Laverton Community Trachoma Program Report - 2022

WA Country Health Service - Goldfields

Trachoma is a contagious eye infection caused by the bacterium *Chlamydia trachomatis*. Repeated infections in childhood can lead to scarring and changes in the eyelid, which in turn can result in blindness. When found early, trachoma can be easily treated with a single dose of the antibiotic azithromycin. Given that Australia is the only developed country with trachoma, eliminating blinding trachoma nationwide is a public health priority.

The aim of the WACHS-Goldfields Population Health Trachoma Program is to eliminate blinding trachoma. The Goldfields program is part of a larger state-wide trachoma control program that follows the CDNA Guidelines for the Public Health Management of Trachoma in Australia and is overseen by the WA Trachoma Reference Group.

2022 ACTIVITIES

Community Consultation

Earlier in the year, WACHS-Goldfields Population Health discussed the trachoma program with the Laverton District High School and Community Health Service. It was determined that health promotion activities and trachoma screening could take place.

Health Promotion

During health promotion, the importance of Blow, Breathe, Cough and Milpa's Six Steps including facial cleanliness, daily showering and not sharing towels was discussed with the children. Sessions implemented interactive hands-on activities in the younger age groups. Individual hygiene packs were provided for students.

Trachoma Screening

Trachoma screening was held at Laverton District High School on 24 August 2022. All children in the Laverton community from 5-9 years who were present in the community were offered screening. WACHS-Goldfields Population Health is only required to report on Aboriginal children aged 5-9 years, and the 5-9 years age group is used to determine the treatment strategies required.

We also checked for clean faces during the trachoma screening. A clean face is important to clear trachoma and stop the spread.

2022 RESULTS

Trachoma Screening

A total of 12 children were screened in the 5-9 years old age group. 92% of children aged 5-9 years were screened. Table 1 shows the number of children screened for trachoma and the number of trachoma cases found in the Laverton community over the past four years.

At the end of August, five teenage boys from the Laverton School took part in an extension of the monthly bike program run by the Cycling Development Foundation. The boys, namely Meschach, Xavier, Zainen, Tremaine, and Marcellus, travelled to Perth with Bunz and Loz from the youth centre for four full days of learning, bike riding and even taking part in a bike race on gravel roads.

This pilot program – as part of the Laverton Cycling Project - provided an opportunity for the boys to learn about life-goal settings, financial advise for young aboriginal youths, nutrition for athletes and while living in remote areas, and recognising opportunities in life in general.

In addition, the boys took part in a high-performance training session and raced an individual off-road time trial in Jarrahdale. We are stoked to say that these boys were not only the first ever aboriginal boys to race in an official bike race here in WA as far as we are aware, but they also showed some incredible perseverance to finish the race well. Every one of them made it into the final standings, and we could not have been prouder of these boys.

The project was aiming to provide a full weekend of learning opportunities that are an important step in the journey of becoming role models to other youths in their community. We are committed to try and provide support to these teenagers to be able to make lifechoices to their advantage and that are healthy, prosperous and enable them to grow.

The Cycling Development Foundation is now aiming to expand on this success to repeat development weekends of this kind more frequently and with a wide range of youths.




