You must take your old shower head/s to an exchange point identified on Water Corporation's website at <u>watercorporation.com.au/community</u> to exchange it for a new replacement shower head, whilst supplies last.

Sprinkler roster reminder for communities across the Goldfields and Wheatbelt

Did you know there are sprinkler rosters in place across Western Australia? Water Corporation is reminding communities across the Goldfields and Wheatbelt to check their sprinkler systems are set to the correct days.

Water Corporation Goldfields and Agricultural Regional Manager, Sharon Broad, explained how the sprinkler roster worked.

"Communities south of Kalbarri and Kalgoorlie are subject to a two-day-per-week sprinkler roster," Mrs Broad said.

"Your allocated watering day is based on the last digit of your house or lot number. If there is no house number, the lot number is used.

"Those north of Kalbarri and Kalgoorlie, such as Menzies, Laverton and Leonora, are subject to an alternate day roster. If the last digit of your house number is even, you can only water on even numbered days of the month or odd days of the month if your house number is odd."

The best way to check your rostered sprinkler day is to visit Water Corporation's website <u>watercorporation.com.au</u>

Remember to only use your sprinklers once on your rostered day either before 9am or after 6pm. Those with a bore are able to water on additional days.

Property owners receive a \$100 fine if they are sighted breaching the sprinkler roster by an inspector, and a warning if they are reported by a member of the public, or if an inspector observes sprinklers have been used.

If you witness anyone breaching the sprinkler roster, you can report it online at <u>watercorporation.com.au/breach</u> or call 13 10 39.

Mrs Broad praised the majority of Goldfields and Wheatbelt residents for being waterwise, with 47 warnings and three fines issued in 2018.

"Most people do the right thing when it comes to following the sprinkler roster and Water Corporation research shows it is strongly supported in the community, but a small number of residents still do not comply," Mrs Broad said.

"It is also important for residents to regularly check their irrigation controllers, especially after power outages which can reset sprinkler systems to come on every day."



HON ROBIN SCOTT MLC OF KALGOORLIE-BOULDER Member for Mining and Pastoral



At the age of sixteen Robin Scott came from Scotland with his parents to Western Australia, where he enrolled as an apprentice electrician. Robin is immensely proud of his trade, and for more than 30 years he worked as an electrical contractor to the WA mining industry, especially in the Goldfields. Robin has logged 4,000 hours in his Rockwell Commander, flying himself and his staff to electrical contracting assignments.

Robin is an enthusiastic campaigner for creating job opportunities through more

apprenticeships for young men and young women. Pauline Hanson's One Nation policy is for subsidising apprenticeships 75% in the first year, 50% in the second year and 25% in the third year.

Robin Scott moved the Disallowance Motion which on 12 December 2017 defeated the Government's attempt to increase the Gold Royalty by 50%. Robin is determined to protect and promote the gold industry and is presently campaigning for the reopening of the Norseman and Coolgardie offices of the Mining Warden.

Robin's priorities for 2018 include:

- Clean drinking water for remote communities
- MRI Scanner for the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Hospital
- New hospital for Laverton



Tobacco smoke contains more than 7000 chemicals, including tar, nicotine, carbon monoxide, hydrogen cyanide, metals, radioactive compounds and pesticides. At least 70 chemicals are known to cause cancer. Smoking can cause 16 types of cancer, heart diseases, lung diseases, eye diseases, problems in pregnancy, premature wrinkles and low fertility.

Quitting smoking can be challenging. Most people make multiple quit attempts. That's because nicotine is a very addictive drug. But don't give up trying just because you haven't succeeded in the past. Research has shown that smokers on average make 12-14 quit attempts before quitting for good. Think about your past attempts to quit—what worked and what didn't. If one method didn't work, don't hesitate to try another method. You can learn something new every time you try to quit. - Get ready Set a quit date; stay away from smokers; change your routine; practice quitting; take medication regularly as advised; and try eating healthy.

Get up everyday determined not to smoke. Reward yourself from the money saved by not smoking. Come up with a list of small gifts that you can give yourself. Make this the year you quit smoking for good. Shed the chains of addiction and take back your life. You are worth it..



Growing Tips: Beware of cabbage moth for February and December planting. Ensure broccoli is well mulched and watered.

Carrots:

Planting Months: February, September, October, November.

Growing Tips: Beware of cabbage moth for February and December planting. Adding mulch around the carrots ensures that they will stay cool throughout the hot summer months.

Climbing Beans:

Planting Months: January, February, October, November, December.

Growing Tips: Increase watering when fruiting, especially when in hot summer months.

