2020 Welcome

Well here we are and the 2020 year is well and truly upon us. I hope everybody had a great Xmas / New Year period and are looking forward to the new year with much enthusiasm.

Itinerant Campers

I understand there was much frustration and angst amongst the local community with the influx of itinerant campers in and around Laverton over the Xmas / New Year period.

Whilst I can acknowledge and understand the many comments I have received in regards to the campers' anti-social behavior (and other deplorable activities), there is a valid reason as to why action wasn't taken for a period to move the people on.

Due to planned visits by Hon Robin Scott MLC, Member for Mining & Pastoral Region, on Monday 16th December 2019, and Senator Jacqui Lambie on Tuesday 21st January 2020, it provided an opportunity to portray to the politicians the various problems the transient people cause whilst visiting Laverton and to help gain their support for future actions.

Whilst the period of disruption was at times far from comfortable and caused some grief for many of the local community I am of the opinion that we needed to follow that process to enable the politicians to witness first-hand and visualize the issues created and thus be in a position to support both the Shire and Pakaanu Aboriginal Corporation in applications to establish a transient camp on the outskirts of town and an Aboriginal Ranger Program for Laverton, which will help create a short term fix with longer term opportunities.

In addition to this information both the Police and an Aboriginal Elder were visiting the campers on a daily basis over the period to ascertain their plans and to try and get them to return to Warburton, but unfortunately without success.

Following the visit by Jacqui Lambie, a meeting was held with the Police OIC, Emma Barnes, and representatives from the Pakaanu Aboriginal Corporation to discuss the problem and work out a strategy to move the people on.

This commenced on the Thursday afternoon and into Friday with the Pakaanu Aboriginal Corporation supplying fuel for the vehicles to leave Laverton and Council agreeing to top the vehicles up with fuel, if need be, at the Tjukayirla Roadhouse to keep them moving on to Warburton (and beyond).

I am more than happy to discuss this matter with members of the public if you feel the need to do so.



Cattle Wandering at large

Unfortunately cattle continue to wander at large through the Laverton townsite. It was hoped that with the recent rainfall the problem may have been alleviated however as we know cattle are creatures of habit and the wandering has continued. Council is continuing work with the pastoral stations to bring this problem to an end.

I acknowledge that it is / has been annoying for local residents but believe me Council feels the pain as well due to damage to the oval and destruction of many plants around town.

We will continue to do our best.

Airfield Apron Upgrade

This project is well underway and we look forward to its completion around the end of March early April. The project is proving very much in need as we have been experiencing some congestion at the airfield with additional charter movements.

Executive Manager Technical Services

Mr Greg Stephens has been appointed to the EMTS position and will commence with the Shire on Tuesday 3rd March 2020. Greg comes with a great deal of experience having worked in similar positions in various areas within the local government sector, the most recent being the Flinders Ranges Council in South Australia.

Mr Wayne Butler, who has been acting in the EMTS position since Les' departure 5 December 2019, will finish up on Friday 6 March 2020. We thank Wayne for his committed efforts whilst occupying the EMTS seat.

General Matters

Various other works continue and these include, but not limited to:

- Renewal of Lease with the Commonwealth Government for the Centrelink Building
- Refurbishment of the Old Court House Building
- Negotiating a new lease with St John Ambulance WA Australia for the Laverton Sub Centre property

Works and Services

Some of the current activities in the Works and Services area include:

 Maintenance grading on the full length of the Laverton Shire section of the Great Central Road. In addition, distance markers have been placed along the length of the road from Laverton to the Shire boundary.

- The reseal of SLK 46.50 on the Bandya Road has been completed along with gravel re-construction/re-sheeting of a section of road between SLK15.00 and SLK22.50.
- The Mt Weld Road construction work was completed and the road sealed in Mid-January. However, a section sustained significant damage, due to a rain event, soon after completion. This, along with damage a number of other roads, will form the nucleus of a claim to DFES for storm damage grant funding.
- WANDRRA 2018 reinstatement works have already been undertaken on Bandya, Erlistoun, and Erlistoun-Nambi Roads, with additional works expected to be completed by June 2020 on Prenti Downs, Lake Wells and Great Central Roads.
- The Shire is currently awaiting quotes for repairs to the Main Street lighting.
- Shade cloth protection has been installed around the Swimming Pool fence line and the adjacent car parking area has been sealed to help reduce sand / dust blowing into the Pool.
- Currently asphalt works are being undertaken at Wedgewood Close, Cumba Close, the intersection of Laverton-Leonora Road/Lancefield Road and the floodway crossing on the Great Central Road adjacent to Boomers Camp.
- For the next few months, Council's Construction Crew will be undertaking re-construction/re-sheeting works on the Great Central Road, between SLK143.00 and SLK151.00.







This workshop is for anyone aged 18 and over who wants to develop the skills to recognise these invitations and take action by connecting them with life-saving resources. 












HON ROBIN SCOTT MLC OF KALGOORLIE-BOULDER Member for Mining and Pastoral





Quit for new life

Planning to have a baby or discovering you're pregnant can be one of the best moments in your life. This is the time to change to a healthier lifestyle for you and your family. Having a balanced diet, taking the right medication and participating in physical activity are some ways to get healthy. But the most important change you can make for yourself and your family is monitoring your use of tobacco smoking and exposure to second-hand smoke.

According to the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW), around 12% of women smoked at some time during their pregnancy. The smoking rates were higher among younger mothers (34%) and Aboriginal women (47%).

Smoking during pregnancy is harmful to the health of both the mother and the unborn child. Cigarette smoke contains more than 7000 chemicals, including lead, nicotine, cyanide, cadmium, mercury, carbon monoxide and tar. Around 70 of these chemicals are known to cause cancer. These chemicals travel to the unborn baby through absorption into the mother's blood and disturbs the supply of essential nutrients to both the mother and baby, increasing the risk of potential health problems. Carbon monoxide reduces oxygen supply leading to poor development of baby. In fact, smoking during pregnancy can lead to just some of these problems:

Lower birth weight (underdeveloped organs including lungs, heart and brain);

Premature birth (being born too early);

Miscarriage;

Stillbirth (baby is not alive when born);

Increased risk of SIDS (sudden infant death syndrome); and

Babies are at higher risk of getting asthma, high blood pressure and diabetes.

These complications can also develop if pregnant women and newborn babies are exposed to passive (second-hand) smoking. Smoking after pregnancy can also harm a baby as these chemicals easily transfer through breast milk.

Stopping smoking is the best thing you can do for yourself and your baby. It is financially rewarding and socially acceptable too. It can be difficult for some people to quit, and especially hard while pregnant, but having strong motivation and determination will benefit you, your baby and your entire family.

Some practical steps to take if you are regularly exposed to smokers and to protect your family from passive smoking include:

Wherever possible, move away from people who are smoking, or stay in non-smoking areas;

Make your home and car smoke-free; and

Put up 'No Smoking' signs around the house.

Talk to your doctor, midwife or health practitioner for more information and support. Call Quitline on 13 78 48 for a free professional and confidential counselling service. You can also use "Quit for you, Quit for two" smartphone app for further support and encouragement. Contact Bega Tobacco Action Team on 9022 5500 for information and support on quitting smoking. We are running 'My Smoke-free Pregnancy Competition' to encourage pregnant mums to quit smoking. You can win up to \$500 worth of prizes if you cut down or quit smoking during pregnancy.
