Shire News

Main Street Project Update

The contractors, Quadrio Earth Moving, completed their first swing on Sunday 23/4/2017 and works will be recommencing on Tuesday 2nd May 2017. Much of the first swing was spent removing kerbing from sections of the road to be widened and locating existing services and cables and putting in conduit to take reticulation and power cables. We would like to thank the community for your patience whilst these works are in progress and ask that you continue to obey signage and follow the traffic controller's directions whenever work is taking place on the road or nearby verge. Paving bricks have been ordered and they will take approximately 6 weeks to be delivered.

Laverton Community Hub Update

Architects Gresley Abas have been appointed to prepare the construction plans for the Laverton Community Hub. They will be coming to Laverton early in May to undertake a site inspection and to meet with Shire representatives to discuss the project.

Flood Plain Development Strategy

In February 2011 Laverton experienced a significant flood event which posed a number of risks to the Shire and the community. As a consequence of the 2011 event, Worley Parsons Consulting were subsequently commissioned by the Shire to prepare a flood study for the town. One of the objectives of this study was to prepare a Floodplain Development Strategy to guide the Shire on how to appropriately manage flood risks.

At the Ordinary Meeting of Council on 27 April 2017. Council resolved to adopt Policy 07.03 – Flood Plain Development Strategy as a policy of the Shire incorporating the following items:

- a) Future zoning and town planning should consider the results of the Laverton Flood Study. Appropriate land uses should be specified for land within the 1 in 100 AEP floodplain.
- Future development should be preferentially located outside the 1 in 100 AEP floodplain where possible to minimise flood risk.
- c) Future developments proposed within the 1 in 100 AEP floodplain should be assessed based on their merits, with technical input to be provided by Department of Water, based on the results of the Laverton Flood Study. Some of the factors that should be considered include depth of flooding, velocity of flow, obstruction to major flows, potential flood damages, regional benefits and difficulties with evacuation.



- d) Where future developments are approved within or adjacent to the 1 in 100 AEP floodplain, a minimum habitable floor level of 0.50 metres above the 1 in 100 AEP flood level should be mandated as a development condition to manage flood risk.
- e) Consideration should be given to existing buildings located within or adjacent to the 1 in 100 AEP floodplain, to assess whether they pose an electrocution risk to occupants. Residual Current Devices (RCD's) are a means of managing this risk.

A brochure that informs residents and other stakeholders of the foregoing so that they are aware of the outcomes and recommendations of the Flood Study as well as understanding the level of risks in various flood events, particularly in major rainfall events, will be prepared and kept updated.

Say No to Smoking

How often do you hear that "I won't get addicted, I only smoke at parties" or "I know smoking is bad for me, I can stop when I'm older" or "I'll put on weight if I stop smoking"? If this is your child, you must help them to stop smoking.

People who start smoking at younger age are more likely to become regular smokers; smoke more heavily; have difficulties quitting; and are at greater risk of getting smoking-related diseases. Most adult smokers say they wish they had never started and that they would like to stop. Young people often don't realise how quickly a person can become 'addicted' to smoking.

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) reports that tobacco smoking is the most preventable cause of ill-health and early death in Australia. It is responsible for 15,000 deaths and costs \$31.5 billion in social (including health) and economic costs. Smoking rates are much higher in Aboriginal populations (39%), prison inmates (79%), people with mental illness (32-60%) and people living in remote areas (up to 70%). Smoking is the leading cause of chronic diseases among Aboriginal people and is responsible for 1 in 5 deaths. Smoking contributes to more hospitalisations and deaths each year than alcohol and illicit drug use combined.






There are many reasons why children and teenagers smoke, including:

- Copy parents or siblings who smoke
- Peer pressure
- Experimenting
- Look matured
- Copy movie stars
- Curiosity
- Socialise / be part of the group

Tobacco smoke contains more than 7000 chemicals, including over 70 chemicals are known to cause cancer. Some of them are shown below:







When you breathe in cigarette smoke, these chemicals enter in your lungs and spread through your body. Smoking harms nearly every organ of the body and cause serious illness, including 16 types of cancer, heart diseases, lung diseases and eye diseases. Every person who breathes in cigarette smoke (second-hand smoke) is more likely to get these diseases. Younger smokers can experience health problems including:

- . Dull skin, wrinkles on face, stained teeth, bad breath and smelly hairs
- Lung infection, shortness of breath, coughing, phlegm production and wheezing
- · Headache, backache, sleep disorders
- Difficulty in concentration
- Emotional and psychological disorders
- Poor physical fitness and lack of stamina
- Dental problems
- Weak bones and muscles

The best thing you can do for you and your family is - DON'T START SMOKING in the first place. Parents can help children and teenagers by:







Spinach Stuffed Chicken Breasts Wrapped in Bacon

Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 (10 ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed and drained
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts
- 4 slices bacon



Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).
- 2. In a medium bowl, mix mayonnaise, spinach, feta cheese, and garlic until well blended. Set aside.
- 3. Carefully butterfly chicken breasts, making sure not to cut all the way through. Spoon spinach mixture into chicken breasts. Wrap each with a piece of bacon, and secure with a toothpick. Place in shallow baking dish. Cover.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven for 1 hour, or until chicken is no longer pink in the centre and the juices run clear.
- 5. Serve with rice, noodles, or a great Greek salad!


