

Road Closure and Detour signs will be in place.



All Western Australians will have the opportunity to receive a free flu vaccination during June, to prepare for the winter flu season.

#### GNRBA IS UNDERTAKING GROUND BAITING OPERATIONS WITH 1080 WILD DOG BAITS

Please be advised that the Goldfields Nullarbor Rangelands Biosecurity Association will shortly be undertaking its May/ June Wild Dog Control – (1080 ground baiting), in the Northern Goldfields, Goldfields and Nullarbor Regions, including DBCA lands.

The baiting is undertaken to reduce the impact of wild dogs on livestock on pastoral leases.

Please note the following:

- It is planned that 1080 baits will be laid in the period between Wednesday 9th February 2022 and Thursday 30th June 2022 These baits will remain active for a longer period. Please remain aware.
- The baits will be the dried meat form, which contain 1080 Sodium fluoroacetate, which
  is a naturally occurring toxin found in some Western Australian flora species. As
  such, most native fauna species have evolved tolerance to it. DOMESTIC DOGS
  AND CATS have ZERO TOLERANCE
- Whilst these baits are laid in areas with appropriate exclusion zones/buffers (e.g. no baits within 500m of townsite boundaries or residential dwellings, or within 250m of public roads and tracks), and target specifically, wild dogs and feral cats, they may pose a risk to domestic dogs and cats, if these animals are taken into the baited areas.
- Accordingly, please warn all visitors who may bring domestic animals into the area and post signage as attached to this email, and this letter in a prominent place for the general public to observe.



#### Background

NTS Goldfields Ltd (NTSG) is organising a camping weekend to discuss a potential new native title claim around the Agnew/Lawlers area (see attached map).

The purpose of this camping weekend is to provide time and a space for people to sit down and have open discussions in a relaxed and informal setting, about which families have connection to the potential claim area.

This trip follows consultation by NTSG, going back to 2020, as well as information meetings held in Leonora on 12 May and 12 August 2021.

#### People who are invited to attend the meeting

Those Aboriginal persons who assert traditional rights and interests in the area marked on the attached map.

#### Agenda

No formal decisions will be made at this meeting, however, attendees will be invited to discuss boundaries for a proposed claim, family connections and recognition of other families. An agenda will be circulated to attendees at the meeting.

#### Camping

Please note this event is held on-country and you will need a suitable vehicle to be able to access the site which will involve some off-road driving. The meeting location is approximately 400 kilometres from Kalgoorlie.

#### Native title services goldfields



We encourage you to attend for as much of the weekend as possible. However, most of the group discussions will take place on Saturday the 18<sup>th</sup> June 2022.

If you plan on staying overnight, please bring your own camping gear including, shelter, camp chair, cooking equipment and your own eating and drinking utensils.

Please bring warm and waterproof clothes.

#### Catering

NTSG will provide BBQs for cooking, as well as a providing a food pack consisting of:

- Stew/barbecue packs for dinner on both Friday 17 June and Saturday 18 June;
- Cereal, milk and bread for breakfast on Saturday 18 June and Sunday 19 June;
- a lunch on Saturday 18 June;

Water, tea and coffee.

#### RSVPs

You must RSVP to attend by 5pm, Friday 10 June 2022 for catering, the pre-payment of travel allowance and planning purposes and to confirm location of the campsite

#### Travel Assistance

A contribution of up to \$360 will be paid to attendees who drive to the camp. This is a contribution towards fuel and food. The maximum allowance will only be paid to those people who attend the meeting from a distance further than 600kms. All other attendees will be paid a pro rata amount. Travel allowance is paid <u>per vehicle</u> and to claim the travel allowance you will need to be present for the majority of the camping weekend. NTSG staff may ask to see your driver's license, your vehicle registration or the vehicle itself.

If you RSVP by 10 June 2022, NTSG will pay the travel allowance from our bank account on 16 June 2022. You will need to provide details of your vehicle, passengers, bank account and home address. For those people who do not let us know they are attending, travel allowance will be paid from NTSG's bank account by 5pm Monday 20 June 2022.






