Shire News

The Shire of Laverton would like to raise the following items that may be of interest to community members. For further information, please contact the CEO during office hours.

Lighting Upgrade – Laverton Airport

The Shire of Laverton has been successful in obtaining funding of \$225,000 from the Department of Transport for the upgrading of the lighting at the Airport. Total project cost is \$450,000, of which the Shire will contribute \$225,000.

Great Beyond Visitor Centre Expansion

Final plans and specifications have been reissued for the expansion of the Great Beyond Visitor Centre. The total cost of the project is \$1.5ML Council has resolved to contribute \$500,000 and grant funding of \$1M is being applied for.

Anyone wishing to view the plans can do so by contacting the Chief Executive Officer.

Former Pre-Primary Building

Council has agreed to establish the old Pre-Primary Building as office space for the rollout of the Cashless Debit Card. The Department of Social Services will fund the establishment costs, including computers, other furniture and minor building repairs. The Department will also fund staff costs for the duration of the program introduction, which will be nine to twelve months.

Annual General Meeting of Electors

The Annual General Meeting of Electors for the 2016/2017 financial year will be held at 4pm on Thursday 14 December 2017 in the Council Chambers. Copies of the Annual Report, Auditors Report etc are available from the Shire office and can also be viewed on the Shire of Laverton website.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT FROM CR PATRICK HILL FOR ORDINARY MEETING OF COUNCIL 23 NOVEMBER 2017

26/10/2017 Ordinary Meeting of Council.

30/10/2017 & 31/10/2017

Travelled to Perth via Skippers from Laverton en route to Boulia in Qld to attend a visit and announcement by the Federal Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Darren Chester, Overnight in Perth. Travelled from Perth to Brisbane, where I met up with Helen Lewis, General Manager of the Outback Highway Development Council. We then flew to Mt Isa, From Mt Isa we hired a car and drove the 300km to Boulia. Overnight in Boulia.

1/11/2017

Minister Chester and his advisors flew into Boulla and met with Boulia and Winton Council representatives, Helen Lewis and myself and a number of other guests. The reason for the visit was to announce the allocation of \$125M to the specific projects included in the "Priority Investment Strategy" for the Outback Way. This document was compiled by the Federal Government in consultation with the Outback Highway Development Council to develop a priority list of capital road building projects and costings for sealing. The Investment Strategy will be used to secure future road funding to complete the sealing of the Outback Way by the year 2025.

Minister Chester spoke very highly in support of the development of the Outback Way and expressed the need for the ongoing funding commitment to completion. When Minister Chester was questioned on whether he would support signing a bipartisan agreement to say that no matter who is in government the road funding would continue, he said he would be pleased to and offered assistance in this process. The Minister also indicated that the Priory Investment Strategy could be used secure federal funding allocations in the future for forward estimates.

We all conducted a site visit about 10km west of Boulia on the Outback Way where the Minister made the announcement. I was pleased I was able to attend and witness the event and it was an ideal opportunity for OBHDC members to be able to discuss future proposals on the development of the Outback Way. I would also like to express my thanks to the Mayor of Boulia and Boulia Council for their welcome and hospitality.

A proposed visit to Canberra is planned by the OBHDC in March 2018 where delegates will meet with the "Friends of the Outback Way Parliamentary Committee" to present an ongoing Road Funding Agreement which has been prepared for signing by both of the major political parties for continued funding of the Outback Way out to 2025. The "Friends of the Outback Way Parliamentary Committee" is a bipartisan political committee chaired by Senator Ian MacDonald (QId) and Minister Warren Snowden (NT) in support of development of the Outback Way.

2/11/2017 & 3/11/2017

Helen and I drove back to Mt Isa, then we flew to Brisbane where I then flew on to Perth and overnighted. Helen then drove back to Warwick, Qld. I flew back to Laverton via Skippers, arriving mid-afternoon and attended a Special Meeting of Council.

3/11/2017

Along with Councillors, Staff and Laverton community members, I attended a Main Street BBQ in celebration of the near completion of the Main Street Project. I know the Main Street Project has been a long extended project but the end result speaks for itself as a much improved look for Laverton, which has also had a lot of positive comments received. It was a great opportunity to test our new BBQ trailer and a big thank you to all the Shire staff who took the time to prepare the meal and attend the gathering. It was a great evening and thanks to all involved. It was attended by about 70 people.

15/11/2017

I attended and presented a paper at the "What's Down the Track" forum at the Regional TAFE Convention Centre in Kalgoorlie. Around 150 people attended this event and a lot of very interesting speakers were presenting. My presentation included the mining and economic development going on in the Shire of Laverton at the moment, tourism and projects that the Shire's involved in and also a summary update on the Outback Way. There was also a lot of interest in the current status of the Outback Way in regards to capital works and also an update on the Yilka Native Title determination and the future development program of the Great Central Road.

