Mothers Day Facts

Mother's Day, as we know it today, began in North America and was pioneered by two women: Julia Ward Howe and Anna Jarvis. Julia Ward Howe's quest to create a holiday dedicated to mothers and peace began in 1870, a time of civil war in North America. Howe wanted mothers to come together to stop their sons from fighting against each other. However, Howe's version of Mothers Day only lasted a few years.

Jarvis believed so strongly in Mothers Day that she even left her job to commit herself to having it recognized throughout the United States. Her hard work paid off in 1914 when Mothers Day was finally recognised nationally, with an official celebration date of the second Sunday in May.

Mothers Day in Australia is very much like the day Jarvis worked to create in the United States. However, in Australia we have our own special Mothers Day guardian. Janet Hayden was a woman who lived in Sydney and often visited a friend in hospital. In 1923, while at the hospital, she was struck by the number of patients who were lonely, ageing mothers, and campaigned for people to donate presents to them. School children and local businesses generously donated all sorts of goodies to the mothers.

- * Today, Mothers Day is celebrated in over seventy nations around the world.
- * Every year, Australians spend about \$1.36 Billion on Mothers Day and \$660 Million on Fathers Day.
- * Approximately 122 million phone calls are made on Mothers Day.
- * In Ethiopia, Mothers Day is celebrated at the end of the Rainy Season, as part of the three day Antrosht festival, dedicated to mums.
- * In Serbia, Mothers Day is a part of a three day national holiday which also includes Children's Day and Fathers Day. On Children's day, Children are tied up and must agree to behave before they are unbound. On Mothers Day, It is the mums turn to be tied up, where she will remain until she supplies yummy treats and small gifts to her children. Finally, it's the fathers turn, the Dads are tied up with rope until they give their families Christmas gifts. After all this is done, everyone enjoys a large feast.

