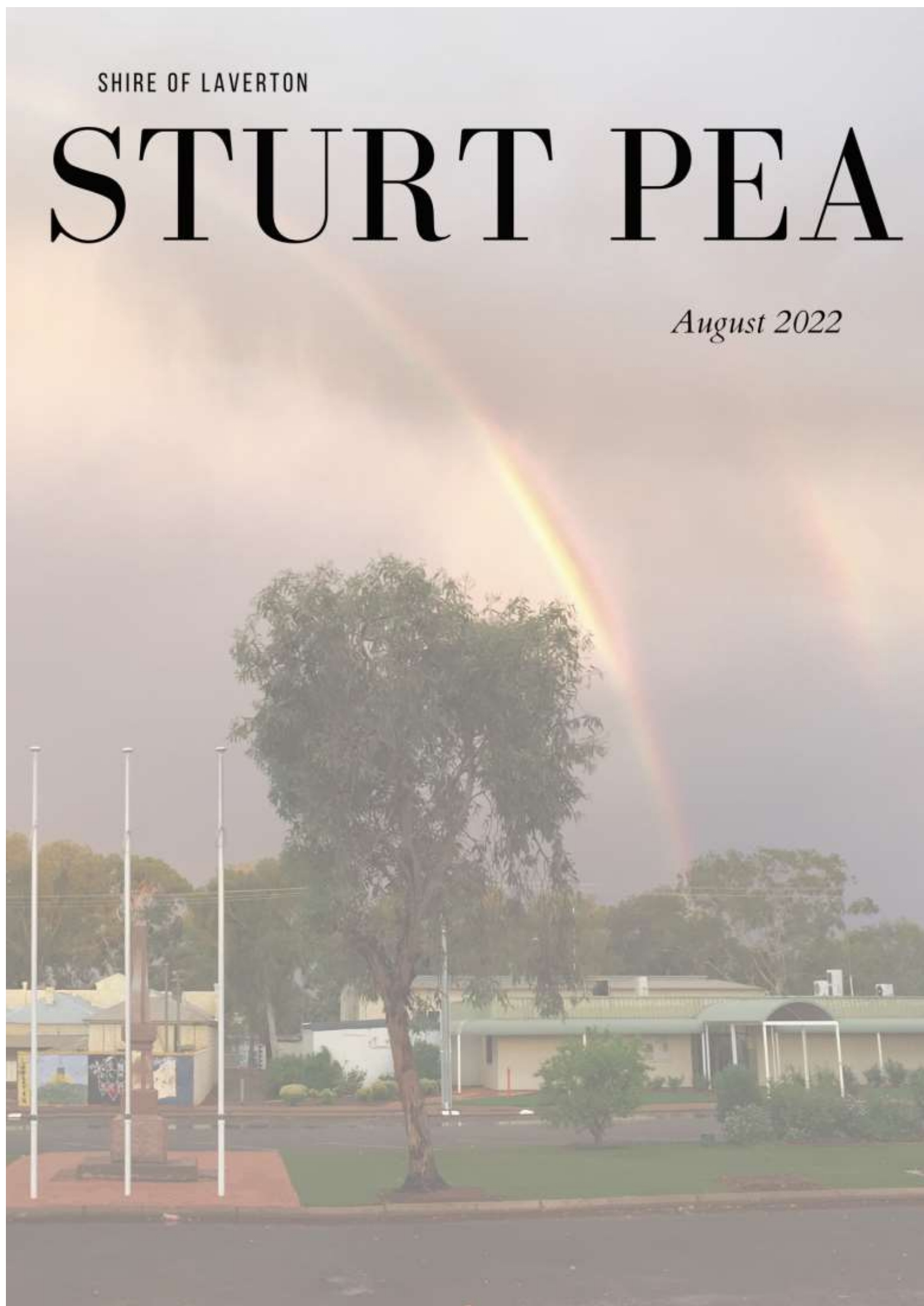

Shire Bulletin August 2022

To all community members

Welcome to the Shire of Laverton second bulletin where we will endeavour to keep you informed of what is occurring within the Shire of Laverton.

Budget 2022/2023

The Council adopted its budget on the 21st of July 2022 and the following key projects will be undertaken in the financial year ending the 30th of June 2023.

- Design and construct new Airport terminal – the design will be specified to reflect Laverton
- Design and construct new works depot
- Upgrade the existing old education building across from the school to install a new roof, reclad the building and replace all windows etc.
- Townsite beautification with an allocation of \$387,178 and the council is seeking nominations for the focus group to have input into the designs for the town.

Roads

The following roads will be worked on this year.

- Bandya Rd
- Old Laverton Rd
- Racecourse Rd
- Sturt Pea drive
- Cox Street
- Crawford street
- Re seal of Various town streets and installation of footpaths
- Merolia Rd, etc
- Purchase of a new Motor Grader
- Rationalisation of council's fleet to reflect operational requirements

Please do not hesitate to contact any councillor or the administration office should you have any questions about the budget.

Rates

The rates have increased this year due to the ever-rising costs of doing business. The Council is always mindful of increasing rates and the community in which we serve.

The mining rates have increased by 9% and with most mining companies paying by the due date, a discount of 5% applies, therefore, the real rate increase is 4%.

The minimum rates in the town have risen from \$315 to \$335 after been kept at the \$315 over the last 3 years.

