

#### **OUTBACK WAY FUNDING- NATIONAL BIPARTISAN PROJECT CONFIRMED**

The Outback Highway Development Council Inc (OHDC Inc) members- are elated that in the budget tonight, the Albanese Government has honoured the \$678Million allocated to the Outback Way project in the March budget, by the previous government. The Outback Way project- 2700km – Australia's Longest Shortcut through the heart of the nation.

"The completion of the sealing of the Outback Way will deliver tangible outcomes for the national economy, budget, and the people of Australia for years to come," said Ngaanyatjarraku Shire President Damian McLean.

"The sealing of the Outback Way will create a massive boost to our local economy and be the catalyst for growth in Winton & Outback Australia. support this. A third sealed highway across Australia will be the most significant project in living memory for Outback Australia and will truly be Nation Building', said Mayor Baskett.

"The Outback Way is vital to Alice Springs, the communities along the route, and Australia as a whole. As Australia's longest shortcut, the positive impact the Outback Way has on tourism, mining, the cattle industry and a host of other support industries are far reaching. It is fantastic to see the Federal Government commit this funding to the Outback Way Corridor-one of national importance. #### MEDIA BUDGET BRIEFING

The OHDC Inc welcomes the budget funding commitment in the Governments budget on 25th October 2022. The OHDC Inc is an alliance of Local Government- ensuring the sealing of the Outback Way for the good of the Nation, since 1997. The Alliance members are The Shire of Laverton, Ngaanyatjarraku, Alice Springs, Boulia and Winton.

The progress to date across the Outback Way has been exceptional with only 1200km to seal of 2700km. The \$678million confirmed in tonight's Budget and with the contributions from Qld, NT & WA, will seal the remaining 1200km.

The Outback Way project provides an extraordinary opportunity for the Federal government to implement their core policies. What the Outback Way will unlock for Australia and Australians, is 100% aligned with the Government's policies, economic plan and budget strategy.


The Outback Way project delivers on all the priorities for new spending ...

- Creates jobs and boost participation.
  - The Outback Way Investment enhances the Skills and Training with the existing training of local indigenous people in roadbuilding/ plant & equipment with the existing MRWA- Wongutha Way Alliance. Once the Outback Way is sealed, there will be various mines needing these skills. Local indigenous people will have a job for life within their region, close to family and country. The Outback Way project is enabling and MRWA to create partnerships with mining ventures to secure the projects workforce so the project can be completed efficiently.
  - Tourism services training at the National Indigenous Training Academy at Yulara. Economic
    Development in Australia's most regional and remote towns and First Nation communities- building
    our regions across Australia.
- Generate new business investment- with the planned new infrastructure- new business development has already started.
  - Oz Minerals: \$1.7 billion copper-nickel mine West Musgrave project-WA, to support the booming electric vehicle industry this mine, will create 1500 jobs during construction and around 400 during ongoing operations. Operational 2025- a sealed Outback Way will increase efficiencies.

'The Outback Highway (Great Central Road) is an important link to a remote but highly prospective new minerals province in Western Australia. OZ Minerals is aiming to establish its West Musgrave Project in this province as a scalable, low cost, long life, open pit copper and nickel mine. This project will start and be operational in 2025. The Outback Highway provides a connection to export infrastructure in Western Australia, and into the Northern Territory and South Australia. Sealing of the Outback Highway could conceivably improve safety for the local community and tourists, and may help significantly reduce travel time.'

- KGL: Copper Mine at Jervois on the Plenty Highway(NT) It is estimated KGL will be trucking up to 150,000 tonnes of concentrate per year and very importantly, assisting in keeping the absolutely essential copper refinery at Mt Isa going.

Currently the ABS CPI standard National 'Basket of Goods' sits a 133% higher than the national average, in the remote community of Warburton, WA. A sealed Outback Way will enable more suppliers to service remote isolated communities – offering more choice and more competition, reducing prices.

A sealed Outback Way -really assists with Closing the Gap for First Nation's people – as health and education providers stay longer, build trust and really improve outcomes in communities, because they can leave 24/7. (if service provider can leave a place (regardless of the weather, they will stay)

Drive productivity growth and Expand the Capacity of the Economy to alleviate supply side pressures;
With a sealed Outback Way- it will enable-

- Mining
  - The Outback Way infrastructure enables access to critical minerals for the green economy- battery's, technology etc, with easier cheaper access due to reduced freight times will help alleviate supply side pressures by enhancing the capacity of the economy







# When the CDC ends

You can contact us to come off the program now.

To end it now, you can either:

- · use your Centrelink online account through myGov
- call the CDC hotline on 1800 252 604
- visit a Services Australia Service Centre.

We suggest you make an appointment with a Services Australia Service Centre before you go.

