It is at the sole discretion of CRC Staff to decide if an image is of a standard which assures a high quality calendar, where an image is deemed to not be of standard the image will not be entered.



The Shire of Laverton has a vacancy for a permanent/part-time position as a Library/Community Resource Centre Officer.

The main tasks are Customer Service, maintaining the Public Library and supporting the CRC Coordinator in programs and services provided through the CRC. The position requires reliability, confidence to work unassisted on tasks and a willingness to train in both internal library systems and Department of Transport licensing. The applicant needs to demonstrate high Customer Service skills and be community minded.

The salary will be negotiated within level 5 of the Shire of Laverton Enterprise Bargaining Agreement 2012. Re: Laverton Main Street Upgrade

During the latest swing of works various approvals and instructions have been granted. This has allowed QEM and its contractors to proceed with the construction of the planter box retaining wall located at the post office entrance and other related works.

Decisions regarding underground services (particularly in the vicinity of the post office and intersection of Wedgewood place) have now also been made which has resulted in road construction and road trimming works being completed.

- During the current swing of works 24th July through to the 13th of August Quadrio Earthmoving QEM will be aiming to substantially complete the following areas of the Laverton Main Street Upgrade project.
- Complete the construction of planter box retaining wall including disabled access ramp.
- Begin installation of footpath paving at LV parking area and the area in front of hotel.

- Progress with installation of footpath paving alongside road kerbing
- Begin various landscaping works such as garden mulch, planting of trees/shrubs

- Footings for street furniture
- Erection of some street furniture items (park benches, rubbish bins, tables)

Main Street Project Upgrade

During the swing of works **24th July through to the 13th of August** Quadrio Earthmoving (QEM) will be aiming to substantially complete the following areas of the Laverton Main Street Upgrade project.

Complete the construction of planter box retaining wall including disables access ramp. Begin installation of footpath paving at LV parking area and the area in front of the hotel. Spray 7mm bitumen prime seal on all completed and exposed road pavement areas Install roadside Kerbing as per design Progress with installation of footpath paving alongside road kerbing Begin various landscaping works such as garden mulch, planting of trees/shrubs

- Gravel mulch verges
- Footings for street furniture
- Erection of some street furniture items (park benches, rubbish bins, tables)

Please note: During the road sealing works (approx. date of 29^{th} July – 3^{rd} August) there may be some traffic delays and road closures. This is for the safety and wellbeing of the general public and we apologize for any inconvenience that may occur.

Town and Road Crew Works

The Shire of Laverton's Construction Crew has recently completed gravel re-sheeting a section of Mt Margaret Road between SLK 4.2 and SLK 9.6 and is currently gravel re-sheeting Old Laverton Road between SLK 23.0 and SLK 27.0 until mid-August.

Once completed, the machinery will then be transported to Bandya Road to commence gravel re-sheeting a section of this road between SLK 7.5 and SLK 12.0.



Council's maintenance graders are at present grading the Great Central Road whilst the towns Maintenance crew have recently completed planting approximately 25 Hibiscus Tilliaceus trees along Craiggie Street.

Further trees are proposed to be planted at Laverton's Cemetery in the next couple of weeks and if any remain at various parks around town. The Shire of Laverton would like to thank Goldfields for the donation of these trees.

The remainder of the shire staff continue with their daily activities which includes rubbish collection, covering waste at the refuse site, street sweeping, Parks and Gardens maintenance and mowing.

Supply of Plant and Operations for Outback Highway Roadworks

Council has accepted a tender from C&A Taylor Grading Pty Ltd for plant hire for the Outback Highway roadworks. The contract is for four months with a two month extension option.





At School and the Youth Centre we made many drawings and paintings and really enjoyed creating the sand art with Marty and Mrs. Miller.



Roman Rudnyts CONCERT PIANI

Roman Rudnytsky is an American concert pianist of Ukrainian background whose performances take him all over the world. A graduate of the famous Juilliard School in New York, he has as of 2017 played in about 100 countries.

Born in New York into a family of professional musicians, Roman Rudnytsky started the study of piano at age four and gave his first recital at age seven. He is prizewinner of ten national and international piano competitions, including 2nd Prize in the International Leventritt Competition in New York - at that time, the most prestigious international competition for piano and violin in the USA. He has been soloist with many orchestras around the world, playing with them over 45 different works for piano and orchestra. He has also played many concerts in over 35 countries since 1984 through the auspices of US Embassies and has also played recitals on 65 cruises of P&O and Cunard ships to and from the UK. His most recent performances (early 2017) were in the UK, the island of Saipan, Alaska, and elsewhere in the USA.

Roman Rudnytsky has come to Australia for concert tours every two years since 1979 and has played about 600 concerts there in that time - more than in any other country he has traveled to. These have ranged from the Sydney Opera House to many small country and Outback towns in every State and in the NT - for many local arts councils, at many regional performing arts centers, at universities, and as soloist with several orchestras.

