Snakebite advice







FLYING DOCTOR ISSUES NEW SNAKEBITE ADVICE

05 Oct 2017

Our South Eastern Section has updated its advice and procedures following the publication of a new snakebite study. The Australian Snakebite Project is the most comprehensive ever carried out, involved over 1500 patients and collated snakebite data from the past 10 years (2005-15).

"The publication of this study is very timely as the warm, dry winter and sudden rise in temperatures has brought snakes out early this year," said Tracey King, Senior Flight Nurse at the RFDS South Eastern Section, who has attended snakebites during her career.

"As venomous snakes are found in every state and territory we urge everyone, not just those in the warmer Outback locations, to be vigilant."

"There are around 3,000 reported snakebites each year in Australia, resulting in 500 hospital admissions and an average of two fatalities."

The Australian Snakebite Project threw up some surprising statistics, which challenges many long-held perceptions about where snake attacks occur and how to treat them.

In those attacks in which the snake was positively identified, the brown snake was the most common biter (41%), followed by the tiger snake (17%) and red-bellied black snake (16%).

There-quarters of the people bitten are males aged in their 30's. Most snake attacks occur near houses, not in the bush. Half of all bites occurred while people were out walking, with gardening and trying to catch a snake the most common other scenarios.

While only 20-25 out of 835 cases they studied resulted in death, the effects of a snakebite can be debilitating and farreaching. Three-quarters of those bitten experienced venom-induced consumption coagulopathy, which causes blood clotting and life-threatening haemorrhages. Acute kidney injuries, brain and muscle damage and cardiac arrest are other possible side effects.

"That's why it's important that people act quickly after a possible bite," said Tracey.

"Surprisingly, they're often painless and may go unnoticed as tissue damage is mostly light – lacerations, scratches or light bruising along with some bleeding or swelling. As over 90% of snakebites we found to occur on the upper and lower limbs, these are the places to check first."

"Common symptoms include an unexplained collapse, vomiting and abdominal pain, bleeding or paralysis."

Many dangerous myths surround the treatment of snakebites. The most important dos and don'ts include.

- Do NOT wash the area of the bite or try to suck out the venom. It is extremely important to retain traces of venom for
 use with venom identification kits.
- Do NOT incise or cut the bite, or apply a high tourniquet. Cutting or incising the bite won't help. High tourniquets are ineffective and can be fatal if released.
- DO bandage firmly, splint and immobilise to stop the spread of venom. All the major medical associations recommend
 slowing the spread of venom by placing a folded pad over the bite area and then applying a firm bandage. It should
 not stop blood flow to the limb or congest the veins. Only remove the bandage in a medical facility, as the release of
 pressure will cause a rapid flow of venom through the bloodstream.
- Do NOT allow the victim to walk or move their limbs. Use a splint or sling to minimise all limb movement. Put the
 patient on a stretcher or bring transportation to the patient.
- D0 seek medical help immediately as the venom can cause severe damage to health or even death within a few hours.

The new study has prompted the RFDS SE to reverse previous long-standing advice about the importance of identifying the colour and type of snake.

"Staying in the area after an attack can be dangerous and recent advances in medication mean we can now treat any snakebite with a generic polyvalent anti-venom, so identification is no longer necessary.

Animals in Western Australia


Western Australia alone is home to around 141 different species. 25 of these mammals are
native to W/A only. Some of these are becoming threatened, and are even close to extinction.
In this months edition of the Sturt Pea I am going to talk about some of the animals that also
call Laverton their home!

Camel

- Western Australia alone is home to 45% of Australia's Feral Camels.
- Camels can travel up to 70 kilometres a day, and can survive up to 1 week without little food or water.
- If a camel is thirsty, it can drink up to 200 litres of water in 3 minutes, but in saying that Camels are able to go without water for long periods of time.
- In the Australia desert, Camels out number Kangaroos by 100:1 ratio
- Sometimes camels may foam at the mouth, this is either the cause of hunger, mating season or if they are unsettled.

Echidna

- Short Beaked Echidnas have been around for over 15 million years, according to the earliest fossils found.
- The T. A. Acanthion subspecies of Echidna is commonly found in Western Australia, especially in dirt areas and forests where it is able to dig.
- Short Beaked echidnas have sharp spikes, and tend to move very slowly. It is said they dig around the length of an Olympic pool a year.

- The Red Kangaroo is one of the largest Kangaroos to exist, weighing up to 90kg and can jump as far as 7 m in one single hop.
- Kangaroos are the only animal who use hopping as their main source of movement, while they can hop as fast as 48 km/h

Lizards

- There are more than 400 reptile species in Australia, 40% of which are native to W/A
- Some of the most common lizards include, the Thorny Devil, Skink, Monitor Lizard and the Gecko - all of which can be found in the bush areas around Western Australia.
- The Thorny Devil is covered in sharp hard thorns, these of which are able to change colour to suit the environment - they also help the lizards to drink as water will run down their back and directly into their mouths via the horns.
- There are over 20 different species of monitor lizard (Goannas) most of these, not native to WA but you can however still find some of them here - e.g The Perentie which is one of the largest lizards in Australia. The Perentie lizard can grow to up to two metres long and is very shy, they also hibernate during the colder months of the year - May to August.