# I am on the CDC, what happens when it ends?

You can either:

- have your payments go to your personal bank account and manage your own money
- volunteer to continue to have your payments income managed.

If you choose to volunteer for the CDC program, you retain your card and move to enhanced Income Management on 6 March 2023. If you choose to manage your payments and end your CDC participation, two things will happen:

- all of your payments will go into the bank account which we have for you
- your CDC account will close within 14 days.

You need to arrange to pay your ongoing financial commitments another way. These include:

- bills and direct debits
- scheduled payments or regular deductions

# How long before I need to change my deductions

You have 14 days, which is when your CDC account closes.

You need to move your regular payments from your CDC account as soon as possible after you contact us to ask to come off the program.

# What do I do if I have scheduled Buy Now Pay Later payments like Afterpay and Zip Pay

You need to:

- change the payment instruction to your personal bank account before your CDC participation ends
- reschedule these payments soon to avoid missing any payments or incurring late fees.

Be aware that Buy Now Pay Later providers have different terms and conditions. You may be charged fees if your payments are not paid.

Contact your provider directly to discuss any future deductions or log into your Buy Now Pay Later online services.

# What happens to Centrepay and rent deductions

These will continue as normal.

You do not need to do anything if you have Centrepay or Rent Deduction Scheme deductions set up.

# What happens to any unspent funds in my CDC account

The card provider returns any unspent funds to your personal bank account as a lump sum.

# How do I know that my participation has ended

Services Australia will send a letter advising that you are no longer on the program.

Services Australia will deliver letters based on your preferred method – either post, online or myGov. Services Australia sends letters depending on when the CDC is ending in your location.

# I am on the CDC what do I need to do

You need to decide if you want to either:

- have your payments go to your personal bank account and manage your money, or
- volunteer to continue to have your payments income managed.

Contact Services Australia to tell them what you want to do.

You can do this by any of the following:

- · log into your Centrelink online account on myGov
- call the CDC hotline on 1800 252 604
- · visit your local Services Australia Service Centre.

# Where I can get support

There is a range of support services available to you as you come off the CDC.

You continue to get the same support services as a part of the CDC program.

# What happens if I do not want someone in my household to stop CDC

## Background

In recent years the Goldfields has experienced an alarming rate of suicide that has left long standing impacts across communities. HOPE, in partnership with the Shires of Laverton, Leonora and Coolgardie, and the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, have implemented a collective impact approach to addressing depression and suicide. The project aims to achieve a coordinated approach to enhancing activities aimed at increasing the diagnosis and treatment of mental health issues and reducing the incidence of suicide.

# Laverton Water Supply Improvements

Water Corporation is commencing work to upgrade water infrastructure in Laverton. The work will improve the quality and reliability of water for the Laverton Town Water Supply. The work will provide a solution while planning is underway to develop long-term source and treatment solutions.



# What is happening?

Water Corporation authorised contractor WestWater will soon begin works to install a new 500kL/day reverse osmosis unit at the Laverton Water Treatment Plant near Laverton – Leonora Road.

All works will be contained within the boundaries of Water Corporation property at the water treatment plant.



## When is this work happening?

Work will take place from mid October 2022, Completion is anticipated by the end of the year.

Work will be completed Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm and Saturdays, as required.



# What impact will this work have?

You should not experience any impacts from the works.

We will contact you directly if there are planned interruptions to your water supply during the delivery of this project.

# Laverton Water Supply FAQs



### Where does our water come from?

Laverton's water supply is reliant on groundwater sourced from a bore at Beasley Creek and the Wedge Pit borefield.

# Why is this work taking place?

Lower rainfall since 2019 has reduced groundwater recharge. This has decreased reliability and reduced capacity from the existing sources.

Due the underlying rock conditions, groundwater sourced from this area may be affected by salinity, hardness and naturally occurring minerals. The new reverse osmosis treatment will improve water quality by reducing salinity, minerals and hardness.

# What happens in the reverse osmosis process?

- Untreated groundwater is pumped to the water treatment plant and passes through a series of filters to remove most of the particles from the water.
- The filtered groundwater is then forced under pressure through special membranes whereby the osmosis process that normally occurs in nature is reversed. The pores in the membranes are so tiny that salt, bacteria, viruses and other impurities are separated from the groundwater. In essence they act like microscopic strainers.
- Treated water then enters the water supply network.

# What else is being done?

Planning is underway to develop long-term source and treatment solutions.

We have been working with the Shire of Laverton and key customers to identify opportunities to reduce demand. Reducing demand will ensure we can continue to deliver drinking water that is compliant with water quality requirements to the community and improve the reliability water supply.

Alternative water source options that may be suitable for non-potable water use are being investigated. This could assist to reduce demand and reliance on the Laverton water supply.
