Shire News

Laverton Airfield - Toilets

NACAP have assisted us with the relocation of a transportable building to the rear of the Laverton Airport Terminal. This will provide two extra toilets for use at the Airport. Forman Brothers have been appointed to do the water and sewer connections and will commence this work in early June.

Laverton Community Hub Projects

The Shire's Road Construction Crew are in the process of assisting with the demolition of Laverton's Swimming Pool. Once this has been completed the team will move on to the demolition of the old Post Office building.

Airport Lighting Upgrade – Update

All trenching, conduit and cabling works are complete for the runway lighting project at the Laverton Airport. The installation and replacement of the runway lights will commence shortly with completion due in mid-July.

Flood Damaged Road Repairs

Old Laverton Road – Update

A set of culverts is still to be installed on the Old Laverton Road, a couple of hundred meters past the end of the bitumen where the Shire of Laverton's Road Construction Crew have been realigning the road. These works are due to commence in the next couple of weeks.

Bandya Road Culvert Installation – Update

Comiskey Contracting are currently cutting the road approaches and installing culverts at approximately the 50 kilometre mark for the Bandya Road Flood Damage repair work. This project is due for completion in the second week of June.

Whitecliffs Road and the Whitecliffs-Yamarna Road – Update

Deserts Sands Cartage are underway with their Flood Damage repair work for the Whitecliffs Road and the Whitecliffs-Yamarna Road. This work is required as a result of heavy rainfall in February 2017. C&A Taylor Grading are due to start their parcel of works for various sections of these roads during July.



· Great Central Road - Update

The Great Central Road Bypass near the Mount Shenton turnoff has been constructed by C&A Taylor Grading to once again enable heavy traffic to travel from that point to the Shire's north-eastern border. We are currently finalising our WANDRRA Flood Damage submission to the Office of Emergency Management to access funding to have the damaged section of road reinstated. There has now been 35km of the Great Central Road sealed near the Shire's north-eastern border with the remaining 15 kilometres due to be completed and sealed by September.

Administration

Staff are preparing the 2018/19 Draft Budget prior to presenting this to the Council for review and final adoption mostly likely around the end of July 2018. With the close of the financial year drawing closer, Shire staff are also preparing and training to implement a major change in the computer system used in Shire operations. This is a major step in improving financial control and ongoing compliance with the State Government's legislation that is applied to local governments across the State. Shire staff will be supported during the changeover process by a company called IT Vision with effect from 1 July 2018.

Stray Cattle

Laverton Downs Station and Mt Weld Station are planning to undertake a combined muster of the 'cleanskin' cattle which are roaming in and around town. This is expected to commence in mid-June.

CDC Office

The Cashless Debit Card Office has been open for some four weeks now with our staff trained and ready to go. They have been assisting the local community with enquiries and doing community visits to assist with an understanding of how the card will operate. The Cashless Card roll-out for the Laverton community commenced in the last week of May and people who have received a card will need to activate it before it can be used. The team at the CDC Office can assist with this and any other enquiries.









National Simultaneous Storytime!

Put safety first when prospecting

The Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety expects a bumper prospecting season this year and is ramping up its message to stay safe in the bush.

The death in January of novice prospector in the Gascoyne, near Cue, is a dramatic reminder of the importance of the department's annual Seven Golden Rules for prospecting campaign launched this week by Mines Minister Bill Johnston.

The prospector's body was found after a major two-day search in 45 degree heat only 2.5 km from the 48-year-old man's campsite.

DMIRS Resources Tenure Executive Director Tony Bullen said that the combination of another cool summer and a large amount of Miner's Rights issued early in the year will mean there will be a lot of prospectors on the ground during the season.

A total of 974 Miner's Rights have been issued since the start of the year and 537 of those have been issued since the beginning of April.