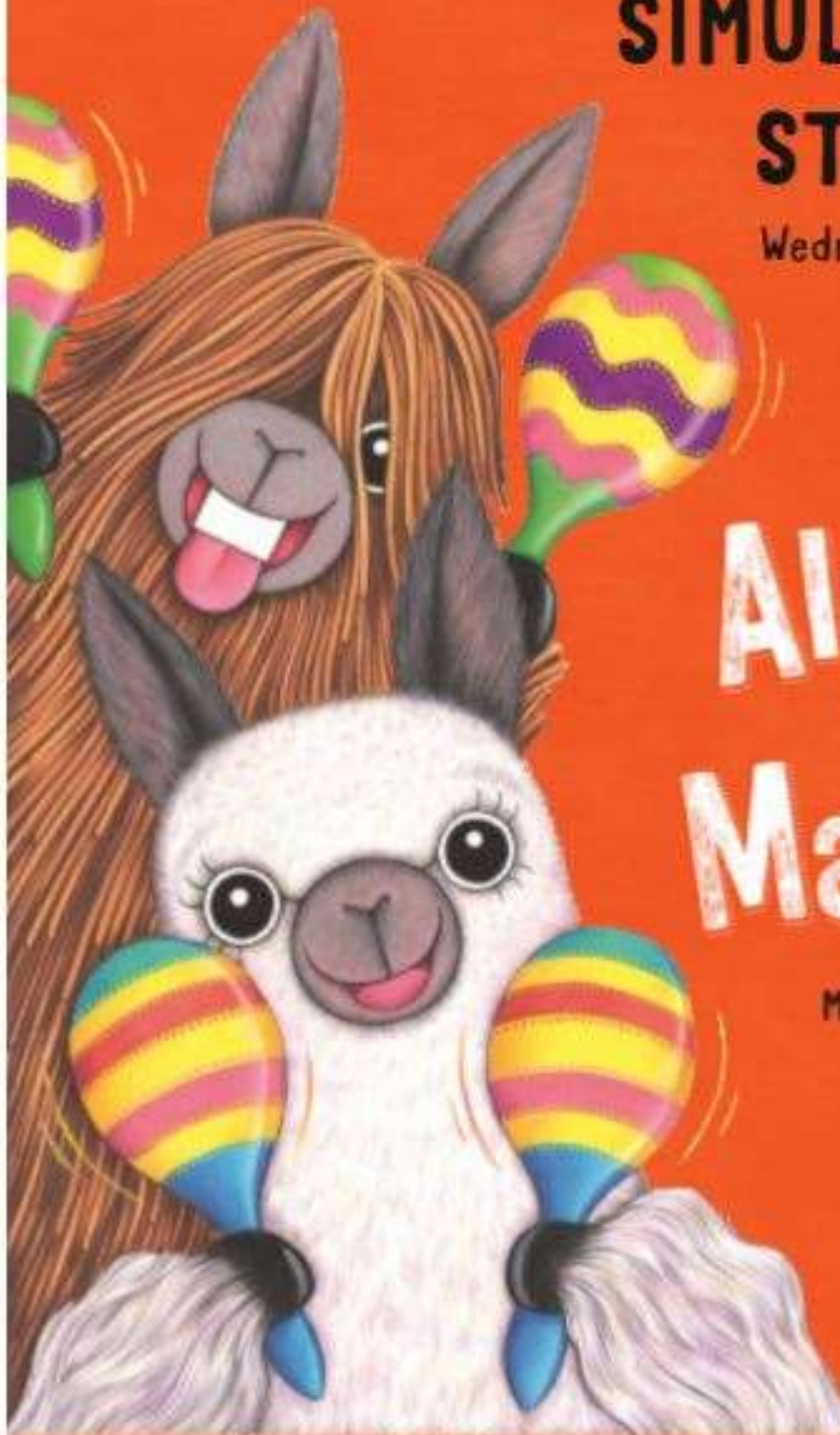

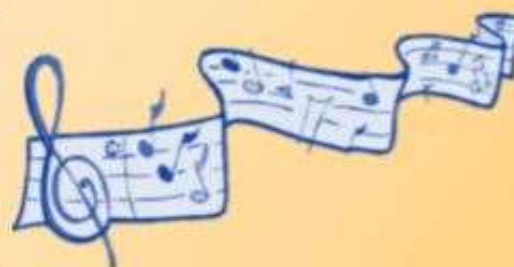

At the age of sixteen Robin Scott came from Scotland with his parents to Western Australia, where he enrolled as an apprentice electrician. Immensely proud of his trade, Robin has worked for more than 30 years as an electrical contractor to the WA mining industry, especially in the Goldfields. Flying himself and his staff to electrical contracting assignments, Robin logged

4,000 hours in his Rockwell Commander, the aircraft he now uses to service his constituents in the vast Mining and Pastoral Region.

Robin is an enthusiastic campaigner for job opportunities through creating more apprenticeships for young men and young women. The Federal Government has partially embraced the Pauline Hanson's One Nation policy of subsidising apprentice wages 75% in the first year, 50% in the second year and 25% in the third year.

Robin Scott moved the Disallowance Motion which defeated the Government's attempt to increase the Gold Royalty by 50%. Robin is determined to protect and promote mining and led the defence against water charges for prospectors and small miners.

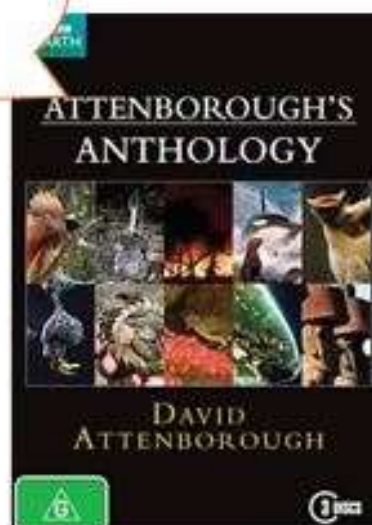
Teen Titans GO! The movie. PG

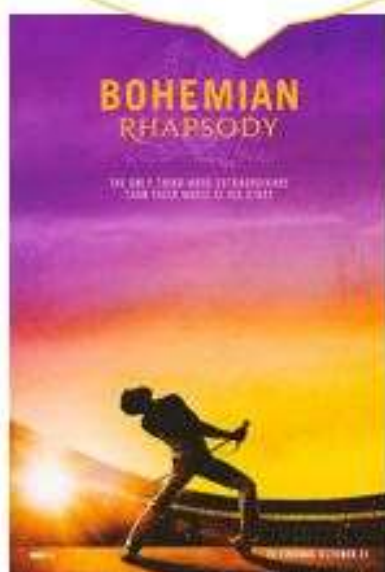

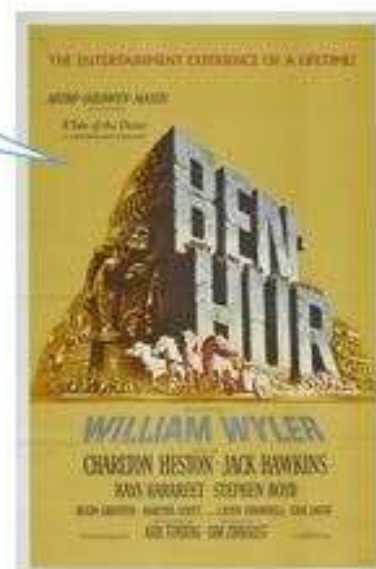

- Screws: Zenith 18mm solid brass countersunk head wood screws: 20 pack = \$3.98
- PVC pipe: Holman 90mm x 3m PVC stormwater pipe = \$9.94
- Timber: Treated pine outdoor timber 70 x 35mm: \$3.65/per linear metre



Apricot Bliss Balls

Ingredients:

- 200g dried apricots, coarsely chopped
- 2 Tablespoons white chia seeds
- 125ml (1/2 cup) fresh orange juice
- 10 medjool dates, pitted
- 75g (3/4 cup) rolled oats
- 70g (1/2 cup) grated carrots
- 2 Tablespoons moist coconut flakes: Plus;
- 20g (1/3 cup) Moist coconut flakes (for coating)
- Pinch of ground cinnamon

Method:

1. Combine the apricot, chia seeds and orange juice in a shallow dish. Set aside, stirring occasionally, for 15 minutes to soak.
2. Transfer apricot mixture to a food processor. Add the dates, oats, carrots, coconut and cinnamon. Process until finely chopped and evenly combined.
3. Place extra coconut on a plate. Roll even tablespoons of the mixture into balls and roll into coconut. Store in an airtight container in the fridge .
4. Can be stored for up to four days in the fridge or up to one month in the freezer.

Zucchini Slice

Ingredients:

- 5 eggs
- 375g zucchini
- 3 bacon rashers
- 1 onion
- 1 cup self raising flour, sifted
- 1 cup grated cheese
- 1/2 cup oil
- Salt and pepper

Method:

1. Preheat oven to 180° (160° fan forced). In a large bowl, lightly whisk eggs. Grate zucchini coarsely. Finely chop onion and bacon.
2. Combine zucchini, onion, bacon, cheese, sifted flour, oil and lightly beaten eggs.
3. Season with salt and pepper and pour into a well greased lamington tin.
4. Bake in moderate oven for 30-40 minutes or until nicely browned.























- Goldfish exist in every continent except for Antarctica, but can survive in cold temperatures.