Projects that I raised and talked about included the completion of the Main Street Project, the current situation with our Community Hub and the lack of government commitment to the upgrade of the Laverton Hospital.



16/11/2017




Laverton Youth Services

The negative effects of smoking are always overlooked due to the fact that they are not immediately visible compared to alcohol and drug users. Tobacco smoke contains more than 7000 chemicals, including tar, nicotine, carbon monoxide, hydrogen cyanide, metals, radioactive compounds and pesticides. At least 70 chemicals are known to cause cancer. Smoking can cause 16 types of cancer, heart diseases, lung diseases, eye diseases, problems in pregnancy, premature wrinkles and low fertility.

Quitting smoking can be challenging. Most people make multiple quit attempts. That's because nicotine is a very addictive drug. But don't give up trying just because you haven't succeeded in the past. Research has shown that smokers on average make 12-14 quit attempts before quitting for good. Think about your past attempts to quit—what worked and what didn't. If one method didn't work, don't hesitate to try another method. You can learn something new every time you try to quit. This time might be a good time for you to quit.

- Identify your reasons to quit Most common reasons are to improve health and avoid diseases; protect family; save money; and regain confidence and control.
- Understand your smoking Nicotine withdrawal, habits and routines, stress, social situations and the

 challenge. Understanding your smoking helps to anticipate cravings and plan for your quit attempt.

Get up everyday determined not to smoke. Reward yourself from the money saved by not smoking. Come up with a list of small gifts that you can give yourself. Make this the year you quit smoking for good. Shed the chains of addiction and take back your life. You are worth it..



On Friday morning the group awakened to a wonderful cooked breakfast. Members of the group took to the bush on a cultural tour, seeing the sights, looking for Bardi. The night time was filled with camp fire stories from Laverton and across the region after another delicious camp oven cook up with excessive amounts of malu wipu and backside, and a roast bullock. No shortage of protein on this trip!



Everyone laughed at a demonstration of language development skills by a couple of the ladies. The nighttime camp fire provided a good opportunity for us to come together to discuss concerns, ideas and all the wonderful things that colour the local social landscape.

Thank you to One Tree and the women for such a wonderful experience and congratulations to One Tree on such a successful and fantastic initiative. Thank you to One Tree staff members Noelene, Rachel and Rhonda for all your hard work. A shared opinion amongst the group is that this will be the first of many cultural trips such as this one. A big thank you to the Laverton Shire for the luxury of porta loos in such a remote location. Thank you AngloGold Ashanti and LLCCA for supporting the trip, contributing to camps activities with tools and musical instruments.





The Importance of looking after your pets

With a pet dog - comes a life time of responsibility. All too often I am seeing dog attacks on the news, in the papers, on the internet and what for? In this issue I am going to talk about a few things to try and prevent this, and to make sure you are doing your best to protect, and keep your dog as well as yourself, and others safe - especially around the Christmas and new year period!

1. **Secure:** Whenever you are leaving your dog whether it be at home for the day to go to work, or if you are just popping out to the shop - make sure their environment is secured and they are not able to escape / other dogs cannot come in. This will prevent a lot of nasty things occurring such as - Your dog escaping which can potentially cause harm to itself, or others. Make sure they have plenty of toys so they are distracted and don't get bored which can cause them to dig holes to escape or chew the fence and jump out.

Walking: There is nothing worse than when you are walking your dog and another dog that is off leash approaches your dog. Even if this dog has its owner around it is still a big hazard for everyone as they are still not completely in charge of their dogs actions. Please make sure your dog is always on a leash when it is not in the comfort of its own house, this will make the environment of walking your dog feel so much safer and under control - it will also stop a lot of dog attacks and accidents from occurring - not to mention you are also training your dog at the same time!

- 3. **Training:** All too often there are dogs that do not listen, are un responsive or just plain naughty. With training your dog comes confidence that you are able to do more things with them - not only does training your dog give them obedience but they are more than likely to behave when you leave the house and they will respect you more. Simple commands like "sit" "stay" can go along way and can build up to harder commands once they start listening more. Not only does training your dog teach them, but it also teaches you - patience and control.
- 4. **Health:** It is so important that your dog is getting enough attention and exercise, without these things can lead to behavioural problems, health problems and can end up costing heaps in the long run (Vet Bills, etc) you should at least find some time everyday to take your dog for a walk, even if it is just a short 15 minute walk this way they are able to let off all their energy and get out and about. This will not only change their behaviour throughout the day (stop them from misbehaving), but it also helps with shortening of their nails so you don't have to cut them often. As most breeds of dogs need a certain amount of exercise per day, a short walk will help them to stay health and fit and will prevent heart diseases and other health problems that can occur.

PLACES TO See-LavERTON





To find the entrance to Giles Breakaway you will need to travel along the Great Central Road for about 55km. On the left hand side of the road keep an eye out for a sign with an I on it, pointing right. This is the entrance to Giles Breakaway. Drive down the dirt track for about 500m and you will be greeted by a spectacular view.



