Shire Bulletin July 2022

To all community members

Welcome to the Shire of Laverton first bulletin where we will endeavour to keep you informed of what is occurring within the Shire of Laverton.

The input from the community is sought and appreciated as the council moves forward with many new and existing initiatives to be completed within the 2022/2023 budget which is tied into the community strategic plan.

In this first issue of the monthly bulletin, I would like to cover several matters of interest to the community and a major decision each year for the council as it looks to adopting the 2022/2023 budget.

The Council will consider the 2022/2023 budget at the Ordinary Meeting of Council on the 21^{st of} July and the council would like to hear from the community should they like anything included into the budget.

Are you aware that the Council can amend its budget at any time throughout the budget year depending on circumstances which are happening within the community? The community strategic plan is the source document, and the council is taking the strategy for the long term view of completing the Laverton townsite through streetscapes, watering of the town to create the green oasis, the completion of the entry to the town from both the west and east and considering the sealing of roads within the town where required. This all goes well for the council's asset management.

As a matter of interest for the council is the current footpath network and the council would like to hear the concerns which people are encountering around the town.

Can you please contact any councillors or the CEO to include your comments into the focus groups which I will detail as follow?

Focus Groups

The council has recently adopted the use of focus groups and to invite community participants to share their thoughts, feelings, attitudes, and ideas on a defined subject for the Laverton community.

The aim is to call for expressions of interest from community members to sit on the focus group to look at the following matters currently before the Council:



Townscape development – there is approximately \$387,000 to be used for development of the townscape.

Racecourse development – with the Laverton go kart club now using the facilities, rodeo being mooted, then the aim is how the area needs to be developed.

Airport development – the council has awarded the tender for the runway and apron reseals including turning nodes, and plans for a new terminal, landscaping, parking etc, all needs to be developed further.

Part of the information to be provided to all participants in the focus groups will include all currently available plans to provide background information to the participants involved.

To engage with the community will alleviate some of the so called concerns within the community and ensure that the council meets its community strategic plan outcomes.

A focus group has a limited life (normally over 4 weeks) and concludes at the completion of the report to the council on the suggested way forward.

The Laverton Hospital

The Laverton hospital is continuing and from our last discussions, the health department is preparing the tender documents to go to tender in the next quarter of this year. As news comes to hand, I will keep you informed in future council notes.



Great Central Road.

The upgrade and sealing of the forty kilometre section of the Outback Way, from the end of the existing seal was completed in September 2021. COVID -19 pandemic, travel restrictions and other measures implemented to protect remote Aboriginal communities have now eased to the extent that Main Roads is working with native title holders and other stakeholders along the route to progress project development activities including undertaking environmental and heritage surveys, completing road design and sourcing materials for the work. The recommencement of construction work is contingent on the time it will take to complete these activities.

Cashless Debit Card

I was in Canberra in the week commencing the 20th of June to follow up as the new government had an election promise to remove the requirements for the cashless debit card. I know with the other goldfields councils; we would appreciate the Minister meeting within our towns to look at the cashless debit card and the benefits which has arisen since the implementation. We have also asked the minister to provide councils with the cashless debit card to provide them with a withdrawal plan as per there election commitment, so it has least impact on the community.

The Council was informed on the 30^{th of} June that the current arrangements for the cashless debit card has been extended to the 31^{st of} December 2022.

Great Beyond (GB)

As the community is aware, the GB has relocated back to the new premises. The Council will hold an official opening at a date to be advised where all the community is invited to attend and when the Minister is available, we will certainly have another ceremony to acknowledge the state government's contribution to the new building.

The building is all but complete apart from the gardens at the rear of the building and this will be work in progress over the next few months.

In 1997 at the ALGA Congress Cr Patrick Hill (President Shire of Laverton-WA) initiated an Alliance of Councils - including Winton Shire, Boulia Shire, Alice Springs Town Council, Shire of Ngaanyatjarraku, Shire of Laverton- to create the Outback Highway Development Council Inc.

