Naidoc Week

National Aboriginal and Islander Day, better known as NAIDOC is the highlight of the year for Aboriginal and Islander people and their supporters. In all capital cities, and many regional communities NAIDOC takes place on the first Sunday of July to the following Sunday lasting a week. During this week many activities and celebrations are organized to not only celebrate the history, culture and achievements of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people but also to increase awareness and understanding of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander heritage and history. A variety of different activities are held during NAIDOC week, activities such as art competitions, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander dances, community BBQ, inviting elders to speak or to give a Welcome to Country at either school or workplace, flag raising ceremonies and smoking ceremonies.

Brief History of Naidoc

The special day for Aboriginal and Islander people was first observed in 1938. But the day's origins can be found earlier still, in the history of a number of Aboriginal and Islander organizations.

During the 1920s the Australian Aborigines Progressive Association (AAPA) and the Australian Aborigines League (AAL) were starting to become more active in Sydney, under the leadership of Fred Maynard and William Cooper. The Australian Aborigines Progressive Association were able to hold three annual conferences before having to give up on their work due to issues with law enforcement. In 1932, William Cooper, founder of the AAL, drafted a petition to send to King George V but the government of the day claimed that the petition fell outside their constitutional responsibilities. In 1937, Cooper submitted the petition, but the government did not forward it. By this time they were clearly aware that the broader Australian public were largely ignorant to their efforts. During November of 1937, Cooper called a meeting of aboriginal people suggesting they hold a day of Mourning to publicize their cause, so on the following Australia Day of January 1938 both the Australian Aboriginal League and the Aboriginal Progressive Association combined to march through the streets of Sydney, followed by a congress attended by over a thousand people. Making this day known to Australians as the Day of Mourning, one of the first major civil rights gatherings in the world.

After the Day of Mourning, there was a growing feeling that it should be a regular event, so in 1939 Cooper wrote to the National Missionary Council of Australia to seek their assistance in supporting and promoting an annual event. From 1940 until 1955, the Day of Mourning was held annually on the Sunday before Australia Day and was known as Aborigines Day. In 1955 Aborigines Day was shifted to the first Sunday in July after it was decided the day should become not simply a protest day but also a celebration of Aboriginal Culture. With the arrival of Aborigines Day, the National Aborigines Day Observance Committee (NAIDOC) was formed. Major Aboriginal organizations, state and federal governments and a number of church groups all supported the formation of NAIDOC.

NAIDOC was later expanded, in the 1990s, becoming the National Aboriginal and Islander Day Observance Committee (NAIDOC), this was to recognize the Torres Strait Islander people and culture. With this new name change came a whole week to celebrate NAIDOC, to which we still celebrate today.

Screening FAQ Sheet – What happens on the day

- The Screenings are conducted by qualified volunteers from our screening panel which includes Plastic Surgeons, Dermatologists and General Practitioners.
- The screening is a full body visual screen to identify suspect skin lesions. Patients will be asked to disrobe down to their underwear.
- The Service is a referral service. Screeners do not provide any diagnosis or prognosis.
- Where suspect lesions are found the patient receives a referral letter to their GP
- The Lions Cancer Institute has been providing this service to the WA Community since 1990.
- The Cancer institute is funded by the Lions Clubs of WA, Public Donations and Corporate sponsorship.
- All administration and screening conducted by The Lions Cancer Institute is performed by volunteers.

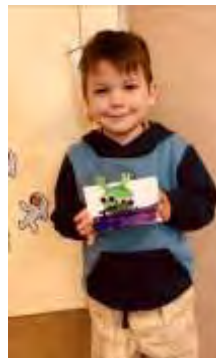

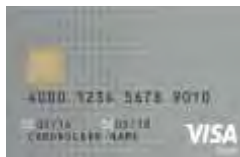

For thousands of years, Aboriginal people have practiced customary forms of healing such as the use of traditional healers, special songs and bush medicine.

Their knowledge and skills have been passed down from generation to generation, allowing today's society to use remedies sourced from the land.

Traditionally Bush Medicine is only made by the women of the family.

Heal Bush Medicine has been made by Raylene Isaacs and her daughters, who have been given permission to make the medicine by their Auntie.

The family make trips out bush to collect clippings from the tree, of which the women can then make the ointment.

Heal Bush Medicine can be used for muscle strains & pains, acne, eczema, burns & blisters, sunburn and open wounds.

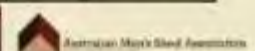

**HON ROBIN SCOTT MLC
OF KALGOORLIE-BOULDER
Member for Mining and Pastoral**



At the age of sixteen Robin Scott came from Scotland with his parents to Western Australia, where he enrolled as an apprentice electrician. Immensely proud of his trade, Robin has worked for more than 30 years as an electrical contractor to the WA mining industry, especially in the Goldfields. Flying himself and his staff to electrical contracting assignments, Robin logged

4,000 hours in his Rockwell Commander, the aircraft he now uses to service his constituents in the vast Mining and Pastoral Region.

