Shire News

Shire of Laverton Administration Office Opening Times

Council has endorsed a proposal for the opening hours of the Shire of Laverton Administration Office to be amended as follows:

**8:30am to 4:30pm, Monday to Friday inclusive,
effective from Monday 30 April 2018.**

The revised hours will provide staff with the opportunity to arrive at work at their normal time of 8:00am and prepare themselves for the daily functions prior to members of the public presenting at the office for delivery of customer service.

Flying of the Australian Aboriginal Flag

Following due consideration, Council has endorsed the commencement for the flying of the Australian Aboriginal flag on a flag pole at the front of the Shire of Laverton Administration Building, along with the Australian and Shire of Laverton flags, with immediate effect.

Staff Updates

Gary Smith has commenced employment with the Shire to supervise Council's WANDRRA Flood Damage repair work claim on some of our gravel roads. These works are scheduled to commence during April 2018 for a six month period.

Relocation of the Skate Park to Leahy Park

Council has endorsed the proposal for relocation of the Laverton Skate Park to Leahy Park.

The original intent was for the skate park to be relocated to the rear of the Laverton School to align it with the proposed Community Hub project, which in turn would free up the Lancefield site for the development of an Aged Accommodation project.

With the Hub project now being broken into separate stages, it inhibits the relocation of the skate park as the identified land will not be readily available.

Leahy Park has been identified, as apart from the ablutions it is seldom used as a community space, especially with the recent Main Street upgrade which provides a more comfortable environment along Augusta Street.

Laverton Community Hub Projects

In relation to this project, in recent times I have been working with the Goldfields Esperance Development Commission to prepare a variation to the Financial Assistance Agreement (FAA) between the State of Western Australia and the Shire of Laverton for the Laverton Community Hub Project. The Variation has now been finalised and signed off by the Director General of the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

The FAA Variation and revised design plans prepared by the architects were presented to the Council meeting held on Thursday 22 March 2018, for consideration.

Unfortunately they had to be presented as a late agenda item as the plans were only received on Thursday afternoon and due to the extremely tight timeframe that we are working under needed to be presented for urgent consideration.

The re-design works required for proposed stage 1 has been structured around a refined budget and in order to achieve this it has been necessary to simplify parts of the design to reduce construction costs.

At the Council meeting, Council resolved:

That Council:

- 1. Endorses the variation to the Financial Assistance Agreement, as presented.*
- 2. Endorses the revised design for progressing Stage 1 of the Laverton Community Hub project.*
- 3. Endorses the revised costings for the project (Stage 1).*
- 4. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to progress the project to the Tender stage, subject to satisfactory Quantity Surveyor Costings Report.*

This is a very exciting project for the Laverton community and I am continuing to work with the architects, quantity surveyors and project managers to ensure the most optimum outcome for Council and the community.

Aged Accommodation Project

The Aged Accommodation Business Plan has now been completed and submitted to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development for consideration of funding under the Regional Aged Accommodation Funding Program.

Television Re-Broadcast Service

Due to recent inclement weather patterns we have been experiencing a number of problems with the SBS service. This is also partially due to the size of the satellite dish. A new larger dish has been ordered and will be installed when the annual maintenance is due to be carried out about mid-May 2018.

We apologise for the inconvenience but hopefully once the new dish has been installed further issues of this kind will not be experienced.

Great Central Road - Update

The Great Central Road Project is progressing well now that weather conditions onsite have improved. This Project is for the construction and sealing of the 50 kms of the Great Central Road before the border between the Shire of Laverton and the Shire of Ngaanyatjaraku. The first 15.3 kms has been sealed and completed and the next 12 kms are constructed and are ready for final trimming and sealing.

We expect to have the first 30 kms of this project fully constructed and sealed by the end of April 2018. The next ten km section will be sealed by the end of June 2018 and the remaining ten km section will be sealed by October 2018 completing the 50 km total.

A temporary bypass of some of the Great Central Road has been constructed near the Mount Shenton-Yamarna Road intersection. This bypass has been required as a result of recent rainfall from ex Tropical Cyclone Kelvin. This area has been declared a national disaster event, meaning that the Shire of Laverton will be eligible to apply for funding through the Office of Emergency Management to repair and reinstate the damaged section of road. Traffic restrictions are currently in place and are expected to remain active for the next few months.

Solar Lights

Thirty-one Solar Lights have been ordered and will be installed on the pathway between the Hospital and the Wongatha Village - these five meter poles will be installed as soon as they arrive.

Recent Tenders

RFT 15/17 Design, Supply and Erection of New Executive Residence

The tender for the aforementioned project was awarded at the Council meeting held on Thursday 22 March 2018. The successful tenderer has been notified and it is anticipated the new house will be on-site prior to the end of the 2018 calendar year.

