COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2023

The next council election will be held on Saturday the 21st of October 2023.

The election will be conducted by the council and will be an in-person election with a preferential voting system. The Chief Executive Officer is the returning officer for the election.

The following is the timeline leading into the election to be held on the 21st of October 2023.

A lot of the matters referred to in the table are governance and technical; however, the key dates have been highlighted in Yellow including date for nominations, closing date for nominations and the preparation of the resident's roll.

The following information is provided for nominations and each month in the Sturt Pea and other media outlets, further and relevant information will be put forward for anyone interested in nominating for the council.

Of importance is that all people considering nominating, are required to undertake mandatory online training as outlined below.

The current link status is as follows.

The induction is being updated in response to the reforms to the Local Government Act 1995. The new induction for prospective candidates will be available 30 June 2023. I have had no advice on this aspect at the time of writing the information for the Sturt Pea.

Mandatory induction prior to nomination

You must complete an online induction course before you submit your nomination. The course provides information on the role and responsibilities of being a council member, and the rules related to election campaigns. When you register your completion of the course, you will receive a confirmation email with a reference number and date of completion. You must include the reference number and completion date on your nomination form. The department strongly recommends that you show a digital or print copy of the confirmation email to the returning officer when you submit your nomination.

Are you eligible to nominate for council?

To stand for election as a councillor, or a mayor or president elected by the people of a local government district, you must:

- be 18 years of age or older;
- be an elector of the district (if you are only an elector because you are a nominee of a body corporate then you are not eligible to stand for council);
- (if a current council member) have a term that ends on election day, unless you are standing for mayor or president directly elected by the public;
- Have completed the mandatory induction course available on the DLGSC website.

You are not eligible to nominate for council if you:

- are a member of State or Federal Parliament;
- are an insolvent under administration;
- are serving a prison sentence for a crime;
- have been convicted of a serious local government offence within the last five years, (unless the court has waived the disqualification);
- have been convicted on indictment of an offence for which the penalty was or included imprisonment for life, or imprisonment for more than five years;
- are a member of another council;
- are subject to a court order disqualifying you from being a council member because you have misapplied local government funds or property;
- are on the local electoral roll as the nominee of a body corporate;
- propose standing for two positions on council (unless you are standing for mayor or president as well as councillor); or
- are currently disqualified by the State Administrative Tribunal from holding office as a member of a council.

If you have any questions on the election itself, or nominating as a councillor, please do not hesitate to ask.

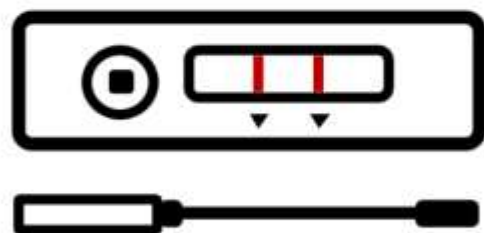

Free mammograms for women in Laverton

BreastScreen WA's **FREE** screening mammogram service is coming to Laverton

from **26/07/2023 - 02/08/2023** and the mobile clinic will be located at:

Laverton Shire Hall Car Park, 9 McPherson Place

Women 40 years and over with no symptoms are eligible for a FREE screening mammogram.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and 1 in 7 women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should contact her doctor immediately.

Dates may be subject to change. If visit dates are not suitable participants are welcome to book at the clinic in a different town or at any of our [permanent clinics](#). For more information please visit BreastScreen WA's website www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au.