Robin is an enthusiastic campaigner for job opportunities through creating more apprenticeships for young men and young women. The Federal Government has partially embraced the Pauline Hanson's One Nation policy of subsidising apprentice wages 75% in the first year, 50% in the second year and 25% in the third year.

Robin Scott moved the Disallowance Motion which defeated the Government's attempt to increase the Gold Royalty by 50%. Robin is determined to protect and promote mining and led the defence against water charges for prospectors and small miners.

Robin's priorities for 2019 include:

- Water pipeline south from the Kimberley
- Sealing the Wiluna-Meekatharra Road
- Insist on rapid delivery of the promised MRI machine for Kalgoorlie
- Big upgrade for palliative care for the Goldfields
- Aged care facility for Leonora
- New hospital for Laverton
- Push the Federal Govt to abolish Fringe Benefits Tax for remote area workers

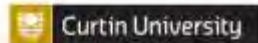

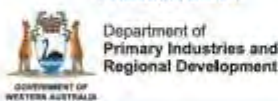

Quarterly Report

Dear Pakaanu Members

As members, we wish to keep you informed of the Corporation's progress, as we build our footprint in Laverton. In establishing a greater voice for the community, through a newly formed Aboriginal Community Corporation, which was registered through the office of the Registrar of Indigenous Corporations (ORIC) as of the 8th October 2018. For the past 4 years the resident group has built their profile through a series of engagements, forums and discussions with a variety of agencies at both State and Federal levels as a call for action to tackle social, economic and cultural issues within the Laverton community.

The strategy and central component of Pakaanu is "Strong Families Within a Strong Community" is the establishment of a coherent approach to engaging community. The strategy will utilise the Pakaanu group as a focal point in bringing together major stakeholders. In doing so, the intention is to capture the combined resources and synergy of those stakeholders to make tangible and substantive shifts and the quality of social, cultural and economic change delivered, as well as contributing to the broader well-being of our members in Laverton.

Now we have secured funding from the Federal Government to establish a strategic plan by June 2020, which will consist of setting the support structure through the (5) pillars of government (Education, Housing, Employment & Training, Health and Police and Justice). Also negotiating with the social agencies is paramount in dealing with the issues in the community. This is also being a member of the Laverton Stakeholder Group which gives our organisation a voice in the community. We are currently negotiating with Sate Government to contribute towards the establishment of our organisation and this is also the same with Corporate for by-in investment to support the Pakaanu Group.

Already partnerships have been strengthened with the Laverton School, Laverton Police, Mining Companies (LLCCA), Shire of Laverton and Wirrpanda Foundation in setting programs for the future which will benefit our members in the long term.

- Currently we are looking at a Pre-Natal and Early Childhood Program in partnership with WA Playgroup and Laverton School to start in June 2019.
- We have put in an expression of interest to start a ranger program for Laverton through the Laverton Leonora Cross Cultural Association (LLCCA).
- We are looking at starting a building maintenance program for the Northern Goldfields.
- In a position to negotiate work opportunities with local mining companies
- Supporting residents of Wongatha Village – Liaise with contractors, managing power and water accounts and addressing issues and impacts on people's lives.

In terms of governance for the organisation, one way to keep up to date as a member, is to go to the website (ORIC) log in the ICN: 8920 and it will direct you to Pakaanu site. Members are also more than welcomed to attend Director Meetings to gain an insight to the discussions for building the Pakaanu Aboriginal Corporation. Now the structure of our organisation consists of our senior members from the community

Senior Members: Bruce Smith, Doreen Harris, Dorothy Newberry, Heather Edwards and Joan Mitchell.

Board Members: Shaneane Weldon (Chairperson), Janice Scott (V/Chairperson), Shari O'Donoghue (Secretary), Tasharni Roe (Treasurer), Lauren Seelander, Eric Thomas, Max Forrest and Karen Dear.

Now one of the key strategies that the Corporation has taking upon oneself is the appointment of an **Independent Director** in Catherine Halbert. Now Cath is Canberra based and comes with a wealth of government experience and will be an asset in the strengthening of our organisation.

The Pakaanu Aboriginal Corporation is currently situated at the Laverton Leonora Cross Cultural Association (LLCCA) and is building on the good collaboration with other key stakeholders. To be transparent the Pakaanu Group has an open governance style in developing a positive vision for its members. We certainly encourage members to communicate on any issues or impacts that you may need assistance with. Our profile as a Corporation is there to assist any members in any capacity to make changes in their lives, especially around family and children.

Easy prawn noodle soup

Serves 4

Ingredients

- 2 spring onions, cut into matchsticks
- 2 cups (500ml) vegetable stock
- 200g vermicelli rice noodles
- 350g cooked prawns tail on, thawed
- 1 bunch buk choy, quartered length ways



Method

1. Place the spring onion in a bowl. Cover with iced water. Set aside for ten minutes or until curled then drain.

- The goldfish is the most popular aquarium fish in the world