Cucumber:

Planting Months: January, February, October, November, December.

Growing Tips: Increase watering when fruiting, Beware of mold if over watered or high levels of humidity.

Potato:

Planting Months: February, March, April, October, November, December.

Growing Tips: Do not over water, Hold in moisture by using mulch.

Spring Onions:

Planting Months: All Year

Growing Tips: Companion plants with many of your other crops, especially strawberries

Sweet Corn:

Planting Months: January, February, March, April, October, November, December.

Growing Tips: Grow in full sun and warm position, especially for cooler months.

Pasta with chicken, cannellini bean puree, peas and beans

Stuck in a food coma after your holiday feast? Re-boot your system with this Healthy, Quick and easy Chicken and Pasta dish.

- ♦ 2/3 cup penne rigate pasta
- ♦ Olive oil spray for cooking
- ♦ 1 cup frozen peas
- ♦ 150g sugar snap peas
- ♦ 150g green beans halved
- ♦ 400g chicken tenderloins, thinly sliced
- ♦ Juice of 1/2 lemon
- 3 sprigs thyme, leaves picked and finely chopped
- ♦ 150g reduced fat ricotta
- ♦ 2 cups mixed salad leaves

Cannellini Bean Puree:

- 1 x 400g tin, salt reduced cannellini beans, drained and rinsed
- 3/4 cup salt reduced chicken or vegetable stock
- ♦ 1 garlic clove, crushed
- 1 teaspoon finely grated lemon zest
- ♦ Lemon juice to taste

Method:

- 1. To make the puree, place the cannellini beans, stock, garlic and 1/4 cup of water in a small heavy-based saucepan, bring to a boil over high heat and cook for 10 minutes to warm the beans through. Drain the beans, reserving the stock, and transfer to a blender or food processor. Add the lemon zest and 2 tablespoons of the reserved stock and process or blend to a puree, adding a little extra stock if a thinner consistency is desired. Reserve any remaining stock. Return the puree to the saucepan, stir in lemon juice to taste and keep warm.
- 2. Meanwhile, cook the pasta in a large saucepan of simmering water according to the packet. Drain, reserving 1/4 cup of the pasta water and set aside. Cook the peas in a saucepan of simmering water for 3 minutes or until tender. Drain and set aside. Cook the sugar snap peas and beans in a saucepan of simmering water for 2 minutes or until tender but still crisp. Drain and set aside with the peas.
- 3. Heat a large non-stick heavy based frying pan over medium heat and spray with olive oil. Add the chicken and cook, stirring constantly, for 5-6 minutes or until cooked through. Squeeze in the lemon juice and stir in the thyme. Add the pasta, half the remaining stock and half of the cannellini bean puree to the pan, stir to combine and season to taste with pepper. Add a little of the reserved pasta water if a thinner sauce is preferred. Gently stir in the peas, sugar snap peas and beans.





Gold Inca Snail

THE IMPORTANCE OF SNAILS IN YOUR FISH TANK

 Snails provide a sense of movement and colour in the tank, as well as keeping your tank water quality clear, free of algae and they also help to clean and remove left over dirt and fish food from hard to reach areas. If you have a breeding aquarium, most freshwater snails stay away from the cluster of fish eggs that are waiting to be hatched so that is also a bonus as well I personally have the Gold Inca snail (Pictured to the left), which has helped a lot with algae removal. This snail moves freely around the tank and does not disturb my fish at all, making the life in my fish tank calm and friendly for all of its occupants.

SNAIL HORROR STORIES

Some people have issues with snails over populating their tank, which can happen in a number of ways. Snails can enter the tank through live plants purchased for their fish tank, and even through the water that is used to transport new fish to their homes. Some of the most common breeds of snail can reproduce all on their own, so all it takes is for one egg to land in your tank and you can end up with a whole population of them residing in your tank. I have no issues with over population in my tank as the Gold Inca Snail cannot reproduce on its own, and requires another female or male to do so

BREEDS OF FRESH WATER SNAILS

- Assassin Snail These Snails prowl the tank looking for other Snails - e.g. Pond Snails, Ramshorn Snails etc to eat. This keeps Snail populations under control.
- Nerite Snails These snails come in a range of different colours, shapes and patterns. They do not reproduce in freshwater, and lay eggs on hard surfaces.
- Pond snail This Snail can be accidentally introduced to the tank, by being attached to live plants brought from the store.
- Ramshorn Snails Like the Pond Snail, Ramshorn Snails can also be accidentally introduced into the tank. - Along with Trumpet Snails. Ramshorn Snails lay eggs, and eat algae buildup on hard surfaces.


