but it also helps to stop bad behaviours from your pet and also major health risks that can cause your pet to become very sick, and may even lead to death in some fatal cases.

What is Sterilisation?

<u>De/Sexing / Sterilisation</u>- In females it involves the Cat / Dog being put under general anaesthetic and having their ovaries and uterus fully removed. In males, the testes and all reproductive organs inside the testicular area are removed leaving no chance of any reproduction to occur.

Why should we Sterilise our animals ?

<u>Unwanted pregnancies:</u> Very often people don't think much about De/Sexing their animals, then they end up with a litter of puppies or cats they never intended on their animal giving birth to. Studies show that over 6 million cats and dogs in the U.S that are either abandoned, or not wanted are put into shelters each year. Imagine how much bigger that number is throughout the whole world? This number could drop right down if owners took into consideration of De/Sexing their pet. Around 2 - 3 million of these pets, who have nothing wrong with them, are healthy, loving and deserve a life have to be euthanized. Most of their life is spent confined in a cage with no freedom or love, others don't even get that opportunity and end up roaming the streets until they get caught by authorities, only to be euthanized as well. This is often from biting or attacking another animal as it is their only way of survival.

Hello and welcome to Beauty Spot - Issue 2

In this controversial issue of Beauty Spot I am going to be educating you on the dangers, health risks and financial risks of counterfeit beauty products. The reason I say this will be controversial is because there are people far and wide who have used fake makeup, perfume, sunscreen etc. And had no problems with it, so they will argue my points on this. But what I will be talking about is not only instant reactions but long term effects as well.



Lets start off with the dangerous and sometimes disgusting ingredients that have been scientifically tested and found in various counterfeit makeup and beauty products:

MERCURY - While mercury is found naturally in the earth's crust, it is highly toxic and it can harm the heart, kidneys, immune system, lungs, and brain. It can also cause skin rashes, muscle weakness, headaches, and insomnia. In eye makeup, it can permanently damage your vision.

LEAD - Counterfeit makeup products can have up to 19 times the legal limit of lead in them. Lead can build up in the human body over the months, leading to lead poisoning. In adults, lead poisoning can cause memory loss, joint and muscle pains, and headaches. Pregnant women risk miscarriage or premature birth if they are exposed to too much lead.

ARSENIC - Arsenic is a toxic elements that can cause abdominal pain, shock, and even death.

E.COLI - The FBI reports that counterfeit cosmetics can often contain dangerous amounts of bacteria in them. One bacteria that has been found and identified in fake cosmetics is e. coli (Escherichia coli). E. coli can cause severe diarrhoea, as well as kidney failure and anaemia. Some of the e. coli strains can also cause urinary tract infections. It is spread through faecal matter and people not washing their hands after having a bowel movement. Considering that there are no sanitary practices among the gangs making fake makeup, the spread of e. coli comes as no surprise.

ALUMINUM - Studies show that toxic metals contribute to brain diseases by producing oxidative stress and aluminium is one of the worst offenders. The prevailing belief around the world is that aluminium is linked to degenerative brain diseases such as Alzheimer's and Parkinson's.

PAINT STRIPPER - Some of the known hazards associated with paint strippers are respiratory damage from breathing in the chemicals, skin diseases, and damage to the brain, nervous system, and to internal organs. This is not something you want to get onto your skin or into your eyes.

RAT FECES - Tests on counterfeit makeup have revealed a horrifying ingredient: rat faeces. Whether the rat poop has been added to the makeup ingredients intentionally or it is due to filthy work conditions is unclear in the numerous reports on find this special ingredient. One thing can be certain: rat poop contains bacteria and germs that we would not knowingly put onto or into our bodies.

HUMAN URINE - Counterfeit fragrances have been found to contain something called DEHP, classified by the Environmental Protection Agency as a probable human carcinogen. These phony perfumes and colognes, which sometimes contain urine as well, have been known to cause serious skin rashes.



FACT

Profits made from counterfeit make-up are used to fund drugs smuggling and terrorism, say Interpol.

Interpol - The International Police Organization is an intergovernmental organization facilitating international police cooperation.