Random Places To See Around Laverton EURO MINE

The Euro Mine is situated around 15km south of Laverton, just off Mt Weld Rd. When travelling along Mt Weld Rd you take a turn off on the side of the road (which can be easy to miss), and then drive up a hill to where the old mine site once stood. Upon arrival you will be greeted by an old little storage building to the right and little hill on the left. Do make note that there are a lot of open mine shafts all around this area so do take care when you are walking around the area.






If you walk up the hill on the left you will be greeted by an amazing view of the area and will see scattered throughout the gumtrees and shrubs remanence of the old site. On top of this hill you will also see some stone structures of where buildings once stood and you will also see the oddly coloured mound of sand like clay that almost looks like the top of a volcano.

From here you can continue down the other side of the hill where you will stubble across three big open mine shafts. These shafts are not fenced off, there are a few stakes in the ground marking out where they are, so just take care when walking towards them.





Once you have seen the mine shafts you can then walk around to the front of the hill where the environment around you changes to a sandy like clay with green bushes and gum trees. Throughout this area you will find many of artefact's scattered throughout the bush. Along this side of the hill you will also see a long stone wall that was built to load the dirt onto the back of carts/trucks. Follow this wall and this will lead you back to the road where you would have parked.

There are also many shafts and little stone structures around this whole area which shows how busy this site once was.






So how did the Euro mine come about? Firstly the name Euro was named after a

local species of Kangaroo. Gold was first discovered by Newman and party back in 1895. Soon after W.A. Goldfields Ltd, sank a few trial shafts but found little gold, and the site was quickly abandoned in 1897.

A short time after the mine was abandoned some prospectors arrived to the site and because of the rain they were unable to dry blow, so they decided to sink a shaft instead just north of the prior location and they struck gold. Only few months after their



gold discovery Geo. W. Hall (of Sons of Gwalia fame) the managing director of the London and Westralian Mines and Finance Agency Ltd inspected the property and was so impressed with its prospect he immediately took a three month option over it for several thousand pounds, which option he concluded shortly afterwards by paying the prospectors their money two months before it was really due.



Within nine weeks after the deposit to the prospectors had been paid, a 20-head battery was ordered from England, with the first portion of it being shipped in 1899. By 1903 the site was closed by the directors as the values decreased and the 40 stamp battery that was built was sold to Bewick, Moreing and Co and transferred to the Lancefield mine.

In 1904, the mine was taken up by a syndicate of working miners and carted several good crushing's through to the Laverton state battery. From 1898 to 1911 the mine produced 35,707 ounces of gold

Over the years a few other mining companies have explored the area.

By 1902 the site had a hotel, a bank, 2 shops, a bakery and a cordial factory.

So how do you get there? Easiest option is to type into google maps the following coordinates :

Prawn tacos with lime-avocado salsa

Ingredients

- 1 just-ripe avocado, stoned, peeled, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup finely chopped coriander
- 1 red Birdseye chilli (optional), seeded, finely chopped
- 2 1/2 tablespoon lime juice
- 1kg Raw Deli Prawns Thawed, peeled leaving tails intact, deveined
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 tablespoon Mexican seasoning
- 12 small flour tortillas
- 1/2 cup (150g) mayonnaise
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 1/4 red cabbage, finely shredded
- 1 carrot, peeled, cut into matchsticks
- 2 radishes, thinly sliced



Method

- 1) Combine the avocado, coriander, chilli, if using, and 1 1/2 tablespoons of the lime juice in a bowl. Season. Set aside for 10 mins to develop the flavours.
- 2) Combine the prawns, oil and Mexican seasoning in a medium bowl. Heat a large frying pan over high heat. Cook the prawns, turning, for 5 mins or until prawns change colour and curl.
- 3) Meanwhile, heat the tortillas following packet directions.
- 4) Combine mayonnaise, paprika and remaining lime juice in a bowl. Season.
- 5) Divide tortillas among serving plates. Divide cabbage, carrot, radish and lime-avocado salsa among the tortillas. Top with the prawns. Drizzle with the mayonnaise mixture. Fold to enclose the filling. Serve immediately.

Perfect Chocolate Chip Cookies

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 2 cups plus 2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 12 Tbsp. butter (1 1/2 sticks) melted and cooled until warm
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg + 1 egg yolk
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cups semi-sweet or milk chocolate chips



Method

- 1) Heat oven to 325 degrees F.
- 2) In a medium bowl mix together flour, salt, and baking soda.
- In a separate large mixing bowl beat the butter and sugars together with an electric mixer until well blended. Add the egg, egg yolk, and vanilla. Stir in the dry ingredients and mix until just combined. Gently stir in the chocolate chips. The dough will be soft.
- 4) Gently scoop dough into balls and place on a cookie sheet. Bake for 10-12 minutes. Store in an airtight container.
