2020/2021 Budget Highlights



Key Highlights

The following are some of the key highlights in the 2020/2021 Budget for the Shire of Laverton.

Airport

Council continues to improve the infrastructure at the Laverton Airport to complement the additional apron and taxiway completed in May 2020. Subject to funding, turning nodes are planned to be constructed at each end of the runway to allow larger capacity aircraft to land. The works have a budget provision of \$300,000.



Medical Services

Council continues to provide significant financial support to secure a doctor for the Laverton Community. This would not be possible without the support of a number of mining companies in the region. The cost to Council to support the medical services in the 2020/2021 Budget is approximately \$280,000. Council continues to lobby the State Government to ensure the community gets the new hospital it deserves.



Capital Equipment

Capital Equipment, to support the upgrade and maintenance of road and other infrastructure, will see Council spend \$542,000 on the purchase of heavy plant this year.



Roads

Road infrastructure continues to consume a substantial portion of the Council's budget. Notable works planned for the 2020/2021 year include:

- General Road Maintenance including Great Central Rd - \$1.85 million
- Bandya Road, Lancefield Diversion Road, Old Laverton Road and Laverton-Mt Margaret Road - \$603,000
- Bandya Road Flood Crossing at Gum Creek - \$626,100
- Hawks Place footpath \$30,000 incorporating linking the pathway to the water tank lookout

Other Infrastructure

- Town Entry Statement works - adjacent to the Industrial area (Laverton-Leonora Rd) - \$100,000
- CCTV Upgrade - \$150,000
- Fire Shed - \$250,000
- 4 x 4 Fire Unit - \$250,000
- Laverton Oval Fencing - \$30,000
- Dog Exercise Area - \$35,000
- Laver Place Streetscaping - \$40,000
- Solar Power Installation at the Swimming Pool and Coach House - \$160,000



Buildings

Council building assets such as the Old Coach House, Old Police Station and the Great Beyond Visitor Centre continue to be upgraded. Following the announcement by Premier Mark McGowan in September 2019 of \$1.3 million in grant funding for the expansion of the GBVC, Council has matched this provision which will see works totalling \$2.6 million spent in this Budget year.



Festivals / Events

Festivals and events continue to play an important role to the Community with Australia Day, Anzac Day and the Laverton Races being supported financially by Council. Unfortunately, the planned Laverfest has been deferred to September 2021.



Cemetery

Council has once again allocated \$30,000 for the Friends of the Laverton Cemetery Advisory Group (FLCAG) to continue its work in bringing the cemetery infrastructure up to an acceptable standard.



Rates

As with previous years' budgets, Council rates involves Elected Members in discussion regarding raising rates and the implications and impact of the Council's decision.

This year, this matter was taken out of Council's hands by the State Government with its COVID-19 Order which directed that Councils in Western Australia must keep the rate in the dollar at 2019/2020 levels. The same directive applied to all Council Fees and Charges.

Council has approved rate income of \$5,698,900 in the 2020/2021 budget. This is still an overall increase in rates from last year which is as a result of revaluation of Pastoral and Mining assessments. Minimum rates are unchanged from 2019/2020 levels.

The impact on ratepayers will vary significantly, depending upon any changes to their valuation base by the Valuer General. Staff are willing and able to assist with any questions on this matter.

Several of the projects within this year's Budget will continue Council's long-term goal of building capacity within the local community.

The Turning Nodes planned at each end of the Airport Runway will allow larger planes to land, turn and take-off safely allowing for greater numbers of workers and visitors alike in the area.

The expansion of the Great Beyond Visitor Centre is a major coup for Laverton in obtaining grant funding through the Dept. Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) of \$1.3 million which is half of the anticipated construction cost.

I am looking forward to completion of works on the Old Coach House Building, a project that started earlier in 2020 and it may result in part of the building being tenanted. It is a credit to all concerned to see this wonderful building looking something like it did many years ago.

My thanks are extended to the CEO, Peter Naylor and his hard-working staff in compiling the 2020/2021 Budget document in an environment impacted by COVID-19 and look forward to the delivery of the projects and services planned for the year.