HOW TO SPOT FAKE MAKEUP

The Price - Fake makeup will most likely be a whole lot cheaper than the genuine product - meaning cheap production and quick sales.

Packaging - Fake makeup products will never be 100% identical to the real deal. Counterfeit items will have uneven fonts, misspelled words and incorrect shade names printed.

Distributors - Where did you purchase your product from? If it was eBay, Aliexpress, Wish, dhgate.com, Amazon or any other similar site, then chances are you've scored yourself a fake. It is important to be cautious when buying from the mentioned websites/apps above as ANYONE can create an account and sell ANYTHING they want. This is why producers of counterfeit products choose these as their distributing point. You should also refrain from buying makeup from Facebook buy/sell/swap groups unless they have receipts to prove they purchased their products form the company's website or trusted resellers (Sephora, Mecca, Adore Beauty, Beauty Bliss etc.)

If you are ever unsure of your purchase then you can always contact the makeup company directly and send them all the details including photo's of packaging/ barcodes/batch numbers.

Don't buy from WISH!!! At least not makeup!! Its dangerous they don't have the same laws in China!! So they add dangerous chemicals to their knock off products!! Just look at these lips from the Kylie Jenner lip kit knock offs. You get what you pay for....

From 2008 to 2010 almost 70% of all counterfeit goods seized worldwide were from China, according to the U.N. Office on Drugs and Crime.

D.I.Y PROJECTS





Did you know that there are many vegetables in your fridge that you can easily regrow? Below is a short list of just some of the vegetables you can grow in a few simple steps.

1. Basil

Strip Basil leaves from 3/4 of the stem. Place in a jar or cup of water (make sure jar or cup has clear glass). Place on window sill or somewhere that gets sun. (not to hot of an area).

Change the water around every 3 days.

Roots should start to grow out of the bottom of the stems. Once roots reach around 3cm transfer into a pot. This should take two to four weeks.



2. Celery

Cut off base of the base of the celery stalk. Keep on about 3cms Place the base in a small dish of water.

Within a week you should see the centre of the celery stalk change to a yellowish colour.

In a couple of weeks shoots should start to grow. After around 3 weeks the base should be ready to transplant into a pot of soil.



3. Bok Choy

Another simple vegetable is Bok Choy. Simply cut the base of the stalk leaving on about 3cms.

Place in a small dish on water. Place on window sill or somewhere that gets sun. Change water ever 2 days,

Roots should start to grow from the bottom and shoots should start to appear at the top.

Transplant into a pot after about 2-3 weeks





4. Romaine Lettuce

Much like Celery and Bok Choy, Lettuce can be easily regrown in a small dish of water. Simply cut about 4cms of the base of the lettuce.

Place in a small dish of water (you may need to use some small rocks to stop the lettuce from falling over.

You should start to quickly see leaves grow. Once you see roots appearing it is time to plant lettuce into a pot of soil.



5. Onion

Cut the bottom of the onion off. Place the roots in a dish of water, but make sure not to fully submerge the rest of the onion. Place beside a window that receives good sunlight. spray the top with a little water every on to two days.

The onion should start to grow roots out the bottom, and green stalks should start sprouting through the top. After about 2-3 weeks the sprouts and roots should be long enough to plant. If there are multiple stalks that have sprouted on the onion, you can carefully separate each stalk with some roots attached to each stalk.

Transfer each stalk into a pot or garden bed.



6. Potato

You can regrow potatoes simply by looking for eyes that grow from the vegetable (As shown in the picture above. Cut potatoes into 3cm pieces that contain eyes. Let the pieces sit out for a day, so the exposed areas are able to dry out a little.

Plant the pieces in about 10cm's of loose soil, with the eyes facing up.



<u>Quick Fish Coconut Curry</u>

- 1½ teaspoons vegetable oil
- 1 small onion, thinly sliced
- 5 tablespoons freshly grated ginger
- 5 tablespoons crushed garlic
- 1/3 teaspoon of turmeric powder
- 500ml coconut milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 500g of white fish, cubed

- 2. Add ginger and garlic.
- 3. Season with turmeric powder and pour in the coconut milk.

- 5. Add tomato and coriander leaves just before serving.
