CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

An election will be held on Saturday 16 October 2021 to fill the following vacancies:

DISTRICT Three vacancies - four year terms

Nominations for the above vacancies open on Thursday 2 September 2021 and close at 4.00pm on Thursday 9 September 2021 at the Shire Office, Laverton.

To nominate, candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer a completed nomination in the prescribed form which has been signed and witnessed. Forms are available from the Returning Officer.

PLEASE NOTE

A new requirement introduced in 2019 is that prior to nominating all candidates must complete the online candidate induction from the Department of Local Government, Sport & Cultural Industries website at:

<https://www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au/local-government/local-governments/council-elections/local-government-candidate-induction>

Nominations must be accompanied by:

- A single A4 page profile of the candidate, containing no more than 150 words of biographical information about the candidate and statements of the candidate's policies or beliefs.
- Where a nomination is lodged on a candidate's behalf by an agent, a written authorisation must be signed by the candidate.
- A deposit of \$80 in legal tender must be received by the Returning Officer before the close of nominations.

The documents may be hand delivered, posted, faxed, emailed or sent by other electronic means if available.

WORKING FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT

BE A VOCAL LOCAL

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the following in-person Local Government elections on 16 October 2021 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the district of the relevant Local Government.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5.00pm 27 August 2021. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll but meet the eligibility criteria for this Roll, you can enrol online at www.aec.gov.au. Alternatively, enrolment forms are available from Post Offices, Australian Electoral Commission offices or the West Australian Electoral Commission www.elections.wa.gov.au. Forms must be completed and received by a Divisional Returning Officer of the Australian Electoral Commission in Western Australia by 5.00pm Friday 27 August 2021.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in your Local Government area and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote and should make an enrolment application to the Local Government. If you are not on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in a particular Local Government, you may be eligible to enrol to vote if you were on the Local Government's last electoral roll prior to May 1996. Please contact the particular Local Government for details. Owners of land who were on the last roll of the Local Government continue to

retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact their particular Local Government to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next 3 months following the date of the application to enrol.

Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Enrolment Forms

Enrolment claim forms can be obtained from Local Governments and should be lodged with the particular Chief Executive Officer by 5.00pm Friday 27 August 2021. If you registered for the 2019 elections or since that time you do not need to register.

However, by **raising awareness**, **reducing stigma around suicide** and **encouraging well-informed action**, we can reduce instances of suicide around the world.

Every action can connect someone to life and the help they need. To prevent suicide requires us to become a beacon of light to those in pain.

You can be the light

You can help give someone hope by showing that you care. All of us can play a role, no matter how small. We may never know what we do that makes a difference. We all can reach in and ask somebody. You do not need have the solutions, but simply making the time and space to listen to someone can help by creating a sense of connection and hope in somebody who may be struggling.

Light a candle. On September 10th, light a candle near a window at 8pm to show your support for suicide prevention, to remember a lost loved one, and for the survivors of suicide.

Sign The Charter. Virtual family and domestic violence support extends to Laverton

Specialist regional domestic violence organisation DVassist is set to extend its support services to Laverton from September this year.

It means people living in the Shire will have access to a domestic violence telephone helpline and webchat staffed by qualified counsellors with experience in regional, rural, and remote communities.

DVassist's website and online information hub will also be updated with geographically relevant domestic violence support services and resources which can be searched via location.

Expansion of the service to Laverton for the next 12 months have been made possible through the NAB Foundation Community Grants program which supports local projects that help communities prepare for natural disasters, support long term recovery and build resilience against future disasters.

NAB State Business Banking Executive WA, Jeff Pontifex, said with more Australians being impacted by natural disasters, it's vital that local support is available to help communities before, during and after a natural disaster.

"As a bank, we know we have a vital role to play to support our customers and local communities when they are impacted by natural disasters. In the immediate aftermath of Cyclone Seroja, NAB provided \$450,000 in customer grants to help the local community with their immediate needs and our bankers will continue to provide on the ground support for the long term," he said.

"Through the NAB Foundation Community Grant program, we're providing funding to local projects that help communities better prepare for natural disasters and assist in their long term recovery. That's why we're getting behind DVassist to support them as they extend their vital services to more West Australians."

DVassist Chief Executive Officer, Esther Schwald said up until now the non-profit organisation had only been able to service 16 regional pilot areas in Western Australia.

"But we need to extend our support and communities at risk of natural disasters are a priority as they have added challenges and pressures which can compound relationship violence," she said.

“We are extraordinarily grateful that NAB Foundation has recognised the critical need to support us as we extend our services to some of the smaller and more remote towns where people can be socially isolated, physically distant from services and live in fear of stigma or retribution.”

Ms Schwald said as a virtual service DVassist can provide confidential and anonymous help to people living in Laverton without compromising safety or privacy.

“Whether it’s you or someone you love who’s experiencing family or domestic violence, we can talk to you no matter where you are or what you are doing.”









