Building Our Future 2021

Laurinda Hill, Manager of Laverton's Great Beyond Visitor Centre

Thanks to the Australian Government's \$110 billion 10 year Building Our Future investment in transport infrastructure, it is going to be even easier for tourists to travel from Laverton along what is nicknamed Australia's longest shortcut to Uluru, Alice Springs and across to Winton in outback Queensland.

The Government has invested \$37.2 million to progressively seal approximately 87 kilometres of the Great Central Road, which forms part of the Outback Way between Laverton and Northern Territory border.

Laurinda Hill, Manager of Laverton's Great Beyond Visitor Centre, home to the Explorers Hall of Fame, says the town is booming as contractors working on this project fill accommodation and spend their hard-earned money in the local supermarkets, cafes and other small businesses.

"A lot of the guys working on the project come into town to buy coffee and head to the local supermarket to grab their supplies—it's already had a major impact on the town's economy," she says.

The visitor's centre has also seen a jump in enquiries from caravanners and campers keen to explore the area.

"Laverton is a central hub for routes to so many parts of the state and further afield. Northeast to Uluru, east to Coober Pedy, north to Lake Carnegie, southwest to Kalgoorlie; and there's access to a lot of four-wheel-drive tracks, cattle stations and old tracks.

"There's been a huge jump in the number of visitors coming from Perth and the Goldfields," Laurinda says.

Johanna McGuire, who manages the local Community Resource Centre for the Shire of Laverton also says she is excited by the number of young locals who have also secured work on the project.

The Outback Way Great Central Road Progressive Sealing Project is just one of over 600 projects being delivered across the country as part of the Australian Government's \$110 billion 10 year Building Our Future infrastructure plan. 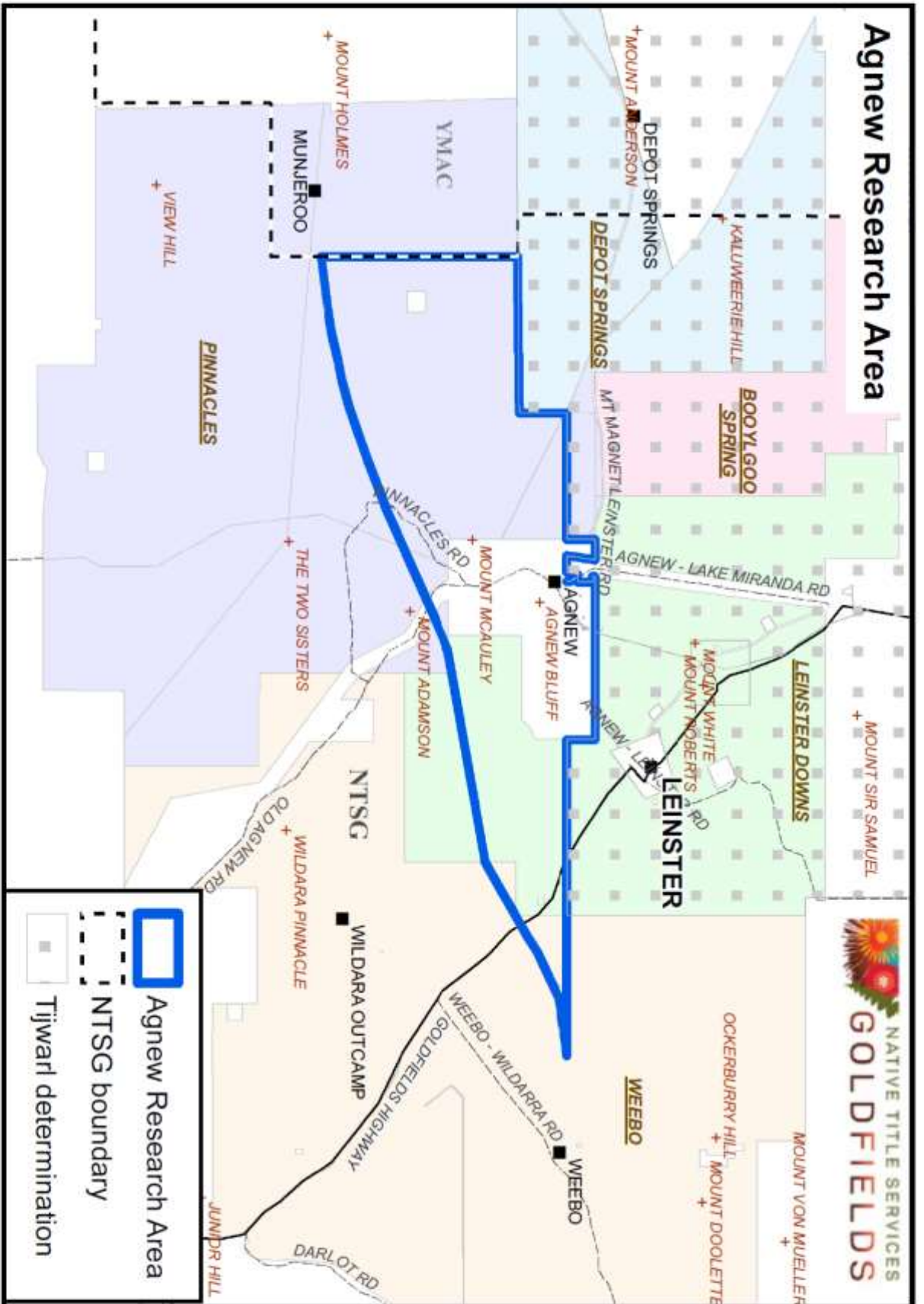

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO CDP OBLIGATIONS

As part of the 2021-22 Budget, the Government has announced a new remote jobs program commencing in 2023, which will replace the Community Development Program (CDP). The new program will be developed in partnership with Indigenous communities and will complement the broader New Employment Service Model being rolled out in the latter half of 2022. While the process is underway, the Government has made changes to Mutual Obligation Requirements for all CDP job seekers.

From May 2021, job seekers will be able to participate in activities on a voluntary basis, but will continue to have some compulsory requirements, such as attending appointments with service providers or looking for work.

Free mammograms for women in Laverton

BreastScreen WA's **FREE** screening mammogram service is coming to Laverton

- From **09/08/2021 - 12/08/2021**

The mobile clinic will be at:

- **Laverton Shire Hall Car Park, 9 Mcpherson Place**

Women 50 to 74 years are invited to have a FREE screening mammogram. (All women 40 years and over are eligible).

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and 1 in 7 women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should contact her doctor immediately.

Dates may be subject to change. If visit dates are not suitable participants are welcome to book at the clinic in a different town or at any of our [permanent clinics](#). For more information please visit BreastScreen WA's website www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au.
