

### New funding to expand Laverton's Visitor Centre

### Laverton community thrilled by funding announcement

Tuesday 10 September 2019

The Great Beyond Visitor Centre in Laverton will soon see their expansion plans become a reality after Premier Mark McGowan announced a State Government contribution of \$1.3m to the project.

The Premier and Regional Development Minister Alannah MacTiernan, together with local Member for Mining & Pastoral Kyle McGinn, visited Laverton to announce the \$2.6m project, co-funded by the Shire of Laverton. Laverton Shire President, Patrick Hill, said "after years of planning and seeking funding, it is a fantastic outcome for our town. The Great Beyond is the heart of Laverton and the expansion of the Centre will allow the Shire to cater to the growing number of visitors, particularly those travelling the Outback Way."

"With funding committed to seal the Outback Way in the near future, Laverton is expected to attract an additional 32,000 plus visitors per year. The Shire has a number of projects under way that will improve visitor experiences and hopefully increase their length of stay the Goldfields, with the expansion of the Great Beyond as a priority."

Expansion to the Centre will include a new entry foyer, merchandise area and café; expanded administration office, public amenities and storage areas; improved

disability access to interpretive displays; undercover alfresco dining space; and the Giles Oasis cultural garden and interactive displays.

Visitor Centre Manager, Laurinda Hill, said "in 2015, the Great Beyond was fortunate enough to receive substantial funding from the Regional Visitor Centre Sustainability Grants administered by Tourism Western Australia. This allowed us to create architectural drawings, plans and tender documents for the expansion. Without this funding, we would not have been able to attract this type of investment from the McGowan Government."

While in Laverton Mr McGowan and Ms MacTiernan had a tour of the Great Beyond's Explorers Hall of Fame, Ms MacTiernan commented "Laverton's Visitor Centre will enrich the traveller experience and boost visitor numbers, creating economic and social benefits for the local community and the region."

"The Visitor Centre is integral to the social amenity of the town and serves as an important community meeting space and only café in Laverton."

Mr McGinn congratulated the Laverton Community, "any traveller that has been through Laverton in the past few years knows how hard the team at the Visitor Centre currently work, and how much they are able to offer with their current resources. This investment will make a huge difference and will mean the Centre can accommodate the influx of visitors through the region."

"The history that is shared within the Centre provides a true reflection of the amazing story that Laverton has to tell. The Outback Way will open the gates to greater tourism opportunities for Laverton and this project is perfect to continue to stimulate the local area as the tourists flow through."

Given that the design phase of this project has been completed, the Shire of Laverton are planning to move forward as soon as possible. Approximately 17 jobs will be created during construction on the project, as well as another 8 ongoing jobs at the upgraded Centre.

It has been a particularly successful month for Laverton in the tourism sector with the town also being announced as a finalist in the GWN7 Top Tourism Town Awards, which will be announced later this month at a ceremony in Karratha.

### IS A HERD OF MOOSE CALLED A MEESE?



The plural for Moose is not Meese. It is moose. Which seems funny as the plural for goose is geese, but according to the readers digest, the word moose was incorporated into the English language from several native american languages with little or no modification during the early 1600s. The word Goose, dates back to a thousand years before the word moose, when old English was the only form of English. Back then pluralization was different, mutations and sound changes to words would dictate whether or not certain words were plural or singular.







- Moose have a life span of 15-25 Years
- The Moose is the largest member of the Deer family
- . Only male moose grow antiers and these can spread as far as 6FT across.

- · In Alaska, more people are injured by Moose than Bears each year.
- · A female Moose is called a Cow and a Male Moose is called a Bull
- · Moose can run up to 56 Kilometers an hour.
- Moose are good at swimming, and have been seen to swim several miles at a time as well as fully submerging their head under water for 30 seconds.
