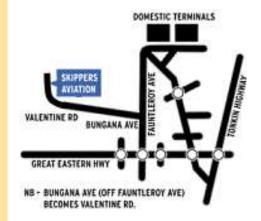

Hello from Laverton Police station

In this month's edition I want to provide some information about a couple of changes to our professional presence.

The Western Australian Police Force is always looking at new strategies and methods for continuous improvement to better train, equip and manage officers so they are fully capable and prepared to undertake their duty and to be an exceptional Police Force for our community.



Part of that continuous improvement involves the Commissioner of Police recently rolling out two very important pieces of equipment which are;

Body Worn Camera (BWC) and Body Armour.

The use of this equipment is governed by legislation and police policy and its use is there for the safety and protection of police officers and members of the community alike.

Body Worn Camera (BWC)

The body worn camera is an independent witness capturing everything in its line of sight and audible range, providing corroboration to evidence obtained during an investigation.

As per police policy, we are required to wear the BWC when we are performing certain functions of our duty.

A BWC is both a listening device and an optical surveillance device for the purposes of the Surveillance Devices Act 1998 (WA). Under the Surveillance Devices Act there are very clear laws as to how, when and where they can be used.

So, what is the purpose of the BWC?

It assists in capturing evidence and/or facts pertinent to an operational matter.

It provides transparency and a factual record of actions and events.

It improves the interaction with a member of the public or community.

When can or will Laverton Police officers be recording with BWC?

The use of BWC in a public place

While in a public place and as long as the recording is not of a private conversation or activity that is carried out in circumstances that may reasonably be taken to indicate that the activity or conversation is only to be observed or listened to by the parties themselves, then any person is entitled to record a conversation or activity with the provision that they inform the involved parties of the recoding.

Therefore, when officers from Laverton Police are in a public place and they feel there is a need to record using BWC, we will begin recording and will provide a verbal announcement (if it is safe and practicable to do so) similar to, "'I am using a Body Worn Camera and we are currently being recorded'.

The use of BWC in a private place

If police are entering a private place in the execution of a lawful authority, such as, the execution of a search warrant, entering a premise to search for an arrestable person, entering a premise to search for anything relevant to a serious offence after a person is under arrest for a serious offence or acting under any other lawful authority, then the officers at Laverton Police will be recording using BWC. Again, in this instance the officers will provide a verbal announcement of the use of the BWC, if it is safe and practicable to do so.

If the officers enter a private place and not in the execution of a lawful authority, they will request occupiers consent to record using BWC. If consent is refused or withdrawn officers will cease to record using BWC.

It is safe to assume during interaction with police you will be recorded. In any instance the officers will advise you of the recording.

If you have any questions or concerns about the BWC please feel free to ask the officer or attend the police station and speak to myself or Sergeant James Brooks and will be more than happy to address any questions.

Body Armour

Policing can be a dangerous job with the unpredictability of human behaviours especially those affected by intoxicants, people suffering from mental health issues or those who are under undue or severe emotional stressors.

It is the responsibility of the Commissioner of Police to ensure officers have the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment to safely undertake their duties. After a number of years of study and research the agency has released Body Armour that will do just this.

We are fortunate enough in Laverton not to have many of the inherent policing risks that exist in other parts of the state however we are equipped should the need arise. It is the Commissioners policy that all officers are to wear Body Armour when on operational duty and as such they now form part of our everyday uniform.

In a medical emergency, time is always of the essence. Often when officers are having to provide a first aid response they can be some distance from their patrol vehicles which have first aid response kits. The delay in providing initial first aid can sometimes be the difference between life and death.

One of the major benefits to the Body Armour is the first aid pouches that are equipped so officers can handle, as a first responder, some major traumas. This is until of course medical assistance arrives or the casualty is taken to hospital. The officers at Laverton Police have undergone additional training in able to provide a faster more effective response when dealing with serious bodily injuries.

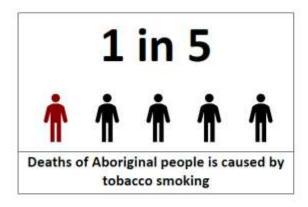
Say NO to Smoking

How often do you hear that "I won't get addicted, I only smoke socially" or "I know smoking is bad for me, I can stop when I'm older" or "I'll put on weight if I stop smoking"? If this is your child, you must help them to stop smoking.

People who start smoking at younger age are more likely to become regular smokers; smoke more heavily; have difficulties quitting; and are at greater risk of getting smoking-related diseases. Most adult smokers say they wish they had never started and that they would like to stop. Young people often do not realise how quickly a person can become 'addicted' to smoking.