In closing, I would welcome your contact with Councillors and/or the CEO to discuss any part of the budget.

The full Budget document is very comprehensive in its nature and can be complex to navigate. Assistance is available should you wish to know more detail within the Budget or you can review the document at the Administration Office or the Library.

Chicken Alfredo Gnocchi Bake

Ingredients

serves 4

- 25g unsalted butter
- 500g chicken breast, diced
- 2 eschalot, finely chopped
- 2 cloves of garlic, crushed
- 500g potato gnocchi
- 1 cup grated pizza cheese
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves
- 1 pinch salt and pepper, to taste



Method

1. Melt butter in a large frying pan over medium - high heat. Add chicken, eschalots. cook, stirring for 3-4 minutes or until chicken is lightly browned. Add garlic and cook for 1 minute. Add cream. Bring to a simmer. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer for 3-4 minutes or until sauce thickens slightly. Remove from heat. stir in a third of the cheese. season with salt and pepper.
2. Meanwhile, cook gnocchi in a large saucepan of boiling water. Following packet directions or until gnocchi just floats to the surface. reserve 1/2 cup of pasta water. drain gnocchi. Add parsley, gnocchi and reserved pasta water to chicken mixture. Toss to combine. Spoon gnocchi into a 6 cup oven proof dish. Sprinkle with the remaining cheese.
3. Preheat grill to high. Cook gnocchi under the grill for 5 minutes or untill cheese is golden.

Workplace Learning in Laverton!

Exciting times continue for senior students at Laverton School who study through the School of Isolated and Distance Education (**SIDE**). They use the Workplace Learning (**WPL**) program, which involves on-the-job training, to help them transition into the world of work post school.

WPL is a program where students can access the world of work exploring different career paths and developing core employability skills. It assists students to become competitive in the employment and training market. The beauty of the program is that it also contributes towards the Western Australian Certificate of Education (**WACE**). So it is a win, win situation all round for the students.

Research has suggested that secondary school students who undertake Workplace Learning are among the most likely to be in full-time permanent employment five years later.

Choosing the right career pathway post-secondary schooling can make a substantial difference to students looking for a seamless transition from school into part-time or full-time employment.

Research conducted by the Department of Employment indicates that ***"the completion of on-the-job training, while at school, is a key aspect in improving the employment prospects of young Australians."***

Krystal Thompson is one of seven students participating in **WPL** who are based at Laverton School. Krystal says ***"My work placement has really helped me get involved in things I probably never would have previously. The support from my employer has been phenomenal! They have provided me with relevant on-the-job training in a safe and healthy environment"***.

"The support of local youth by local employers is fantastic" says SIDE Workplace Learning Coordinator, Shane Murray. The Laverton Shire is at the leading edge in offering high school students exciting and relevant training options and should be held up as a role model for other regional towns to follow their lead.

Peter Naylor, Chief Executive Officer, of the Laverton Shire says ***"the opportunity to engage Krystal under***

the WPL Program has been extremely successful. Krystal has embraced the program with a great deal of endeavour and is very enthusiastic with her work at the Laverton Aquatic Centre. The WPL program certainly helps the Shire to provide Krystal with a wonderful opportunity to establish a career pathway and future role within our workforce. We look forward to this evolving".

Cr Patrick Hill, President of the Laverton Shire says ***"Krystal Thompson is well known to me and I am proud that the Shire has been able to employ her through the WPL program. The feedback I have received from Shire staff is that Krystal is really enthusiastic and has fitted in very well at the aquatic centre, with her peers, and she is a credit to herself"***.

The school-to-work program has many hidden advantages to all stakeholders; students, parents, the school and local community.

This together with additional people passing through town for various reasons including spending of additional stimulus payments has made July particularly busier than previous years.



Through all that is going on with our tasking demands, we have commenced our involvement again with Nightfields footy, in particular working with the younger youth. Both Sergeants Brooks and Jenkins are playing active parts in running the program on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 3pm to 4pm. At the conclusion of the sports there is a BBQ and everyone goes home with a full belly. I would like to thank all of the police staff that are giving up their time to be involved, along with the teachers and Lauren and Bunz who facilitate coordinating the youth. If you are free between the times and would like to donate your time, come down to the station and have a chat regarding what is involved. The school term will be finished with a disco as well.