While driving in and out of Laverton, you might often come across certain animals that are beside the roads or more likely than not, in the middle of the roads - this happens especially in rural areas. It is important to take precautions in order not to collide or hit these animals as it can result in major consequences to not only the vehicle but the occupants inside of the car as well.

Kangaroos:

Kangaroos are native to Australia and are often spotted while driving early morning or sunset (Dawn and Dusk), due to them resting during the day. When it is possible, try to travel during daylight, but if not possible and it is dark, make sure you are travelling with your high beams on, and that you are driving the speed limit, if not slower as colliding with a kangaroo can cause a lot of damage to not only your car but the kangaroo itself, and if you are not driving to the precautions - also the passengers in the vehicle.



Cattle:

Cattle usually belong to someone, and have just wandered out of their paddock. They usually tend to cross highways and rural roads, mostly in groups, in search of food and water. So where there is one- especially a baby there tends to be plenty more. Cattle tend to get startled very easily, and act unpredictably and if you travelling at high speed can cause serious damage to the car, yourself, and more often than not the cow as well.

Tips and tricks if you are travelling these roads:

- Pay attention- Always watch the roads, especially at night time, Cattle along with most animals do get frightened and sometimes their actions are unpredictable, especially when there are loud noises and bright lights, be sure to slow down if you see one on the side of the road, or even pull over and stop until it passes. -
- Bull Bars- If travelling in areas that are well known to have kangaroos and Cattle, a bulbar can come in handy on your vehicle-especially if it is a smallish one. This can protect the vehicle from damage, and make the impact less dramatic. It is recommended to travel in a 4WD when possible on these roads, as they are stronger and are more likely to offer protection to the passengers and driver of the vehicle if anything happens.
- Do not swerve, but if possible stop and pull over when you can - Even eagles that may be eating on the side of the road, are slow to fly away.

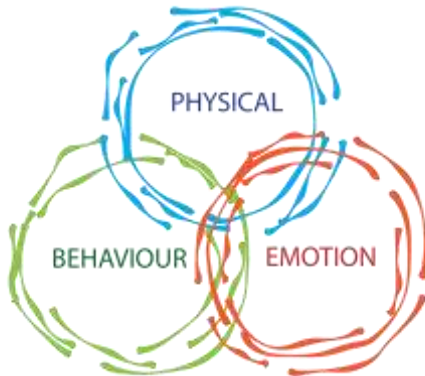

The Smoking Behaviour

Many smokers think that their addiction to cigarettes is often what makes it difficult to quit. However, they don't realise that smoking behaviour is complicated and includes physical, emotional and behaviour – the so-called 'three aspects of smoking'. Smokers may have a better chance of quitting and staying smoke-free if they address all three aspects of smoking.



Physical addiction:

Nicotine is just one of the 7000 chemicals found in cigarette smoke. It's addictive and is the cause of most of the withdrawal symptoms you feel when you first stop smoking. In the brain, nicotine causes the release of dopamine, making you feel good. But these feelings go away once the nicotine disappears. That leaves your body wanting more, which makes you crave another cigarette. This is the physical part of the smoking addiction. Overcoming the physical addiction can be difficult, but it is possible. Talking to your doctor about when and how often you smoke can help them to determine a treatment plan. Nicotine patches, gum and lozenges can help to reduce these cravings.

Emotions:

Emotions are big smoking triggers too – you may smoke in response to feeling a certain way. Smoking is often used as an aid to reduce and/or control negative feelings of anxiety, frustration or anger. Cigarettes are often used to cope with stress and the level of consumption may increase when a person feels under pressure. For example, you might smoke for comfort when sad; for a break when tired or for something to do when bored. Often cigarettes are used to cover up an uncomfortable feeling too, such as when you're angry or when you're nervous. Replacing the negative emotions by recreational activities can help you remain smoke-free. This could include – walking, reading, gardening, exercising, and making new friends.

Behaviour:

Smoking can be habitual. For example you may find you tend to smoke at certain times such as with a coffee, after a meal or when talking on the phone. And habits can be a real challenge to change.

To change a habit, you need to recognise your triggers – the things that make you carry out a certain function. A good plan to quit smoking will mean identifying those triggers and trying to break old habits.