Tobacco smoking is the most preventable cause of ill-health and early death in Australia. According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS), smoking rates are much higher in Aboriginal populations (38%), prison inmates (79%), people with mental illness (32-60%) and people living in remote areas (up to 70%). Smoking is the leading cause of chronic diseases among Aboriginal people and is responsible for 1 in 5 deaths. The report from National Drug Research Institute (NDRI) at Curtin University suggest that smoking led to 20,000 preventable deaths and accounted for \$137 billion social costs in 2015-16.





There are many reasons why children and teenagers smoke, including:

- Copy parents or siblings who smoke
- Peer pressure
- Experimenting
- Look matured
- Copy movie stars
- Curiosity
- Socialise / be part of the group

Tobacco smoke contains more than 7000 chemicals and 70 of them are known to cause cancer. Some of these chemicals are also found in batteries, insecticide, paint, candle, car exhaust and toilet cleaner.

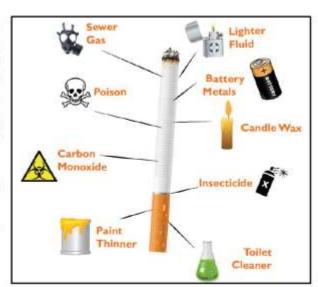

When you breathe in cigarette smoke, these chemicals enter in your lungs and spread through your body. Smoking harms nearly every organ of the body and cause serious illness, including 16 types of cancer, heart diseases, lung diseases and eye diseases. Every person who breathes in cigarette smoke (second-hand smoke) is more likely to get these diseases. Younger smokers can experience health problems including:

- Dull skin, wrinkles on face, stained teeth, bad breath and smelly hairs
- Lung infection, shortness of breath, coughing, phlegm production and wheezing
- Headache, backache, sleep disorders
- · Difficulty in concentration
- Emotional and psychological disorders
- · Poor physical fitness and lack of stamina
- Dental problems
- Weak bones and muscles



The best thing you can do for you and your family is - **DON'T START SMOKING** in the first place. Parents can help children and teenagers by:

- Setting a healthy example being / becoming non-smoker
- Discussing negative effects of smoking and advantages of being smoke-free
- Making your home and car smoke-free
- Helping children and teenagers practice refusal skills

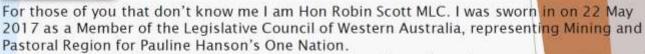

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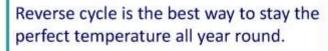
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Cookies and cream cheese cake cookies

Ingredients for 12 cookies

- · 115g Cream cheese, softened
- 8 Tablespoons salted butter, room temperature
- 3/4 Cup sugar (150g)
- 1 Cup flour (125g)
- 10 Cookies, crushed



Method

- In a mixing bowl blend, cream cheese, butter, and sugar until fully combined.
- Add flour to cream cheese mixture and continue to blend together until fully combined.
- 3. Add crushed cookies to the mixture and gently fold together, ensue the cheesecake batter is fully mixed.
- 4. Cover with plastic wrap and chill in refrigerator for 30 minutes, or until batter is firm to touch.
- 5. Pre heat oven to 180°C.
- 6. Roll batter into small balls and place on a baking paper lined baking sheet.
- Using your fingers or a warm spoon press down on he dough balls to help form a cookie shape.
- 8. Bake for 12-15 minutes or until cookies urn golden brown on the bottom.
- 9. Place cookies on a cooling rack and rest for atleast 5 minutes.

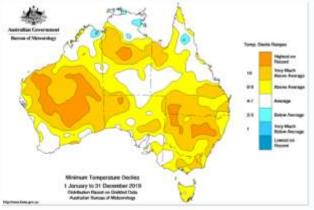

What causes seasons?

The Earth's tilted axis causes the seasons. Throughout the year, different parts of Earth receive the Sun's most direct rays. So, when the Northern Hemisphere tilts toward the Sun, it's summer in the Northern Hemisphere, When the Southern Hemisphere tilts toward the Sun, it's Winter in the Northern Hemisphere. Australia is in the Southern Hemisphere and currently - the Northern Hemisphere is facing the sun so that means it is Winter in Australia.

While regular snowfall in Western Australia is uncommon, For the first time in 49 years, and not even during winter Perth locals experienced snowfall in the Stirling Ranges during April 2019.





Australia's seasons are at opposite times to those in the northern hemisphere. December to February is summer; March to May is autumn; June to August is winter; and September to November is spring.

The lowest temperature ever recorded in Australia was –23.0 °C at Charlotte Pass on 29 June 1994 in the Snowy Mountains.