I think it is also timely to let you all know a little of how our tasking priorities are determined. Unlike retail where you stand in a que or take a number for service, unfortunately emergency service response is not the same. 3.13 Intersections

Intersections can be very dangerous places – so be careful.

There are different types of intersections and for each type there are rules which help to reduce the danger. Know the rules, stay alert and drive at a safe speed.

3.13.1 Controlled intersections

A controlled intersection is an intersection that has:

- traffic control signals;
- a 'STOP' or 'GIVE WAY' sign;
- a roundabout; or
- a Police Officer or other authorised person directing traffic.

At an intersection controlled by traffic control signals be prepared to stop if the light changes to yellow or red.

At an intersection controlled by a 'GIVE WAY' sign, give way to all traffic travelling along or turning from the intersecting road.

At an intersection controlled by a 'STOP' sign, you must stop your vehicle and give way to all traffic travelling along or turning from the intersecting road.

You will notice a line marked across the road before the intersection where there are 'STOP' signs. You must stop at the line.

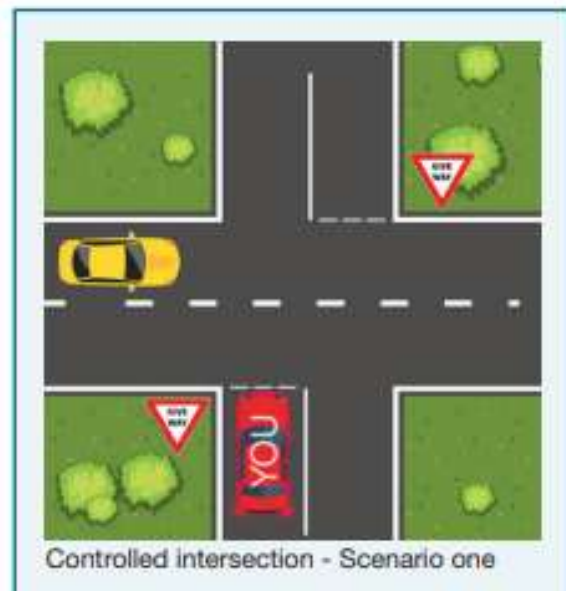
If for some reason you have to stop back from the 'STOP' line, you must stop again as close as you can before the line when you move forward.

If there is no line, stop as close to the intersection as practicable but before entering it.

Give way to all traffic coming from the left or right, including turning vehicles.

YOU must give way to Car A and Car C. Car B must give way to **YOU**, Car A and Car C.

When a Police Officer or an authorised person is directing traffic, take your directions from that person. Their directions overrule traffic control signals and signs. If their back is towards you, you must stop your vehicle and wait for instructions before driving on.



3.16 Overtaking

Overtaking other vehicles is one of the most dangerous driving manoeuvres. Only overtake when it is safe to do so. If you are not sure, wait.

You must not exceed the speed limit to overtake. You must not cross continuous lines to overtake (where the line is a single continuous line, continuous line on the left of a broken line, or double continuous lines).

3.16.1 When can you overtake?

You can **overtake a vehicle on the left** only when:

- you are directed to do so by a Police Officer or other authorised person;
- you are on a multi-lane road and it is safe to do so; and
- a vehicle is indicating/signalling that it is turning right. You can also overtake any vehicles that are stationary behind it.

You can **overtake a vehicle on the right** when you are both travelling in the same direction and it is safe and legal to do so.



3.16.2 When you must not overtake

You must not overtake another vehicle when:

- it has slowed down or stopped at a railway, pedestrian or children's crossing;
- it has stopped at an intersection (unless the driver signals that they are turning left or right) and it is safe to do so;
- there is a 'NO OVERTAKING' sign; and
- you are nearing a blind bend or the crest of a hill, or you do not have a good view of the road ahead.



You must not cross single continuous dividing lines or continuous dividing lines on your side of broken lines or double continuous dividing lines, to overtake a moving vehicle.