A Miner's Right is the most common prospecting permit used by prospectors visiting Western Australia and allows holders to prospect on Crown Land with hand-held tools, such as a metal detector, and to take and keep samples or specimens up to 20 kilograms

"We're only a few short of last year's record number of Miner's Rights, so that is telling us we need to be tenacious in spreading the safety message this year, particularly to the first timers out in the bush this year," Mr Bullen said.

The first Seven Golden Rules for prospecting campaign in 2014 was in response to a recommendation by the State Coroner for prospectors to carry a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) following the 2012 death of a prospector near Menzies.

Michael Graham sparked a 15-day search involving aircraft, motorbikes, horses and expert trackers covering 1500 square kilometres.

The body of the 46-year-old father-of-two was never found.







The Coroner's Court was told that of the nine prospectors who had been reported missing that year, only one had been carrying a PLB and was found within four hours.

Searches for missing prospectors average 11.3 hours but many last one or two days, while aircraft searches cost up to \$5000 per hour

"Searches are not only stressful for the family and friends of those lost, they stretch precious police and emergency resources," Mr Bullen said.

"Western Australia's outback is a fascinating place, but it can also be a brutal environment and that is why we put the safety first message at the beginning of our Seven Golden Rules.

"And the best way to keep yourself and loved ones safe is to carry a PLB when prospecting in remote areas."

The device, which can be bought from most outdoor and camping stores, is considered by search and rescue organisations to be ideal for use in remote areas because it does not rely on telecommunication networks to submit a signal.

"If you're not carrying a beacon, you're not taking enough responsibility for your life," Mr. Bullen said.

The Seven Golden Rules for prospecting campaign will target tourist bureaus, libraries, caravan parks and DMIRS offices with posters, brochures and booklets.

The Seven Golden Rules

1. Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps, first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Location Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's

office).

3. Obtain a 40E permit

when prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder),

4. Get written permission

from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

5. Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. This includes gaining permission from the pastoralist for access to certain areas.

6. Show respect when on Crown land

because it is used or set aside for many purposes, including:

- pastoral and grazing activities
- parks and forests
- the use and benefit of Aboriginal people
- mining activities

that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed. <ENDS>

Child Protection and Family Support



Laverton May 2018

In July 2017 the new Department of Communities was formed, bringing together Child Protection & Family Support; the Housing Authority; the Disability Services Commission; Youth Justice; Community Grants, Initiatives & Funding; and Regional Services Reform.

There is now improved communication and better and closer working between these organisations and this has helped in Laverton, for example, by making it easier for people to deal with the Housing Authority through the local office where a small supply of forms and information are now kept for day to day use.

In respect of Child Protection and Family Support, some new staff were appointed across the Northern Goldfields, and now there are child protection workers in Leonora, Warburton, Warakurna and Blackstone.

Kevin Morgan is now the Senior Child Protection Worker in here Laverton and he is based at the small office shared with the Community Health Nurse, next to the Police Station in the centre of town.

The office is open from 8:30AM - 4:30PM Monday to Friday.

Kevin works with families in Laverton and also in Mount Margaret, in Cosmo Newbury and in Mulga Queen. At this point Kevin is undertaking formal work with 10-15 families and he sees another 15 -20 families for informal work as well.

Kevin is always happy to meet new people, to talk about any worries they may have, and to offer help and advice about children and young people in the local area. No appointment is required, so just call in at the office when it is open.

Of course, Kevin cannot help every person with every problem, but he is able to make referrals to other agencies, and he has good working relationships across several different services in the Goldfields area.

If you are worried about yourself, your partner, or children and young people in your family, please come to CPFS for help and advice.



Hearty Vegetable Stew

With winter fast approaching, hot and hearty meals will definitely be on the menu! This hearty vegetable stew will definitely be one to warm the

soul. Plus, for a few of us in our small town, It's also vegan and vegetarian!