Mr. Rudnytsky gave the Australian premiere performance in 1993 of the then-recentlydiscovered Liszt Concerto No.3 in E Flat for piano and orchestra as soloist with the SBS Youth Orchestra in the Sydney Town Hall. The SBS broadcast this concert through its TV network as part of its documentary on this concerto, called "Discovering Liszt". He also served twice as Artist-in-Residence at the Univ. of Melbourne Faculty of Music and once at the Univ. of Wollongong School of Creative Arts.

Roman Rudnytsky is also currently "Professor Emeritus" of the Dana School of Music of Youngstown (Ohio) State University, where he served on the piano and music faculty for 39 years.

Following this year's Australian tour, Mr. Rudnytsky will be playing recitals between early October and early December on five cruises of Cunard ships (all three of them: the Queen Mary 2, Queen Elizabeth, and Queen Victoria) and, in late December, will be performing on the island of Guam.





Baiting / 1080 Poison

About 1080


1080 are a Poison / Pesticide that is commonly used in parts of Western Australia and New Zealand. It contains an active ingredient called **'Sodium Fluoroacetate'**, which is a colourless, tasteless and odourless substance found in many native plants around Australia.

While 1080 is a naturally occurring substance, breaks down easily and leaves no trace in the environment, it is also a <u>Schedule 7 Poison</u> and there is no antidote for it. 1080 is used to target and get rid of pests in the wild such as possums, rats, rabbits, dingoes and foxes, it is usually put into meats, sausages, carrots and other foods that are appealing to its target animal. Many native animals have developed a high tolerance to 1080 but dogs and cats are highly susceptible to it, and also have a high chance of secondary poisoning if they ingest a carcass that has traces of 1080 inside it. As there is no antidote to this pesticide most animals become a fatality unless they are able to get medical attention before symptoms kick in if not immediately.

In Western Australia, supply of 1080 as well as the use is strictly allocated to authorised persons and is usually dropped by helicopter over land. No baits are to be laid within 5 m of a fenced property, 50 m of the centre line of a declared road, No baits are to be laid within 20 m of permanent or flowing water. although, 1080 is soluble in water and dilutes quickly, leaving little if no trace after 72 hours.

Signs of 1080 poisoning may include the following:

Howling / Barking at nothing

- Vomiting
- Convulsions and shaking
- Sensitive to sound and light
 - Anxiety and Nervousness / Paranoia
- Aggressive behaviour

Ingestion of 1080 poison is life threating and most dogs end up passing away because of the severity of it. It can take about 30 minutes - 2 hours for 1080 to work, and for symptoms to occur. During this time the poison will have already started to affect the body, so getting your pet to the vet as soon as possible is really important. If you are sure that your dog has ingested 1080, make it vomit immediately by placing 1-2 crystals of washing soda down its throat, or half a teaspoon of salt thrown on the back of the dogs tongue, while this is not an antidote, it can help with recovery if seen by a vet shortly after.

Preventions

Always look out for 1080 signs when you are taking your dog for a walk, and walk in the opposite direction. Even though 1080 is not supposed to be in public areas, it could have been moved due to rainfall, birds, or infected carcasses may be around. It may have even been moved by accident.

You can also put a muzzle on your dog when you are taking it out of the house to prevent it from ingesting anything suspicious.

1080 is often in a green pellet (pictured to the left) so if you come in contact with them in an area it shouldn't be, please called the shire and let them know immediately.

Always watch your dog, especially when walking out around the bush areas., and always keep them in a secure area when you are away from home so they are not able to escape.

Hello and welcome to Beauty Spot - Issue 3

In this issue of beauty spot I will be talking all about EYEBROWS. They frame your face, they introduce you before you even speak they are SO important. Don't under estimate the power of your brows. Lets talk about tips and tricks, eyebrow shapes to suit your face and which products will work for you.



Top 5 Tips & Tricks For Eyebrows

LEAVE THEM ALONE - Brow specialists recommend letting your eyebrows grow out for as long as possible (6-8 weeks ideally) in order for them to reach their full potential which will allow you to see the natural shape of your brow.