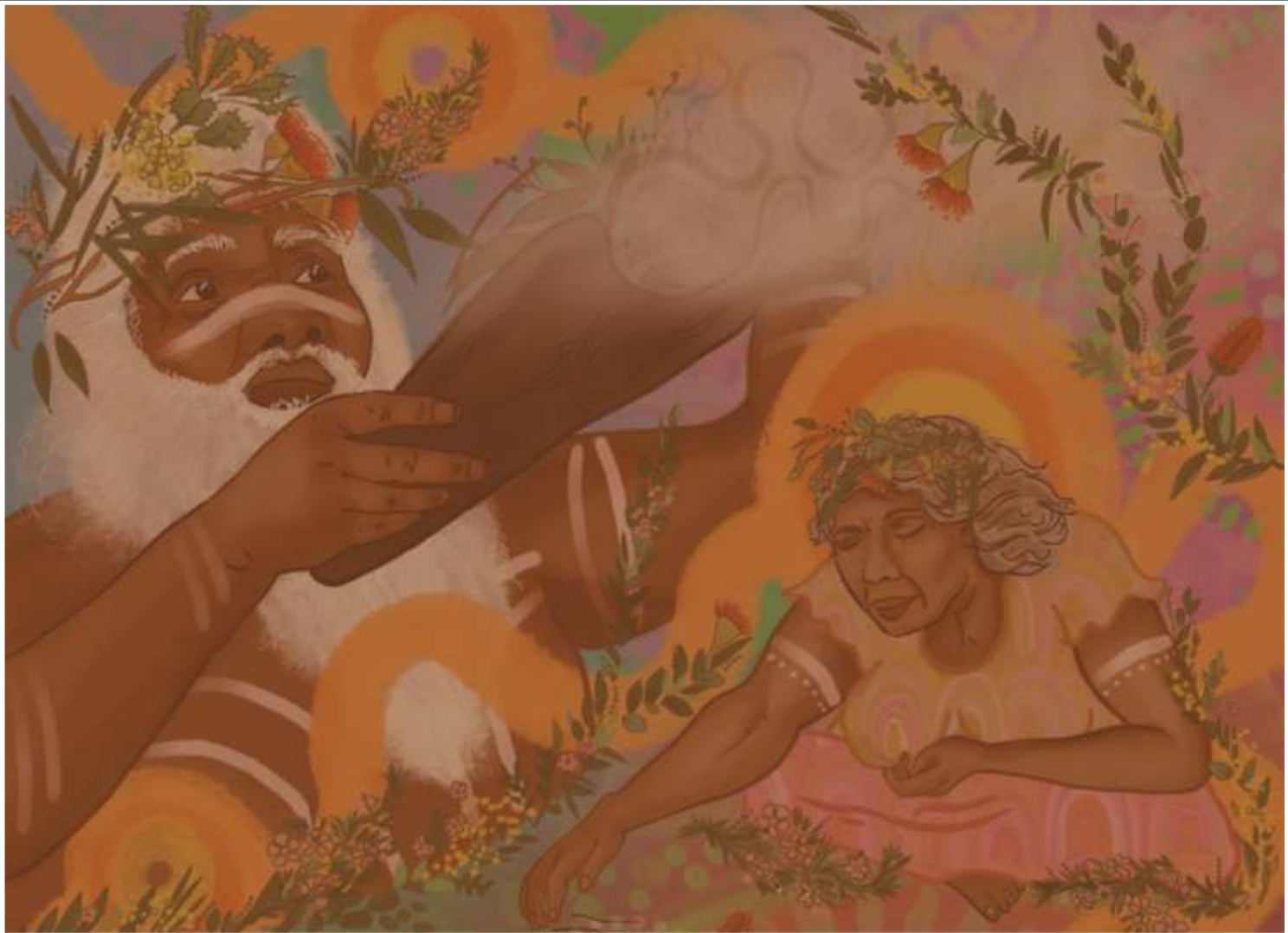



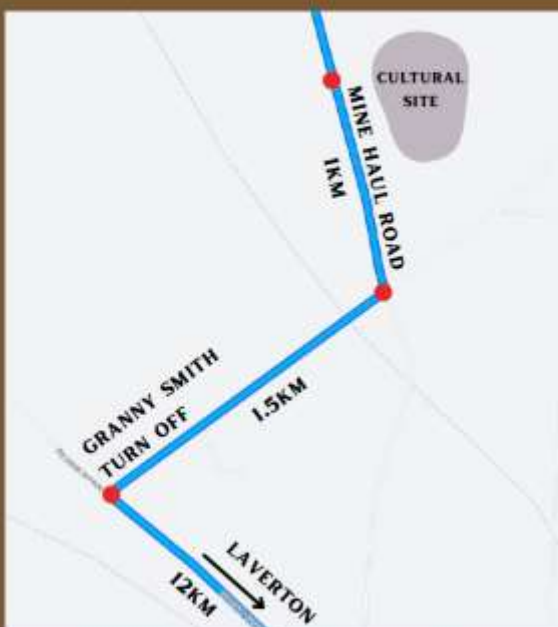

- Artists are permitted to enter up to three pieces. A registration form is to be completed for each piece of artwork.

PROTECTIVE CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS

- Helmet - bicycle, motorbike or race helmet must be worn while racing.
- Drivers need to wear fully enclosed shoes - no thongs or sandals.
- Long pants and long sleeve shirt, gloves, safety glasses, elbow and knee pads are strongly recommended but not compulsory.