Making a quit plan that addresses all three aspects of your smoking addiction can be really helpful. 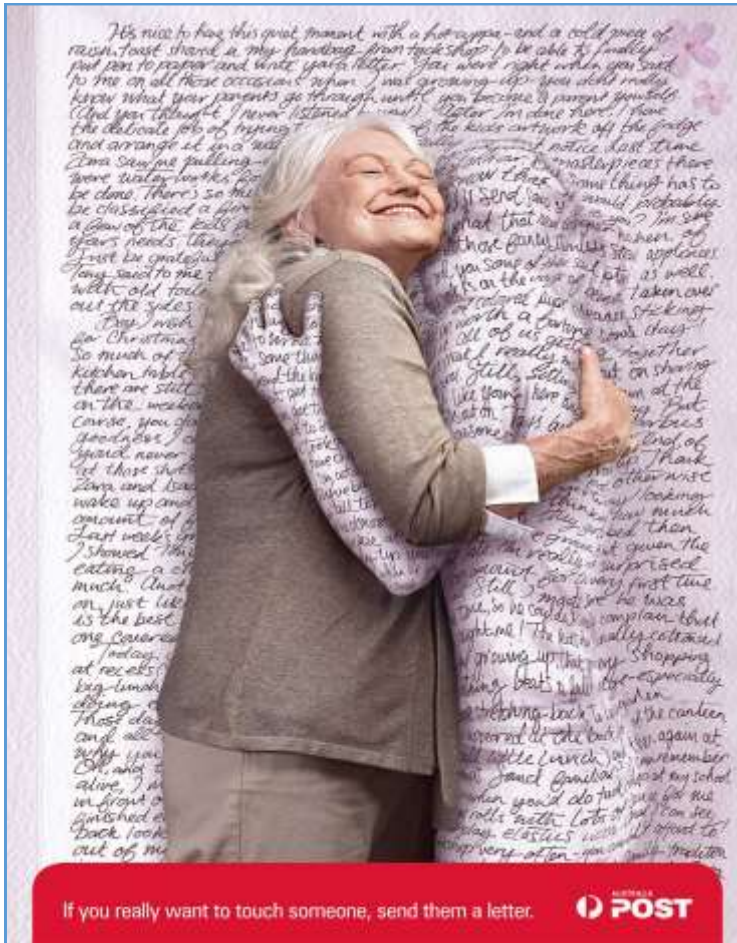

Places to see around Laverton

White Cliffs Part II

In the February's edition of places to see around Laverton we drove along White Cliffs Road for the first 45km. Recently I continued along the road for a further 20kms, which had me stopping regularly to take in the spectacular views.

Because the road is rather sandy and the sun was out, many lizards were on the road throughout the drive, with some refusing to move until the car came to a complete stop.

At around the 50km mark, long rocky breakaways and hills can be seen scattered on each side of the road. On the side of the road I spotted a track to drive the car closer to one of these breakaways. As soon as I parked the car I could see amazing rock formations all around. This was a perfect location to get out of the car and walk around to take in the views.

On the top of the breakaway you are greeted with spectacular views, and because of the recent rain the whole area is bright green with the white and red ground scattered in between.

Walking along the bottom of the breakaway there are rocks balancing on the side of the hills, bright white cliffs littered with red rocks, and eucalyptus plants scattered across the place. Around 200m from where the car was parked there was a rock face that resembled a bridge. Close by, **there was also a smooth rock face that had 100's of little quartz rocks** sticking out of it, it resembled a piece of art.

There was also a little cave around the area which allowed for a little bit of shade.

From here I got back on the road and continued driving. A couple of kilometres down the road, the breakaways disappeared and the whole environment changed to a red sandy desert scattered with small bushes and eucalyptus trees. You can see the remnants of the large bushfires that went along the road a couple months ago. Some areas are bare with the remains of burnt trees everywhere, but because of the recent rain you can see the landscape is slowly recovering.

There is a turn off at around the 60km mark that takes you to the white cliffs station. **I didn't go down this road as it looked pretty sandy , was on my own and wasn't very keen on getting stuck**-safety first!

I continued for a further 10 km along the road and this is where I decided to turn around and head on back towards Laverton.

The road conditions were pretty smooth this month compared to usual, because some of the rougher areas have been graded, due to the gas line being built beside this road. The road is a bit busier than usual because of the gas line so keep a look out for road work signs. As always make sure you have a 4x4 to access this road, check road conditions prior to leaving, let someone know where you are going and when you should be back. Always take a first aid kit and water.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup plain flour
- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- 2/3 cup desiccated coconut
- 125g butter, chopped
- 2 tablespoons golden syrup
- 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of



Step One:

Preheat oven to 160°C/140°C fan-forced. Line 3 baking trays with baking paper.

Step two:

Combine oats, flour, sugar and coconut in a bowl. Place butter, syrup and 2 tablespoons cold water in a saucepan over medium heat. Stir for 2 minutes or until butter has melted. Stir in bicarbonate of soda. Stir butter mixture into oat mixture.

Step Three:

Roll level tablespoons of mixture into balls. Place on trays, 5cm apart. Flatten slightly. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes or until light golden (see note). Stand on trays for 5 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Serve.