The rubbish collection service remains at \$238 per pick up and if anyone has any questions regarding the collection service, please contact the administration office.

Financial Position

The Council is in a strong position financially after 4 years challenging work has reserves to cover any liability which may present itself into the future.

The Council believes in the future of the Shire and will keep on reflecting on projects where the community can grow and develop.

Mining

Cashless Debit Card

The cashless debit card will remain in place until the 31st of December 2022 and that no new people can be added to the card from the 01st August 2022. Therefore, the Councils staff will be retained to the 31st of December 2022, and we will be working with our staff to retaining them in other areas of the Councils operations.

The Council is rightly concerned about the issues which may arise and the ability of government agencies to do their part and meet their obligations to the Laverton community with the withdrawal of the cashless debit card. A meeting will be held in Leonora for the council to present its case against the withdrawal on the 16th of August 2022. In saying this, the Government has already passed the legislation and the Council will keep on putting its views forward.

The Council would appreciate any input or comments into the withdrawal of the cashless debit card from interested community members.

Focus Groups

The Council wishes to hear from interested community members to sit on these focus groups and provide input into how the facility and council will look into the future.

Whether you have experience or not, it does not matter as input from everyone would be appreciated and once the plans have been developed, they will be issues in future editions of the Sturt Pea for comment.

The focus groups follow where nominations are sought from interested community members:

- Airport Development
- Racecourse Development
- Townscape Development

Great Beyond

The Council has presented an official opening date to the Ministers office (to coincide with the Laverton Races) and the council will send out a confirmed date as soon as confirmation is received.

The Council will need to make small price increases across the board for all services within the Great Beyond. This reflects every increasing cost of business.

Old Police Station

The renovation works on the old police station are continuing and an official opening notice will be provided for the community as soon as known.

NAIDOC

Just a reminder that the Great Beyond has established a display to celebrate NAIDOC Week and everyone is welcome to view at the Great beyond.

Just to add, a thank you to everyone involved in the NAIDOC week celebrations in Laverton.

Airport

The Council is currently working with the successful tenderer to finalise the contract to undertake the following works:

Reseal of the runway, apron and taxiways including the reinstatement of line marking. This includes the building of nodes on the runway.

The works will be undertaken to lessen the impact upon the operations of the airport and the council will keep you updated in further bulletins.

Works

The Cox Street extension is still closed, and the Council will keep the community informed of when this area will be reopened.

The works Crew is working on Bandya Rd with the extension of the gravel re-sheeting program.

The Great Beyond, not just for letting us use their beautiful new venue but also making delicious coffees and teas for everyone all night and helping out wherever it was needed.

Anglogold Ashanti + Lcca who sponsored all of the food and presents for the seniors, for the Youth team and Pakaanu Aboriginal Corporation for transporting our elders safely to and from the event and of course the attendees themselves!

Personally I want to thank every single person involved as without you this amazing night would not have been possible. You all made one of the CRC's first events this year worth every single second. We are very lucky to be surrounded by such an amazing community who all came together during this special week! Thank you!



The WACHS-Goldfields Public Health Team travel to the Northern Goldfields every year to deliver the Goldfields Regional Trachoma Program. This is done in collaboration with the Education Department and Community Health Services. The Goldfields Regional Trachoma Screening Program 2022 is planned for:

Tuesday 23 August to Thursday 25 August 2022

Trachoma is an eye infection, which can lead to blindness if left untreated. Direct contact with others, conveyance on fingers and sharing towels all spread trachoma. Ensuring children wash their face whenever the face is dirty can help prevent spread of this infection. Checking for trachoma is a simple and painless procedure where the upper eyelids are looked at while standing outside in the sunlight.

Treatment is with one dose of free antibiotics called Azithromycin. If a child has trachoma, we ask all recent household contacts to be treated. If trachoma is detected in a high number of children, the whole community may need to be treated.

The children aged 5-9 will be offered screening in school or in the community.

The Trachoma team lead for the Northern Goldfields is Robin Kamerman. The team will also include additional expert screeners, community health staff, medical students, health promotion officers and environmental health. The proposed itinerary for the trachoma screening is below. This may change due to weather or circumstances out of our control.

- **Sheriff/CDO** – For queries on fines and make arrangements for time-to-pay.
- **Department of Transport** – Apply for a driver's licence, WA Photo (ID) card, driving assessments, licence status queries and other information about licensing services.
Theory Test: \$20.40 Learner's Permit: \$126.10, Log Book: \$10.00, WA Photo (ID) Card: \$46.80
- **Services Australia - Centrelink** – Identification requirements for licensing only.
- **Community Services: Waalitj Foundation**

- Birth Certificate
- Medicare Card
- Centrelink Card
- Bank Card
- Bank statement or official letter/bill from a Government agency or employer that has your address and is no more than 6 months old
- Either cash or credit card/debit card for payment

ELIGIBLE CONTAINERS

The scheme targets drink containers most commonly seen as litter. Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible for a refund.



INELIGIBLE CONTAINERS

Generally, ineligible containers are those that are less than 150ml and greater than 3L. Other ineligible containers include all plain milk bottles, wine bottles, spirit bottles, cordial and registered health tonics. Pure juice containers 1L or greater (or less than 150ml) are also ineligible.

