Giles Breakaway is popular for a lot of tourist who are starting their journey to Uluru and often use this it as their first camping spot.

Depending on how energetic you are feeling you can park up at one of the many parking spots along the breakaway and just take in the view, or you can look for a spot to walk down to the bottom of the breakaway and explore the many places down below I'd recommend exploring the area

I'd recommend exploring the area.

I parked on the left hand side of the breakaway, and found a steep little track down the side of the breakaway. As soon as you start to walk down the rocky terrain you will notice a range of different trees growing close to the edges of the breakaway.

As you begin to roam around the bottom of the breakaway you will notice the colour of the rocks change from red to bright white sandstone in certain areas of the breakaway. The ground will also turn into a white sand in areas, making it feel like you are at the beach.

Another thing you will see are many little caves all over the place. Some holes are big enough to stand up in, others can be rather small. There was one you could climb up through a hole and up to the top of the breakaway. Just make not if you do look in any of the caves be sure to look out for animals before entering.

Overall I would rate highly recommend seeing this place while you are in town. If you want to make a weekend out of it there are plenty of camping spots along the a ridgeline that offers some fantastic views of the area. Make note to not walk close to the ledges as the stone can be rather brittle.

Positive Parenting-Crying

Welcome to Positive Parenting Issue .1

The purpose of this article is to provide some information on parenting tips, advice and tricks which might assist you in becoming the positive parent you want to be. In this issue the focus will be on 'crying'.

If you have any suggestions of articles you would like to see in future issues of 'Positive Parenting' please feel free to let me know by visiting the Laverton Community Resource Centre.

Crying Baby (Coping with your own feelings)

It can be very hard to be patient with your baby, especially if she/he cries a lot. You may find yourself feeling frustrated, angry, helpless and distressed. These feelings are real and cannot just be ignored. Just because you love your baby doesn't mean you have to like her/his behaviour all the time.

- Remind yourself that your baby cannot control her/his crying and is not trying to irritate you. She/He is not 'spoilt' and attending to her will not spoil her.
- If there is someone nearby to help, give your baby to them while you take a break.
- If you are on your own, you may need to take a break when you feel angry feelings building up. Put your baby down in a
 safe place (cot) and walk away. Go outside perhaps, and take some deep breaths, phone someone or make a cup of tea.
 When you feel calmer, go back to your baby and try settle her again.
- It is important to look after yourself when you have a young baby who depends on you. Take up offers of help and get some regular breaks when you can.

Some reasons why babies cry:

- Hunger young babies may need feeding fairly often, especially if they are breastfed.
- Uncomfortable hot, cold, needs nappy change, wind or tummy pain, clothing uncomfortable or tight around tummy.
- Is she having a bowel action? Young babies can make a lot of fuss about doing a poo, even when it is soft or runny
- Tired are they in the best place to settle? Some prefer a dark quiet place, others do better with some noise and activity.
- Unwell if your baby is crying a lot, check with your doctor so you can feel sure that your baby is well. Check for signs of
 illness, especially if her crying is different to her usual pattern. Seek help if you are worried.
- Overtired
- Needs a cuddle.
- Too much has happened in the day and the baby is stressed.
- Some babies can be in pain due to reflux.
- Many times when young babies cry, no reason can be found.
- Many babies cry a lot in the late afternoon and evening, this type of crying is often referred to as colic.

EASY CHRISTMAS PUDDING



Ingredients

- 1 cup raisins
- 1 cup sultanas
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1 cup finely grated butter (about 115g/4oz)
- 1 cup fresh brown breadcrumbs (from around 4 thick slices of bread)

For the butterscotch sauce

- 85g butter
- 100g light muscovado sugar
- 200ml double cream
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

<u>Method</u>

 For the pudding, empty the first six cups and the nuts, if using, into a mixing bowl with the spices, then stir in the milk and egg. Once well combined, tip into a buttered 1.5 litre pudding bowl. 1 cup light muscovado sugar 1 cup mixed nuts, chopped plus extra to decorate

- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp ground mixed spice
- 1 cup milk
- 1 large egg
- butter, for greasing



- 2) Cover with a double layer of buttered foil, making a pleat in the centre to allow the pudding to rise. Tie the foil securely with string, then place in a steamer or large pan containing enough gently simmering water to come halfway up the sides of the bowl. Steam, covered with a lid, for 21/2 hours. Check the water level during cooking, topping up if necessary. If you are preparing this pudding ahead, remove the foil, let it cool slightly, then wrap in cling film and then fresh foil. If you are serving it immediately, unwrap and invert onto a deep plate.
- 3) For the sauce, put everything in a pan and bring slowly to the boil, stirring. Allow to bubble away for 2-3 minutes, still stirring, until the sugar has dissolved and the sauce is pale caramel in colour and slightly thickened. Remove from the heat. Pour the sauce over the pudding and decorate with the whole mixed nuts.