Ingredients:

- 1 Small Onion, Minced
- 1 Garlic Clove, Minced
- 1 Celery Stalk, Minced
- 1/4 Cup Vegetable stock
- 1 Large Onion, Diced
- 220grms Button Mushrooms, Sliced
- 220grms Portobello Mushrooms, Sliced
- 1 tsp Dried Rosemary
- 1/2 Cup Red Wine(Or veg stock)

- 3 Cups Vegetable Stock
- 1/2 tsp Salt
- 1/4 tsp Ground Pepper
- 1 Can Diced Tomatoes
- 2 Medium Carrots, Chopped
- 2 Yukon Gold Potatoes, Chopped
- 1 240ml Can Tomato Paste
- 1 tbs Balsamic Vinegar
- 1 tsp Italian Seasoning

Method:

- 1. Mince the carrot, celery and small onion until very fine.
- Sauté this mixture in 1/4 cup of vegetable stock until nice and soft.
- 3. Add the large onion and continue cooking until softened.
- 4. Add the mushrooms and cook on medium until they lose their liquid.
- 5. Season with the rosemary and Italian seasoning, Add the red wine and de-glaze any brown spots on the bottom of the pan.
- 6. After a few minutes add the rest of the stock, tomatoes and tomato paste.
- 7. Add all the vegetables and turn up the heat to boil, Add the rest of the seasoning, but not the corn-starch.
- 8. Once its boiling, turn the heat down to low and add the peas.
- 9. Mix the corn-starch with a tablespoon of cold water and stir in to thicken, Simmer to desired consistency.

Siamese Fighting Fish

Siamese fighting Fish, commonly known as the "Betta fish" have the unique reputation of bright colours and aggression. If housed in the same tank with other fish of the same species there is a high possibility that they will fight each other to death.-they aren't called fighting fish for no reason!

Being highly territorial, Betta fish often will attack and even kill other fish that are put in their tank. There is a select few fish that they can get along with, including: Neon Tetras, Bristle Nose Plecos, White Cloud Mountain Minnows, amongst others. However, before introducing your Betta fish to others take into consideration the aggression of your individual fish, and ensure your tank is large enough for the fish to have their own space. From personal experience I would recommend a supervised introduction and to remove the other fish as soon as possible if your Betta fish starts displaying aggressive behaviour.

It is not recommended to keep these fish in a small bowl, vase or even as a decoration on a desk. Studies show that they are much happier in a larger tank where they are able to swim around and live their life.

My Siamese fighting fish lives in a 3.5 Gallon fish bowl which homes him comfortably and he is able to access fresh oxygen easily.

<u>Lavender-</u> Its usually known for its aroma and beautiful colour but lavender is also helpful at keeping mosquitoes away. Plant in large pots around your yard so that you can move them around the yard to ensure they have full sun all year round. Make sure you have good drainage to achieve a healthy plant.

Marigold- As marigolds contain pyrethrum, a compound used in a number of insect repellents, they are very useful for repelling mosquitoes. Marigolds can thrive in pots when given enough space so make sure you use a 6inch pot for each plant. Place around your front entrance and patio to ensure their smell will deter mosquitoes.





Basil-Basil does its best in well drained, moist soil and thrives when it receives at least 6 hours of sun daily. Water when soil is dry but try to water at the base and avoid watering the leaves. Place pots around your front door and entertainment areas to repel mosquitoes.

<u>Citronella Grass-</u> Citronellas distinct and strong smell covers other attractants to mosquitoes which is why this plant is good at deterring them. They are a clumping bush and can grow up to 5-6 feet tall so they are perfect as a background to other small decorative plants. They can thrive in pots and do best with a minimum of 6 hours of sun per day.





Rosemary-Proper watering is the key to growing rosemary in a pot. If the top 1-2 inches of soil is dry, then it is time to water. While rosemary can tolerate partial shade, It prefers full sun and well-drained soil. As well as being a good mosquito repellent, your rosemary bush will also come in handy in the kitchen.

Catnip- In august 2010 entomologists at Iowa state university reported that catnip is 10 times more effective than DEET, the chemical found in most commercial insect repellents. It does well in full sun with well-drained soil. Make sure to keep soil moist but not saturated.