- SNIP, SNIP Trimming your brows will give you a tidy and put together look whilst keeping the fullness of your eyebrows in tact. To achieve this you should brush hair up with spoolie and one hair at a time trim only the very long hairs.
- CALM DOWN To prep for plucking, gently massage a generous amount of your favourite facial oil on to the brow bone. This will lubricate your skin and hair follicle, prevent hair from breaking, and take the edge off the skin's sensitivity from tweezing.
- 4. CLEAN IT UP For unfussy eyebrows, skip the hot wax and pick up a set of tweezers To get the most painless pluck, "tweeze hairs in direction of hair growth while holding the skin taut. Always use natural day light and do not use a magnifying mirror. It is important to remember that LESS IS MORE when it comes to brows so you don't want to over do it. Start by plucking the stray hairs underneath the start of your brow and do the same with strays beneath your arch and beyond the end of the tail. To get the best idea on how to shape your eyebrows you can use the chart on the next page to find out which eyebrow shape will best compliment your face.
- FAKE A FULLER FINISH If you have some sparse areas, you can fake a bolder and thicker brow by using a brow pencil or powder to feather in some "hairs" in a shade that matches your natural brow colour on those areas and then combing through with a clear brow gel.



Make Seedling Pots from Eggshells

Throwing eggshells in the bin is what normally happens once you have cooked your eggs. But did you know eggshells make the perfect seedling pot. Unlike plastic seed pots which will end up in landfill, eggshells will self compost and provide the soil and plant with a good calcium. Plus its free which means you will save some \$\$\$.

If your wanting to learn more about this, just read through the following steps!

<u>Step 1</u>

In the bottom of the egg prick a drainage hole with a thumbtack or metal skewer. You want the hole big enough so it wont get clogged by the soil and roots, and so water can drain out of the soil easily.

<u>Step 2</u>

With a small knife gently remove around 1/3 of the eggshell. To make it easier you can just lightly crack the top of the egg and just pick away at the eggshell.

<u>Step 3</u>

Remove the egg yolk.

<u>Step 4</u>

Gently clean out the eggshell with some water. Once the shells have been gently cleaned out soak the shells in a pot for a couple minuets with hot or boiling water in order to kill all bacteria. Lay eggshells on paper towel and let them dry.





<u>Step 6</u>

Place the clean eggshells back into the egg carton.

Using a spoon fill up the egg shells 3/4 of the way with potting mix.

Place the seed your intending to grow in the potting mix and then place a thin layer of potting mix on top.







Place the seedlings on a window sill or somewhere where the seedlings can get sunlight. Water the seedlings regularly to keep the soil moist but not soaking wet.

If you have different seeds in each pot it is worth marking each shell with a non-toxic pen so you **don't forget which plant is in each pot.**

<u>Step 8</u>

Watch the seeds slowly spout.





<u>Step 9</u>

Once the seedlings have fully sprouted it is time to transfer them to your garden. Simply dig a little hole, holding one of the seed pots, gently crush **the shell just enough so the seedling's roots can** escape and find the fresh soil, place the seedling in the hole, and cover with soil.



Japanese Ramen Noodle Soup

INGREDIENTS

For the stock:

- 3 cups of chicken stock •
- 2 cups water
- 3 garlic cloves
- 4 tbsp. soy sauce
- 1 tsp worsterchire sauce
- 1/2 tsp Chinese five spice
- dash of chilli powder
- 1 tsp white sugar
- 2 slices of ginger

For the topping:

- 375g ramen noodles
 - 400g sliced cooked pork or chicken breast (marinate in soy sauce and garlic)
- 100g baby English spinach leaves
- 4tbsp corn kernels
- 2 hard-boiled eggs, peeled and halved
- For the garnish:
- 1 sheet of sliced nori seaweed paper (5cm by 1/2cm each)
- sprinkle of sesame seeds
- sliced green spring onions (shallots)







METHOD

- 1. Slice and fry the pork or chicken in a frypan with 1 clove of chopped garlic, soy sauce and sesame oil. Put into a bowl and reserve.
- 2. In the pot of boiling water, cook the ramen noodles for 5min then strain.
- 3. In a stockpot or large saucepan, place the chicken stock, 4 pieces of halved garlic cloves, soy sauce, worsterchire, ginger, five spice and chilli powder together and bring to boil. Reduce to simmer for 5 min. Taste the stock and adjust to your liking. If it is too salty add some sugar, add more soy if you prefer it saltier.
- 4. Divide the noodles into 4 soup bowls. Arrange the pork on top of the noodles, along with the spinach, half egg, and 1tbsp corn kernels each.
- 5. Bring the stock to boil once again, then take it off and divide the stock in the soup bowls.
- 6. Sprinkle the nori shavings (1/4 sheet each), spring onions and sesame on top of each soup bowl. Allow the spinach to slightly wilt before serving.

- 3/4 cup Brown Sugar firmly packed
- 2 tbsp. Cocoa

- 1/2 cup Milk
- 2 tbsp. Oil (canola)

- 3/4 cup Hot Water

<u>Method</u>

- 1. Place first group of ingredients together in a bowl and stir well.
- 2. Add liquid ingredients, stir well and pour into the slow cooker
- 3. In a glass jug or bowl, mix together the Chocolate Fudge Sauce Ingredients and carefully pour over the ingredients in the slow cooker.