The Purpose of this Alliance is to cause the sealing of the Outback Way, for the good of the nation.

The 2700km Outback Way -connecting Perth to Cairns- from Laverton WA through to Winton Qld- creating a corridor that through the heart of Australia. This project will be completed by 2027/28

"The idea is now a reality- 25 years on and we marked the Anniversary at the 2022 ALGA Congress with a presentation at the ALGA congress and cutting the cake with Linda Scott-President ALGA" Chair of the OHDC Inc and President of the Shire of Laverton Cr Patrick Hill said.

The OHDC Inc has secured \$1.2billion - a combination of funding from the Federal Government (80%) and from WA, NT & Qld, each contributing 20% along with planning and works programming. The ongoing support by the Qld, NT & WA governments is acknowledged and deeply appreciated, by the OHDC Inc.



"As Prime Minister, Anthony Albanese said about growing up in a housing commission home with his mum on a pension he is 'thankful for the opportunity that he was given'. The sealing of this network will give the people living in isolated and remote Australia from Winton Qld, Alice Springs NT to Laverton WA through the heart of Australia new opportunities that might enable someone, somewhere along this corridor to become the Prime Minister one day" said Mayor Rick Britton, Boulia Shire.

Since 1996- the OHDC Inc's Purpose and Values have enabled this collaboration to endure and progress through- 32 Federal, State & NT elections (combined), 43 Transport/Infrastructure Minister(Federal, Qld, NT, WA)

The OHDC Inc will now embark on the sustainable development plan for the corridor. We will start with the communities' capacity and their initiatives, overlaying services needed, local recycled content for the seal, and the Mining, Freight, Agriculture & Tourism industry needs and investment plans.

Regional airfare zone cap



ABOUT THE REGIONAL AIRFARE ZONE CAP

The Regional Airfare Zone Cap is a partnership between the State Government and the airline industry. It allows WA regional residents access to capped airfares for personal travel on eligible routes to and from Perth, subject to seat availability. The State Government has committed funding of up to \$19.8 million over three years to 2025 to five airlines operating on eligible regional air routes.

ELIGIBILITY

Zone Cap fares are **only for regional residents of WA**, living outside of the Perth and Peel regions. Zone Cap fares must be booked as a return fare that departs and returns to the same regional destination.







Plans for community consultation, future training, projects and additional employment focus are in the pipeline as we head into 2023. More information via biancac@wf.org.au






















Community child health nurses support all families with young children:

We provide a range of important free services to support families to raise happy, healthy children. We offer health and development assessments and screening, immunisation advice and support to families with young children.

All families in Western Australia are offered:

- > five Purple Book appointments with their community child health nurse
- > a School Entry Health Assessment when their child starts school
- > phone based consultation
- > group sessions on different health topics
- > extra help (advice, appointments or group sessions) if they need it.

The Purple Book health checks are at

- > 0-14 days
- > 8 weeks
- > 4 months
- > 12 months
- > 2 years
- > starting school (usually kindergarten).

It's important that you see the community child health nurse at these key ages to check your child's health and development.

How can I make a Purple Book appointment?



If you've just had your baby, a community child health nurse will contact you to arrange your first appointment.

This appointment will probably be at your home before your baby is 14 days old.

The nurse will also book in your 8 week appointment during this visit.

Perth metropolitan area

If you live in the Perth metropolitan area and your child is due for a Purple Book health check, you can make an appointment up to 8 weeks in advance. Simply call 1300 749 869 or register for an appointment.

Regional WA

If you live in country WA you can make and reschedule appointments by calling your local child or community health centre.

If you had your baby in Perth and plan to stay for a few days after you leave hospital, please contact our visiting community child health nurse service on 0406 463 506 to make your 0-14 days appointment, or check that the hospital has made it on your behalf.
